Training for women

Wire Basket Making Training:



Various small businesses can be started and rural areas are more likely to do so. In earlier times, women used baskets more. We conducted wire basket making training for Thokkavadi people on 08.07.2023 by Mrs. Jeyamary (resource person). Wire basket are commonly used by women in earlier



time. Slowly the wage was reduced due to modern world in order eradicate plastic bags.

Training on Accounting:



Training was given to 15 SHG Leaders & Representatives regarding the ways to keep the proper records and accounts. Our director explained the importance of accounting in SHG and given information about the “Vazhnthu Kattovom Thittam” to get the network and benefits. And field staff Mrs. Seetha given training to fill the bank form. This training was



conducted on 19.7.2023 in Our CHAMP Office.

Women empowerment and self-confidence increase the value of women in the society. Today the development of the home and the development of the country is based on the rise of self-employment. The country welcomes the aspiring self-employed person. In recent days, women move towards self-employment and advancement. The livelihood of rural women can rise and make them to live with self-confidence. Our CHAMP society provides this wonderful training to all the Women to be self-employed. All Women showed their interest and thanked for the program. This is being carried out on their own in their houses.



Self Help Group Meeting:

Annai CHAMP Self Help Group were trained by field worker Mrs.



Seetha and she visited also Sai CHAMP the women's group and checked whether the group's notes and accounts were properly maintained and whether the people of the group took internal loans and paid them back to the bank. It was also emphasized that all the people who have internal loans can get the loan only if they repay the bank.



Financial Assistance to Self Help Group:

Tamil CHAMP Self Help Group received loan money of Rs.2, 00,000 to 12 people and Sembaruthi CHAMP Self Help Group received loan money of Rs.2, 30,000 to 13 people were given in Melpuluthiyur Co-operative Bank with a total money of 430000.00 only



On 20.01.2024, OM Shakthi CHAMP Women's Self Help Group were graded and facilitated to join (Valuthukattom Thittam Women Self Help Group) Project.

New Venture of SHG:

A new group was formed for the people of MGR Nagar and an account was opened in the Co-operative Bank under the name of Thenaruvi CHAMP women's Self Help Group

Awareness seminar for Women:

On 20.12.2023, in our organization, Sister Doctors Forum of India has created awareness among the village women around our society about diabetes and its complication on the body. Details on the symptoms on physical changes were explained by Rev. Sr. Dr. Regina (St. Joseph's Health Center, C. Namiyanthal). They also discussed the transmissible disease (diet, habits through offspring) and the necessary food and modification methods to prevent them. 57 women participated and benefited from this seminar.



Education support to Widow's Children:

Two students were studying at our evening tuition center. These students study in Melpallipattu village for classes 10th in a government school. These are single parent children who are unable to continue their schooling due to their family situation. Textbooks, Training books, School Uniform and School bag were provided to them through our society.

Awareness Training to overcome exam fear:

An awareness program was conducted in the evening tuition centers for all the students who are going to write the exam till April-2023. Also advice was given on how to give time to study and how to write the exam well.

On behalf of our society, at the free evening tuition center operating in Manmalai and Melpallipattu villages, the Tuition students attending government schools were given advice and ideas to overcome the fear of examination and to face the examination. Mainly in this, the



students were given explanations physical ailments and weather conditions that could be an obstacle during the examination. And We



also prepared the students on how to spend the time in studying and how to write well in the exam and what to eat during the exam, how to read the question paper completely and answer it correctly, In this way can get more marks and we have encouraged the students by having sports, competitions





so that the students do not get tired. In which students asked questions and addressed their grievances. Students participated enthusiastically.

This was held on 19.08.2023 in a grand manner. 90 ministers were elected among 9 centers. Rev. Fr. Lijo (Chengam Parish Priest), Rev. Sr. Amala (Pakkiripalayam Community Superior) and our CHAMP Director administered the oath of office to the Ministers of Parliament as special guests for the ceremony. The main theme of the festival is empowerment of children and their contribution to the society. The organization also acts as a forum to discuss various issues and the main function of the organization is to create future socially conscious leaders.



Children’s Parliament Meeting:

Children’s Parliament meets in their respective areas every month. During the meeting, it was concluded that all the Ministers will consult and formulate action plans and implement them.



Activity 1: Knowing about Public sector work:

As a special activity of the summer camp, the children visited both the Panchayat Office and the Post Office for the Parliamentary Ministers. The activities organized by our CHAMP organization includes explaining about the activities of the officers, the files maintained by them and the children asked many questions. They participated with great enthusiasm. It was a great pleasure to fulfil our duty to create future leaders.



