I extend my heartfelt congratulations to the team of **Gramin Samaj Kalyan Vikas Manch (GSKVM)** for their unwavering commitment and leadership in implementing the **HIV/AIDS Prevention Project for Female Sex Workers (FSWs) in Deoghar** since 2010 with the collaboration of **Jharkhand State AIDS Control Society (JSACS)**.

Key Achievements at a Glance

- Achieved **95% consistent condom use** (up from 58%)
- Distributed **over 100,000 free condoms**
- Conducted **regular STI screening for 1,380 FSWs**
- Reached **98% HIV testing coverage** with complete counseling support
- Trained **12 peer educators** from the community
- Held **400+ community meetings** and **120+ awareness events**
- Linked **400+ FSWs** to welfare schemes like *Ayushman Bharat*, ration cards, and skill development programs

Safety, Support & Empowerment Highlights

- Established a **24x7 crisis helpline** and a **community-based safety net team** to respond to cases of violence, harassment and stigma.
- Conducted **Disaster Management and Coordination Training** with the **District Legal Services Authority (DLSA)**, **District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA)** and other departments for **food security and welfare schemes**, enhancing crisis preparedness among FSWs.
- Held **42 P-MPSC events**, providing safe spaces for psychosocial support, health education, and legal counselling.

- सभी पहचाने गए PLHIV को 100% ART से जोड़ा गया
- 1.2 लाख से अधिक कंडोम का वितरण पीयर एजुकेटर्स के माध्यम से
- व्यवहार परिवर्तन संचार (BCC) सत्रों का आयोजन
- महिला यौनकर्मियों को आधार, राशन कार्ड, और मतदाता पहचान पत्र जैसे पहचान एवं सामाजिक कल्याण योजनाओं से जोड़ा गया
- कानूनी अधिकारों, कलंक निवारण और वित्तीय साक्षरता पर आधारित सशक्तिकरण
- HIV/AIDS (रोकथाम और नियंत्रण) अधिनियम, 2017 पर जनजागरूकता

2. Empowering Grassroots Voices: Building Capacity with AMAN Network

In the remote corners of **Jharkhand**, several small, passionate grassroots NGOs tirelessly work to uplift **tribal, Dalit, and marginalized communities**. Despite their dedication, they often face challenges—limited legal awareness, no digital infrastructure, and lack of access to funding platforms—that hinder their long-term growth.

One such organization was **NAI KIRAN**, a women-led NGO in **Hazaribagh**. For nearly a decade, they focused on women's health, education, and domestic violence prevention—but without digital visibility, updated documentation, or knowledge of government schemes, their impact remained confined.

In 2024, **Gramin Samaj Kalyan Vikas Manch (GSKVM)**, in partnership with the **AMAN Network (Alliance for Mutual Accountability & Networking)**, launched an initiative to build the capacity of grassroots NGOs across Jharkhand and neighboring states.

The goal: **Empower grassroots organizations with legal literacy, access to opportunities, and digital tools.**

As a regional anchor of the AMAN Network, **GSKVM** delivered free support to **1050+** NGOs, including:

- Legal workshops on **FCRA, 12A/80G, CSR, NGO Darpan, Trust/Society compliance**
- Timely updates on **EOIs, tenders, and grant calls** via WhatsApp/email
- Development of **free mobile-friendly websites** with project info, photos, and contact forms

3. Targeted Intervention (TI) Project – HIV/AIDS Prevention Among Female Sex Workers (FSW)

The Targeted Intervention (TI) project focused on reducing HIV/AIDS risk among 1,569 Female Sex Workers (FSWs) in high-risk zones of Deoghar. Using a peer-led model, GSKVM delivered health services, behavioral education, and social entitlements to vulnerable women.

Key Achievements

- **92%** of registered FSWs received monthly health check-ups and HIV testing
- **100%** of HIV-positive individuals linked to ART treatment



- **1.2 lakh+** condoms distributed via trained peer educators
- **380+** Behavioral Change Communication (BCC) sessions conducted
- **35%** increase in STI treatment referrals
- **67** FSWs newly linked to entitlements like ration cards, Aadhaar, voter IDs
- **Legal rights workshops** and **financial literacy** sessions improved confidence and awareness
- **60 peer educators** trained; **400+** outreach events held including street plays and health camps
- **24x7 crisis helpline** and **community safety teams** activated

Awareness on HIV/AIDS Act 2017

Gramin Samaj Kalyan Vikas Manch (GSKVM) plays an active role at the community level in raising awareness, eliminating discrimination, and safeguarding the rights of individuals living with HIV. The organization's mission is to build an inclusive and compassionate society.

Key Provisions of the HIV/AIDS Act, 2017:

Protection of Privacy: Information related to an individual's HIV status will be kept strictly confidential.

✗ Prohibition of Discrimination: Discrimination in employment, education, healthcare, or any service is a punishable offense.

4. Specialized Adoption Agency (SAA) Recognized by CARA/SARA

GSKVM's Specialized Adoption Agency (SAA) is dedicated to the **care, protection, and rehabilitation** of orphaned, abandoned, and surrendered children between **0–6 years of age**. The agency adheres strictly to the guidelines of CARA, ensuring every child receives not only **legal support** but also **emotional nurturing and quality care**.

Highlights of 2024–25:

- **18 children** were provided with full-time care, safety, and developmental support
- **6 in-country adoptions** successfully completed as per CARA regulations
- Regular **health check-ups, immunizations, and developmental assessments** conducted
- **Therapeutic play sessions** and **early stimulation activities** introduced for emotional and cognitive growth
- Conducted **capacity-building workshops** for caregivers on **trauma-informed childcare**

Impact:

The SAA remained a beacon of hope and compassion, offering a secure and nurturing environment. Each child's **right to family** and a **better future** was upheld with care, dignity, and compliance.

