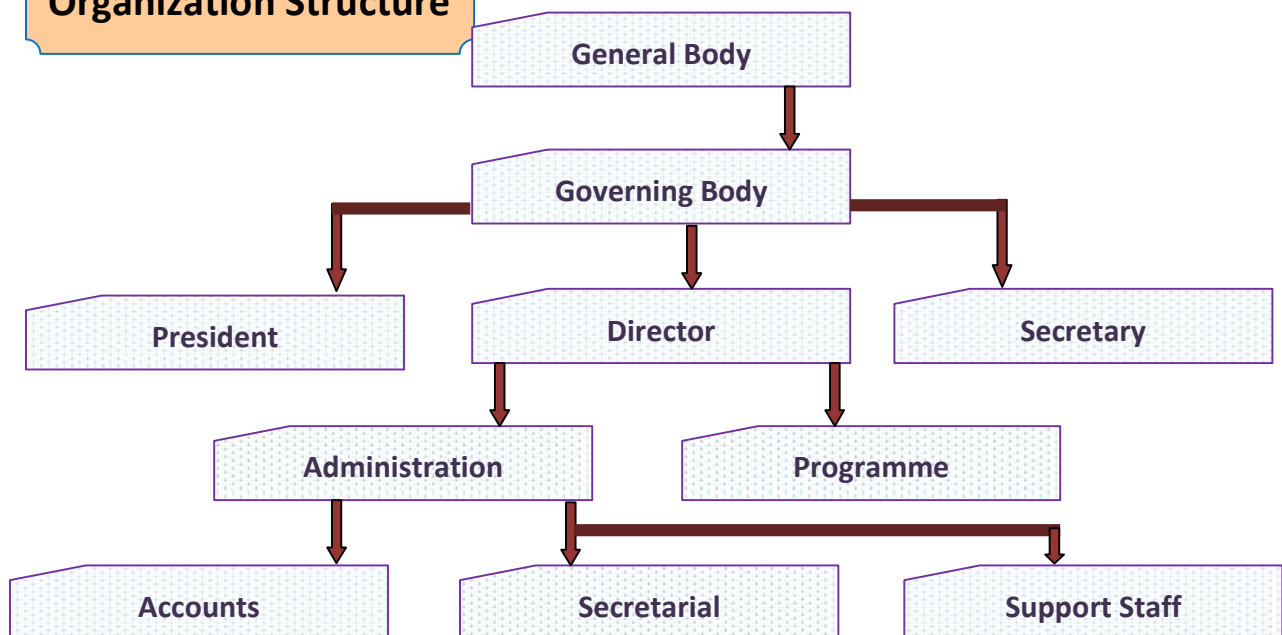

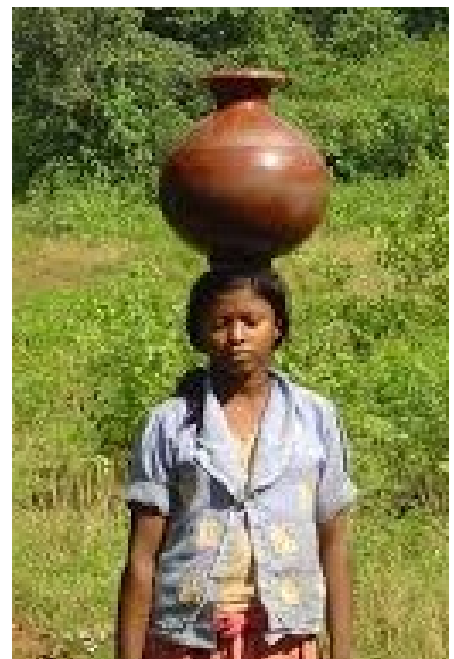

3. **OPERATIONAL AREA**

The operational Area of the Society will be All India.

