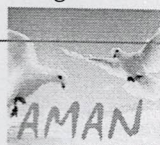

The One Stop Centre will provide support and assistance to women affected by violence, both in private and public spaces. Under the Sakhi – OSC Scheme, centres have been created that offer integrated services like medical, legal, psycho-social support and temporary shelter under one roof. They also provide the necessary support to women facing physical, sexual, emotional, psychological and economic abuse where they are facilitated with support and redressal irrespective of age, class, caste, education status, marital status, race and culture. By dialling a Women's toll-free helpline 181, any woman in an adverse situation or someone on her behalf can seek help from the Sakhi Centre 24X7.

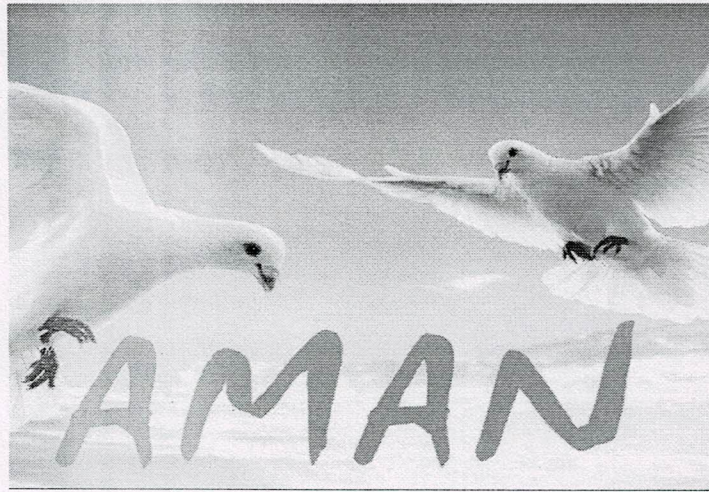

- *AMAN is well equipped with experienced and professional as well as educated staff at all level from Program Manager to Grass root field worker with 1/3rd representation of women, where as there are more no of field level workers are mostly women.*
- *The Governing Body followed by C.E.O / Secretary (representative of G.B) with other managers at the middle level, there are project / program co-coordinators and supervisors to implement the program successfully. Grass root village level workers and volunteers are working. There is a transparency in communication from top to bottom among staff.*
- *Advisory committee is to look after the smooth implementation of programme and to support by technical expert.*

a) Health Activity— Health is wealth. No nation can develop if community health is not sound. The overall health scenario in our project area is dismal. Poor and ignorant as most of the people are, they suffer from various ailments like tuberculosis, asthma etc. Government health care system is conspicuous by its absence in most of the remote areas and even if the facility is available in some places, people cannot and do not reap the best dividends possible. We give much stress on health and family welfare and feel that our intervention is required.

AMAN held a health and family welfare camp on 22.4.12 in NawadihPanchayat area in Chainpur Block of Palamau district .Doctors spoke on the importance of early detection of ailments and urged people never to ignore symptoms of any illness and always seek medical attention. They also spoke on family welfare and gave tips on family welfare. 35 persons have been directly benefited by it. We hope to reach out to more.

HIV/AIDS Prevention Programme

There is brothel area in Japla. Some are Home based, street based, some are lodge/hotel based and most of these HRG are migrant for work at Brick cline bhattha, crasser machine and other construction work. Some of HRG gets condoms from ANM, Sahiya, ICTC, PHC and our T.I. staffs. The organization has conducted a condom demand analysis that provided following feedback to the organization to ensure further plan:

High Volume: - A person who use more then 10 condom in a week
Medium Volume: - A person who use 6 to 10 condom in a week
Low Volume: - A person who use 01 to 5 condom in a week

Achievement in all the components of TI

624 FSWs are identified by Peer educators and communicate the message of prevention of HIV/AIDS though one to one instruction.