Activity 2: Petitioning:

On 18.08.2023, we empowered the teachers and also gave a handbook for selection of children for child parliamentarians. Children cleaned the streets through Children's Parliament. A petition was also given to the panchayat head, vice-head and ward members for distribution of drinking water to the village.



Activity 3: Cleaning of Public Space:



On 13.10.2023 children cleaned public water tank by children's parliament at our evening tuition center in Ambedhkar Nagar and Anthanoor villages. All the public peoples appreciated.



Activity 4: Application for streetlights:

As the street lights were not installed, the children requested the panchayat council president through the parliament to install street lights.

Considering the vulnerability and sexual harassment that women land today, awareness training was given the young students in the evening tuition center run by CHAMP Society. Additionally, the health issues faced during menstruation, their solutions by providing tips on healthy diet, maintaining health and other symptoms were explained. The health system, clean diet and use of clean napkins that every woman should follow during menstruation were also explained in detail. We also talked about the rules and responsibilities of POSCO Act and how Women can use the act. Games and songs were conducted to encourage Women.

A total of 18 Women attended the tailoring training. They were taught to operate the machine, stitch blouses and basic training tailoring machine, thread winding, darning on the thread machine first tailoring on machine and tailoring to cut kerchief, pillow cover, granny skirt, cutting the plain blouses, stitching of skirt shirts, boat neck, shape neck designs with lace etc.. Were taught. The main aim of this training is to help and guide for small business.



Computer Class (paid):



Seven Students attended the computer class where they were taught icons in MS-Paint and how to draw pictures. Additionally, few shortcuts keys, MS-Office-Word, formulas in MS-Office-Excel were taught. Animations, Internet, Background Images and Download in MS-Office-PowerPoint were taught.

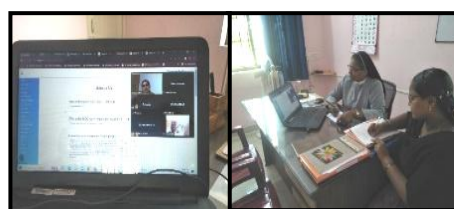
Green Earth Project:

On 12.09.2023, Tiruvannamalai Social Work Society functioning under Vellore Diocese held conference of social activists, charities and volunteers under the theme Green Earth Project. Rev. The work of restoring the cheiyur and their supporting water levels and the changing natural environments to protect the future generations from the climate of the earth and to recover the water resources they need and to remove encroachments to control the earth's temperature by planting more saplings and the necessary suggestions were given to implement them.

Kolapakkam Sub Centers 2023 - 2024

Type Writing Class (paid):

Between April-2023 to March-2024, typing classes were conducted from 8am to 11am and 4pm to 6pm. As many as 15 students participated in the typing class throughout the last one year. Out of which 2 students appeared in the government examination in August 2023 and passed in first class. Also in February 2024, four students were participated in the Government typing test and benefited. Thus every year in the months of August and February, students will participate in the government examination and benefit.



Children's Day Celebration:

Children's day plays an important role in the development of children. A sports competition was conducted for the children to restore their energy and cheer them up. All the village's elders and public participated in this event. Prizes were awarded to the winners.



Field Work:

Mrs. Panchavarnam visited Kolapakkam village and visited the women's self-help groups and held a meeting and sensitized the women's self-help groups. Visited the evening tuitions centers and met the students there and gave awareness.



Thirukazhukundram Sub Centers 2023 – 2024 **Sahaya Madha Tailoring Center**

Paid Tailoring Class:

52 Girls came for Tailoring Training. They were taught how to operate a tailoring machine, to spin the thread, first to sew by hand and then sew by machine. Taught cutting and sewing of kerchief, pillowcase, Patty skirt, and patty blouse, sadha blouse, lining blouse and crocheting and Emming. Out of which 17 girls have completed tailoring training and only 6 girls have got certificate.

The Irular people living in Kothimangalam are very loving and kindness. Kothimangalam village has been adopted by Stella Matutina College. They taught about 30 children the importance of education and cleanliness. The children were entertained with games and songs and were given food and biscuits.



About 25 women attended this meeting the teachers said to them make sure to send your children to the evening tuition. Clean food and clothes are very important, they said that if you use these properly, you can live without disease. And first of all, teach children to clean their tongue while brushing their teeth so that they can pronounce words properly. And then they have to take bath in the morning and in the evening, thus they gave awareness to those people. And they said we will take them to Chennai for higher education, People participated enthusiastically, and it is greatly appreciated. They also gave sweets and enjoyed.