4. **OBJECTIVES**

- a) To enhance and promote village development works by means of organized voluntary programme of village people.
- b) To do human development works with women, children, handicapped, deaf and the physically handicapped. To make provisions of overall education, food, clothes, shelter, safe, drinking water, communication, etc. for overall handicapped.
- c) To promote communal harmony in the village through organizing people and conducting developmental work for overall village development.

- d) To manage hand pumps, well, ponds, canals, etc. to ensure safe drinking water for the development of villages and organize people for running this activity smoothly.
- e) To conduct central, rural, programme for keeping the village hygienic and to make provision of drainage system, lanes, toilets, bathrooms, etc. under this program.
- f) To make people aware for the protection of forest resources and to promote Afforestation program to protect environment from pollution.
- g) To run illiteracy eradication program like educational awareness, women education, adult education, non formal education, vocational education, etc. and putting efforts for preparing people on this direction for its establishment.
- h) To make the village people aware and train them against the misconception and myths for the development of the society and to organize or conduct conference, seminars, theme camps, etc. to reduce the problems like-alcoholism, child marriage, dowry, etc.
- i) To train the poor and deprived people of the society through trainings on small & cottage industry business and establish small and cottage industries to serve the benefits to the people.
- j) To conduct relief programmes for the people affected by natural calamities like-flood, fire, drought, famine, infections, etc and to make arrangement of facilities like immunizations, clothes, food, shelters, medicines, etc. for the fulfillment of immediate needs of the people.
- k) To conduct or manage self employment programs to provide training to women on kasidakari, paintings, doll-makings, tailoring, cutting, knitting, embroidery, patch works, fabric, etc. for making the women economically self reliant.
- l) To conduct family planning & family welfare programmes for the awareness building among the people and putting possible efforts on this direction.
- m) To make arrangements of agricultural related inputs like-better quality seeds, tools, equipments, medicines, etc. and to provide and manage these inputs at reasonable price ; to conduct training to farmers on new technique of agriculture, to establish research institute for soil testing ; and to make arrangements of warehousing, store house, etc. for better storage of agricultural products.
- n) To make arrangements of financial supports for agriculture related works to the small and marginal farmers and to manage the loan, other facilities providing by the government directly to the farmers for the agricultural development within the state.
- o) To establish or make arrangement of industries being run by Khadi Commission & Khadi Board; to install, production and marketing centers for the Khadi related product; to make arrangement of sale and purchase of raw material and to create conducive environment along with development of slums for the village people.
- p) To work for promoting national language and other Indian languages among the village people.
- q) To provide trainings to the poor and marginalized women and men on papad making; tailoring, thonga making, bamboos craft, plastic making, chair, tables, other furniture, etc. and to develop and establish training centers for candles makings, agarbatti making, typing, etc.
- r) To promote Animal Husbandry & Hybrid improvements programmes to the village people.
- s) To organize camps and meeting in order to bring social consciousness among common people.

CELEBRATION OF 33rd FOUNDATION DAY OF GSKVM

The Foundation Day of Gramin Samaj Kalyan Vikas Manch was celebrated on 33rd on 25 January 2023. On this occasion a program on “Kavi Sammelan” and “Mushhaera” was organized. The program was presided by Professor SC Mishra, compered by Md Hashmat Rabbani, Secretary, GSKVM+. On this 33rd year of establishment celebration as done in every year on this occasion, Late Naimuddin Ansari Memorial Award was distributed. This award is given to local people who have contributed substantially towards the betterment of the society and have made remarkable contribution to the society. This is a token of encouragement to the outstanding persons as well as example for others in the society.