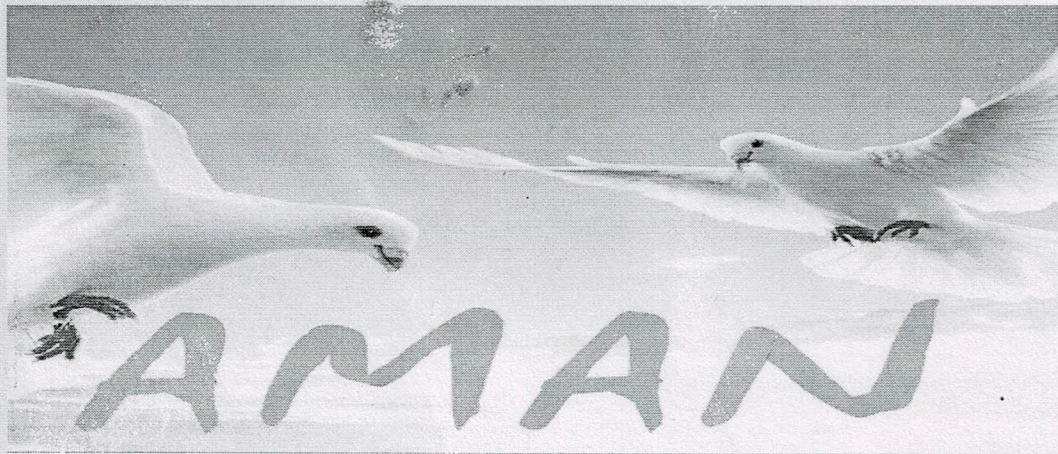

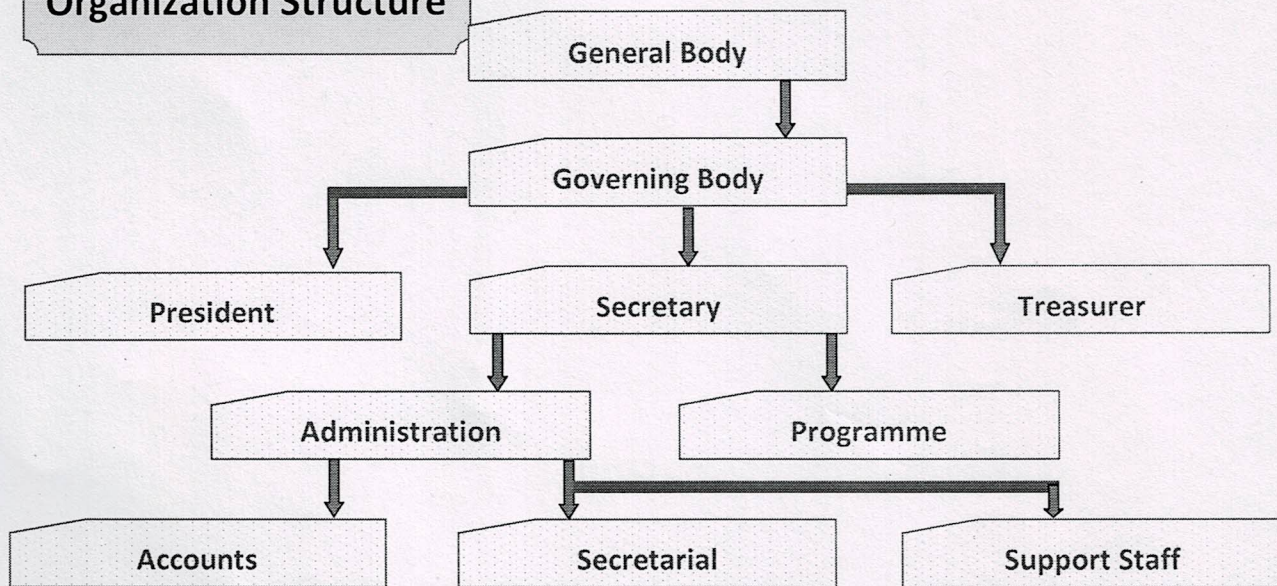

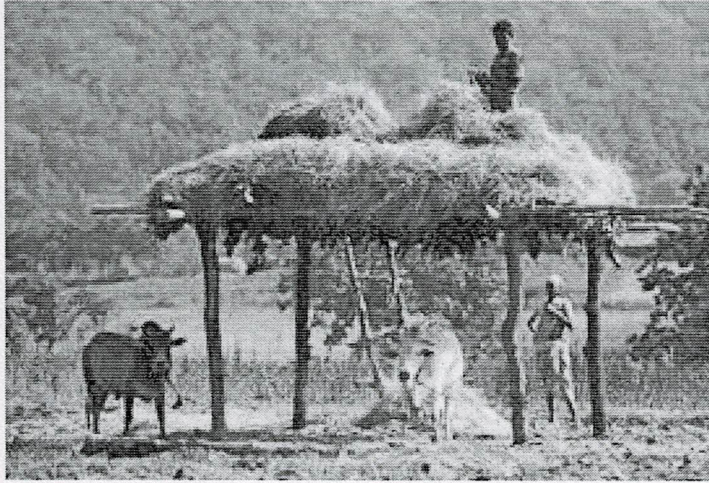

TARGETED INTERVENTION PROJECT:

