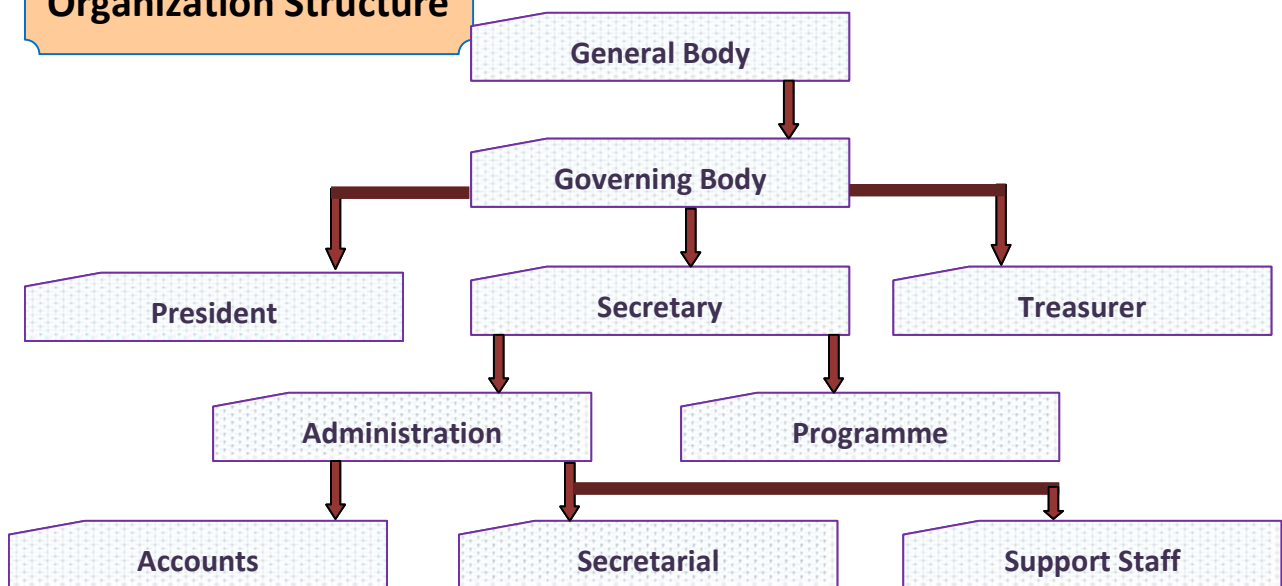

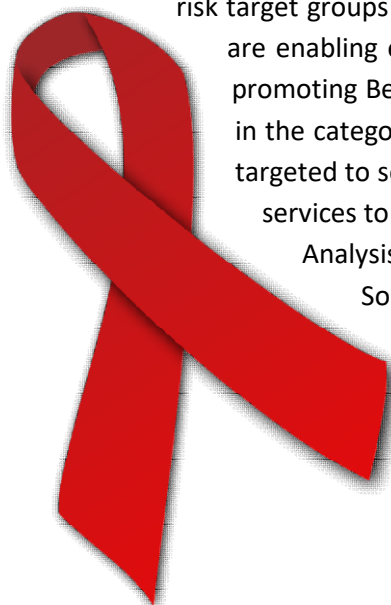

TARGETED INTERVENTION PROJECT:

The TI project is being run by the organization for last four consecutive years. It is one of the most crucial projects being implemented by the organization in the 17 major hotspots of Deogar township in Jharkhand. The objective of this project is to reduce the problems of RTI/ STI and prevent the high risk target groups from HIV/ AIDS. The strategy and approaches under this programme are enabling environment, promotion of condoms, providing clinical services, and promoting Behavioral Change Communication among the target groups who come in the category of high risk behavior group. This is a running project and has been targeted to sensitize, aware & educate 800 of FSWs along with provision of clinical services to prevent them from HIV/ AIDS



Analysis the facts of Deoghar district for the targeted Intervention. The Socio- economic Scenario of the target area, identify the Core problems and need of the Community as well as assess the best alternatives in strong out the problem utilizing the available resources and participation of the Community. A part from this same finding



related to their Community family and Situation which forces them to adopt the occupation of Prostitution in the unorganized and hidden manner. She, by it too focuses on the knowledge and awareness on prevention care and management. In whole Scenario of Deoghar district among the Contacted female sex worker shows that about 26% of them as still engages in high risk sex practices where Condom use is rare and number of partners are many. About 54% of FSW contacted are in medium risk, which uses Condom in all penetrative sex acts, except with caretaker and lovers. Remaining 24% explained are in low risk category in all encounters with all partners. By the end of the year, the size of high risk group will be reducing. It is proposed to increase negotiation skill of 900 FSW by the end of the year.