TARGETED INTERVENTION PROJECT:

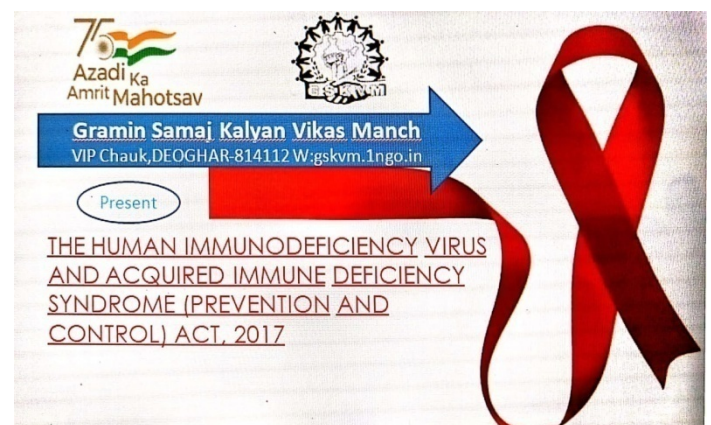
This is a running project and has been targeted to sensitize, aware & educate 850 of FSWs along with provision of clinical services to prevent them from HIV/ AIDS Analysis the facts of Deoghar district for the targeted Intervention. The Socio-economic Scenario of the target area, identify the Core problems and need of the Community as well as assess the best alternatives in strong out the problem utilizing the available resources and participation of the Community. A part from this same finding related to their Community family and Situation which forces them to adopt

the occupation of Prostitution in the unorganized and hidden manner. She, by it too focuses on the knowledge and awareness on prevention care and management. In whole Scenario of Deoghar district among the Contacted female sex worker shows that about 26% of them as still engages in high risk sex practices where Condom use is rare and number of partners are many. About 54% of FSW contacted are in medium risk, which uses Condom in all penetrative sex acts, except with caretaker and lovers. Remaining 24% explained are in low risk category in all encounters with all partners. By the end of the year, the size of high risk group will be reducing. Rangoli, Advocacy and Awareness Campaign were done by Gramin Samaj Kalyan Vikas Manch for HIV Free Society. Theme focused on Know AIDS to Stop AIDS and Toll Free Number 1097 was highlighted. World AIDS Day is commemorated around the globe on 1st December every year. It celebrates progress made in the battle against the epidemic – and highlights issues need to be addressed. HIV /AIDS Act 2017

- The Human Immunodeficiency Virus and Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (Prevention and Control) Act, 2017 is a central legislation which came into effect from September 10, 2018.
- The objective of the Act is to provide for the prevention and control of the spread of HIV and AIDS and for the protection of human rights of persons affected by the said virus and syndrome.
- The Act consists of 50 sections, divided under 14 chapters.



Protection of property of children

- The purpose is to protect the child's property and inheritance rights by depositing documents with the Child Welfare Committee for safekeeping.
- The following individuals may approach the CWC:
 - ✓ Parents
 - ✓ Guardians
 - ✓ Any person acting in the interest
 - ✓ A child affected by HIV and AIDS
- The CWC can also be approached to make complaints relating to dispossession or trespass into such child's house.