This is a running project and has been targeted to sensitize, aware & educate 900 of FSWs and 2500 Truckers at the Boarder area of Odissa, Bungal and Jharkhand along with provision of clinical services to prevent them from HIV/ AIDS. Analysis the facts of East Singhbhum district for the targeted Intervention. The Socio- economic Scenario of the target area, identify the Core problems and need of the Community as well as assess the best alternatives in strong out the problem utilizing the available resources and participation of the Community. A part from this same finding related to their Community family and Situation which forces them to adopt the occupation of Prostitution in the unorganized and hidden manner. She, by it too focuses on the knowledge and awareness on prevention care and management. In whole Scenario of Deoghar district among the Contacted female sex worker shows that about 26% of their as still engages in high risk sex practices where Condom use in rare and number of partner are many. About 54% of FSW contacted are in medium risk, which uses Condom in all penetrative sex acts, except with caretaker and lovers. Remaining 24% explained are in low risk category in all encounters with all partners. By the end of the year, the size of high risk group will be reducing. AMAN has adopted HIV Act Policy passed by GOI in 2017 , details available at <https://1ngo.in/media/AMAN/HIV%20AIDS%20Act%202017.pdf>

Traffickers often lure their victims by offering job opportunities or promising education in a bigger city, or even another country, that never comes to pass. But when legitimate organizations provide stability to families, access to medical care, and education for children, the temptation to leave that support and stability is much lower and families are less likely to fall prey to the lies of traffickers. Children living in vulnerable places economically marginalized.

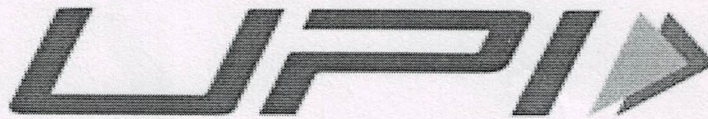

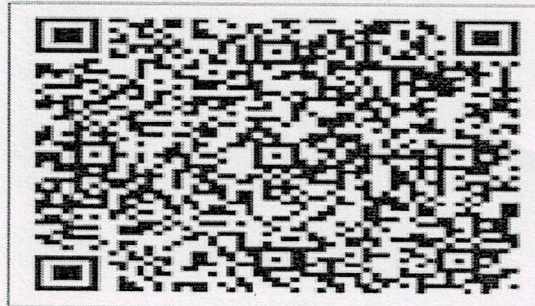

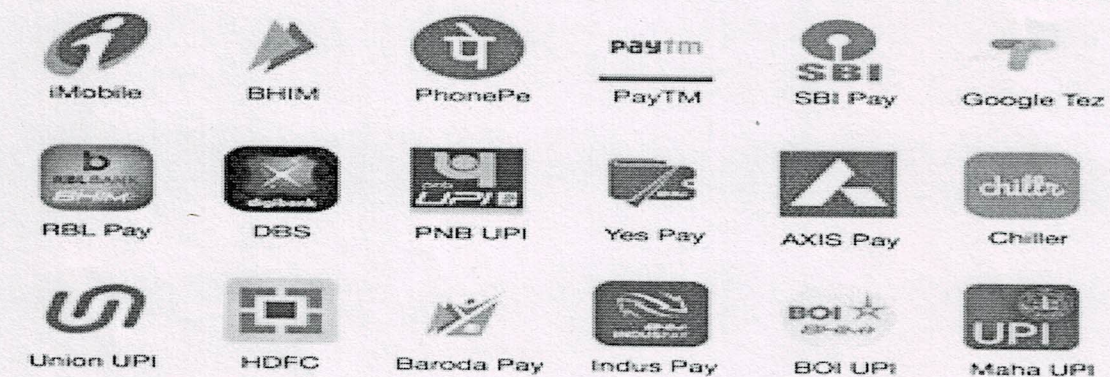