The present data shows that average number of encounter per PSH per month is 18 and average partner per PSH is 10 by the end of the proposed intervention period. After one year of running TI Program observed the following Socio- Economic profile.

- **Age:** 70% of total FSW are of age groups 15-35 and rest 30% are of age above 35yrs.
- **Sex:** 100% female.
- **Marital status:** 60% of FSW are married 40% are unmarried, widow, and divorced
- **Economic Status:** 60% of HRG are belongs to poor family background residing in remote villages of Deoghar district .Per day earning Rs.200-300 on an average monthly earning is Rs 6000-10000.
- **Occupation:** Majority of FSW has adopted easily method of earning through sex trade, they are purely based on their business their livelihood. Hence their involvement in other earning business is almost negligible.

TB CARE AND CONTROL:-

It is also appreciable that effective advocacy initiative has been taken by GSKVM which has influenced the government to take result oriented strategy. As an outcome of that advocacy work, RNTCP has increased another 3 TUs in Palamu district. Previously there were 3 TUs in Palamu, while presently there are 6 TUs in this district. RNTCP is convinced about the positive impact of this advocacy work and has planned to increase another 5TUs in near future to ensure more care and control of TB at micro level. So far as the operational research is concerned, GSKVM has a very important contribution in the field of TB care and control. The objective of this research has been to find out the pattern of occurrence of New Sputum Smear Positive (NSP) TB in terms of various ages, the incidence of TB gender wise, outbreak of TB season wise in Daltonganj TU in the district of Palamu. The methodology of this operational research was absolutely dependent upon the analytical observation of data recorded during a particular span of time. Md. Hashmat Rabbani is India CCM Member and Ms. Swarn Lata Ranjan is Alternate Member elected from TB constituency from GSKVM for the period 2015-18. Md. Hashmat Rabbani has also been elected in oversight committee to supervise and support GFATM in India. Our next step is to work for TB care and control at the state level in Jharkhand and gradually take part in the national TB control program.



PMEGP Awareness:

PMEGP scheme is integrated two earlier schemes, viz. Prime Minister's Rojgar Yojana (PMRY) and the Rural Employment Generation Programme (REGP) that were working along similar lines to generate employment among the youth. PMEGP is applicable to all new viable micro enterprises, including Village Industries projects except activities indicated in the negative list of Village Industries. Existing/old units are not eligible. The rest of the funds (i.e. 90/95% of funds allocated less than 15-35% subsidy) are provided by the bank as a term loan or PMEGP loan. Rate of Interest: The rate of interest on the PMEGP loan will be at a normal rate as applicable to the MSE sector. Awareness were done in hat and market areas with support from DIC, Palamu

UJJAWALA Scheme:

A Comprehensive Scheme for Prevention of trafficking and Rescue, Rehabilitation and Re-integration of Victims of Trafficking and Commercial Sexual Exploitation. Details are available at GOI weblink

Objectives of UJJAWALA Scheme

- To prevent trafficking of women and children for commercial sexual exploitation through social mobilization and involvement of local communities, awareness generation programs, generate public discourse through workshops/seminars and such events, and any other innovative activity.
- To facilitate the rescue of victims from the place of their exploitation and place them in safe custody.
- To provide rehabilitation services both immediate and long-term to the victims by providing basic amenities/needs such as shelter, food, clothing, medical treatment including counseling, legal aid and guidance, and vocational training.
- To facilitate the reintegration of the victims into the family and society at large
- To facilitate the repatriation of cross-border victims to their country of origin.

Beneficiaries of UJJAWALA Scheme: Women and children who are vulnerable to trafficking for commercial sexual exploitation. Or Victims.

Till 31 March 2021, Team has rehabilitate 53 Women and rescued them with government department.

NAI ROSHNI :-

The objective of the Nai Roshni scheme is **to empower and instill confidence among minority women**, including their neighbours from other communities living in the same village/locality, by providing knowledge, tools and techniques for interacting with Government systems, banks and other institutions at all levels. With financial Support, we have conducted five batches of Nai Roshni Training in

Municipal areas and hainpur Block with 125 beneficiaries. 25 women per group. We have also given them Rs.600 as an honorarium with 100 per day ratio