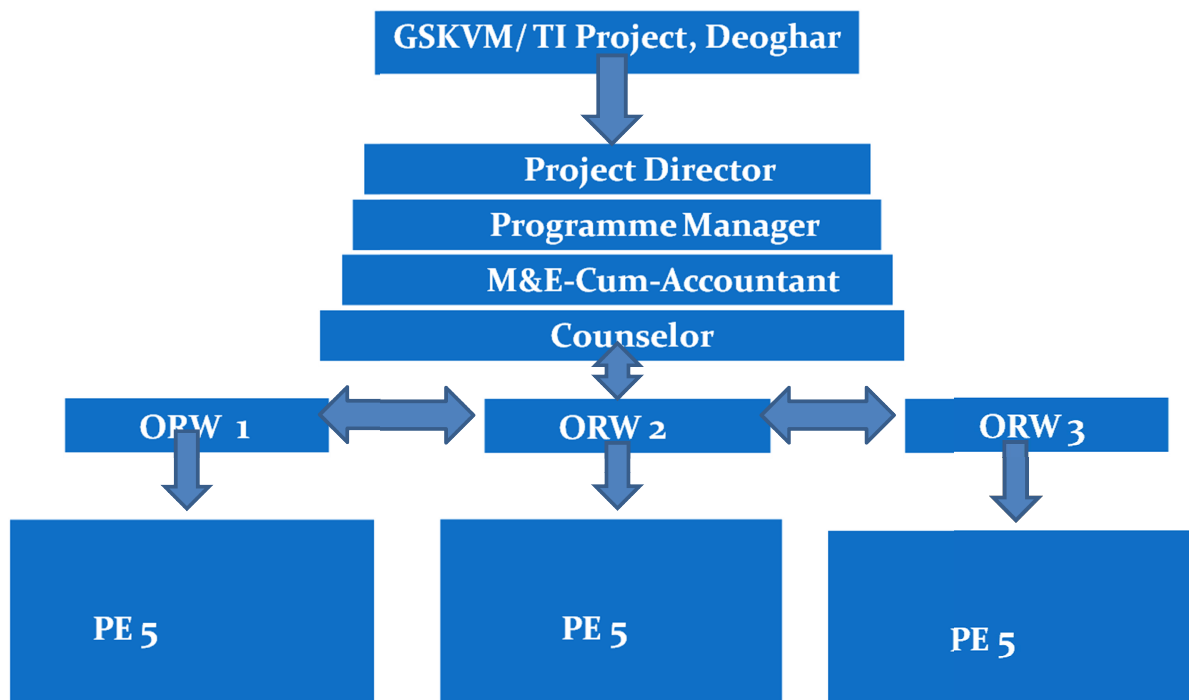

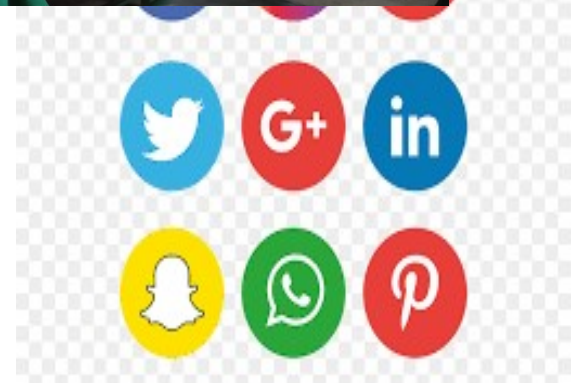

SPECIAL ADOPTION AGENCY(SAA)

Central Adoption Resource Authority

Central Adoption Resource Authority (CARA) is a statutory body of Ministry of Women & Child Development, Government of India. It functions as the nodal body for adoption of Indian children and is mandated to monitor and regulate in-country and inter-country adoptions. CARA is designated as the Central Authority to deal with inter-country adoptions in accordance with the provisions of the Hague Convention on Inter-country Adoption, 1993, ratified by Government of India in 2003.

CARA primarily deals with adoption of orphan, abandoned and surrendered children through its associated /recognized adoption agencies.

The prospective adoptive parents shall be physically, mentally, emotionally and financially capable, they shall not have any life threatening medical condition and they should not have been convicted in criminal act of any nature or accused in any case of child rights violation.

Who can adopt?

i. Single persons with or without biological or adoptive children can adopt provided they satisfy the following: (a) A single female can adopt a child of any gender (b) A

single male is not eligible to adopt a girl child (c) Age of a single parent does not exceed 55 years.

Adopt a child of my choice in India?

Yes, you can. However, under the Hindu Adoption and Maintenance Act, you can only adopt a child of the opposite gender to your child. The Guardians and Wards Act and the Juvenile Justice Act, do not have any such diktats.

Can I adopt a newborn baby in India?

What is the age limit for adoption in India?

In the case of a couple, the combined ages of the partners should not exceed 100 years. To adopt a child between 8 and 18 years of age, the prospective adoptive parent, if single, must not be more than 55 years of age.

Key Points to Remember for Prospective Adoptive Parents (PAPs)

Do's	Don'ts
Only adopt from Specialised Adoption Agencies (SAAs) recognised by State Governments.	Do not approach any nursing home, hospital, maternity home, unauthorised institution or individual for adoption.
Read the Guidelines carefully on the website and follow the due procedure.	Do not upload any incorrect document, else your registration will be cancelled.
Follow the steps for completing your registration.	Do not pay any additional adoption charges other than what is prescribed in CARA Guidelines.
Please upload documents as per instructions.	Keep away from touts/middlemen. There is no role of touts/middlemen in adoption. They will mislead you to adopt a child illegally.
For adoption related charges, please refer Schedule-13 of the Guidelines Governing Adoption of Children (2015). Always make payment by cheque or draft and collect your receipt.	Through illegal adoption, you may unintentionally become part of child trafficking network. Save yourself from legal ramifications.

Methodology:

We will identify orphan / semi orphan / street children through our volunteers, citizens, police, women & child welfare department. We Pre-view of the incoming orphan / semi orphan / street child problems/difficulties. We counsel and arrange for Emotional acceptance of the orphan / semi orphan / street child. We provide Lodging and boarding facilities for all inmates at a rented building at Powerganj LOHARDAGA, Jharkhand. We have limited resources to take care of about 10 orphan / semi orphan. But, day by day number of children are increasing due to various reasons. We need additional support from the donors and philanthropists to meet the needs of increasing orphan / semi orphan / street children in our center. We seek support for about 3 years. Meanwhile, we will sustain to mobilize continuous local donations through exhibiting our good work and service. We are planning to build permanent home by acquiring land from the donors and philanthropists. This home will have one Care Taker who besides handling day-to-day administration and will look after the hostel as warden. One Teacher, One vocational instructor, One cook, One attendant, One Watchman will be provided for the home. A doctor will be appointed as Center Medical Attendant on honorarium and all the inmates will be provided with health check-up, medicines, food, cosmetics, one set of books and two sets of uniform every year. The proposal covers 60 orphans. Every child will be provided with nutritional diet, indoor and out-door recreation and play facilities and training in crafts and hobbies.

Objective :

The prime objective of any Specialized Adoption Agency is **restoration and protection of a child in need of care and protection.**

Objective of Adoption:

An adopting a child **helps couples to complete their family.** The main advantage of adoption is that a childless person can make somebody else's child as his own. Thus adoption means transplantation of the child from the family of his birth to the adoptive family.

Adoption Process:

There are six product adoption stages—**awareness, interest, evaluation, trial, activation, and adoption.** Product adoption isn't always a linear process—users can jump between stages. There are also five adopter profiles—innovators, early adopters, early majority, late majority, and laggards

Acceptance:

- Emotional readiness to adopt an unrelated child;
- Concerns about the social background of the child and genetic factors;

UJJAWALA SCHEME:

Ujjwala is a comprehensive scheme that was launched in 2007 to combat trafficking and it provides for Prevention, Rescue, Rehabilitation, Re-Integration and Re-Patriation of victims trafficked for commercial sexual exploitation. It is mainly being implemented through non-governmental organizations. Gramin Samaj Kalyan Vikas Manch (GSKVM) has started from October 2020. And established on 15 October 2020 at Birsa Nagar, SHAHPUR, Palamu, Jharkhand-822110. Details of inmates is as below year wise. The Gramin Samaj Kalyan Vikas Manch is operating the Ujjwala Home in Birsa Nagar Shahpur Palamu Jharkhand-822110. Where 18 rooms, 7 toilets, 3 bath rooms etc. are available on the first floor of premises building approx area 1600 Square Meter. From the security point of view, 3 Channel Iron gates have been installed, CCTVs are available and Ujjwala Grih with a capacity of 50 inmates is being operated from October 2020.