Success Story – From Abandonment to a Loving Home: The Journey of Baby Mariyam

On a chilly winter morning in December 2024, a newborn baby girl was found wrapped in a thin cloth, placed near the gate of a district hospital in Palamu, Jharkhand. The umbilical cord was still fresh — she had been born just hours before. A hospital staff member, noticing the infant crying softly, alerted the Child Welfare Committee (CWC) and local authorities.





She was a “zero-day abandoned child”, a term used for infants abandoned immediately after birth. Vulnerable, cold, and underweight, her chances of survival without intervention were slim.

Following the official protocol, the baby was immediately referred to the Specialised Adoption Agency (SAA) run by Gramin Samaj Kalyan Vikas Manch (GSKVM), recognized under the Central Adoption Resource Authority (CARA). The SAA team, trained in infant care and trauma-sensitive response, received the baby with urgency and compassion.

She was named Baby Mariyam and given emergency medical care. After stabilization, she was nurtured in the loving environment of the SAA cradle care center, where trained caregivers ensured she received round-the-clock care, warmth, and attention.

While Mariyam physical health gradually improved, the legal and procedural responsibilities began. As per CARA guidelines, a police inquiry was initiated, and a Foundling Certificate was issued. After completing the mandatory 60-day period of tracing biological parents (with no claim made), Baby Mariyam was declared legally free for adoption by the Child Welfare Committee (CWC).

Simultaneously, her details were uploaded to the Child Adoption Resource Information and Guidance System (CARINGS), ensuring complete transparency and compliance with CARA protocols. Soon, a couple from Maharashtra, registered prospective adoptive parents (PAPs) on the CARINGS portal, expressed interest in adopting Baby Mariyam. After proper home study, background verification, and counseling, the match was approved.

What followed was a heartwarming moment: Mariyam was placed into the arms of her adoptive mother and father, who had waited years to welcome a child. The pre-adoption foster care period allowed the family to bond with the baby while being guided by SAA counselors.

In February 2025, the adoption was finalized legally, and Baby Mariyam left the SAA center with a new name, a new home, and endless opportunities ahead. Today, she is safe, cherished, and thriving in a family that loves her deeply.

The successful adoption of Mariyam is a testament to the dedication of GSKVM’s SAA team, the efficiency of CARA’s legal adoption system, and the power of community vigilance. It reflects a seamless convergence of care, legality, and compassion, ensuring that no abandoned child is left behind.

Mariyam journey—from being a zero-day abandoned infant to becoming the daughter of a hopeful family—is a story of resilience, responsibility, and love. Through structured intervention, adherence to CARA guidelines, and human empathy, one more life was saved, and one more family was made whole.

5. Pre-Nutrition and Early Education Programme:

This innovative program addresses **malnutrition and early learning gaps** among rural and tribal children aged 0–6 years. GSKVM’s model blends **nutrition support, early childhood care and education (ECCE)**, and community empowerment to build a strong foundation for lifelong learning and well-being.

Key Achievements in 2024–25:

- **1,250 children** enrolled across **50 village-level ECCE and nutrition centers**
- Monthly **growth monitoring** and **nutrition supplements** ensured for enrolled children
- Over **100 anganwadi workers and mothers** trained in **child nutrition and feeding practices**
- **Community kitchens** launched in **15 villages** to serve **protein-rich, local meals**



- Partnered with **ICDS** to enhance coordination, service delivery, and record-keeping

Impact

- ✓ **22% improvement** in nutritional indicators
- ✓ Marked increase in **school readiness and cognitive development** among children
- ✓ Strengthened community participation in child care and education

With support from JDF, we provide daily nutritional biscuit and milk approx 100 children in three centre of Ramgarh Block, Palamu.



Success Story – A New Beginning at the Balwadi: Meena’s Journey to Health and Learning:

In a remote tribal village in **Kachan, Jharkhand**, 4-year-old **Meena Kumari** (name changed) was growing up in a family burdened with poverty, malnutrition, and illiteracy. Her father was a daily wage laborer and her mother, busy with household chores and younger siblings, had little time to care for Meena's development. She was underweight, often sick, and barely spoke—a reflection of her family's limited knowledge of nutrition, health, or early education.

Hope arrived when **Gramin Samaj Kalyan Vikas Manch (GSKVM)**, through its **Pre-Nutrition and Education Programme**, established a **Balwadi Centre** in the village. A local mobilizer identified Meena during a household survey. Initially hesitant, Meena’s mother was eventually convinced to enroll her after visiting the centre and witnessing joyful learning and nutritious meals.

At the Balwadi, Meena received a **balanced daily meal**, regular health check-ups, deworming, and immunization referrals. Within four months, she gained weight, became active, and more expressive. Through storytelling, rhymes, and playful learning, she started speaking in full sentences and interacting confidently. Her favorite activity? Drawing on the chalkboard.

Equally impactful were the **mothers' meetings** organized by GSKVM, which educated Meena’s mother about child nutrition, hygiene, and early education. This led to changes at home—better hygiene, regular meals, and school readiness.

By the end of the year, Meena had transformed into a bright, confident child, ready for primary school. Her journey showcases how integrated support—**nutrition, health, learning, and family involvement**—can break the cycle of poverty and unlock a child’s full potential.

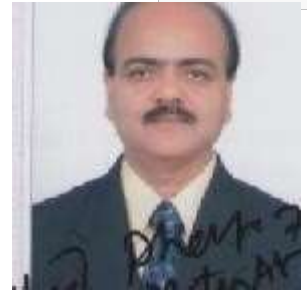

6. Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007

Gramin Samaj Kalyan Vikas Manch supports the **Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007** by raising awareness about senior citizens' rights to maintenance, healthcare, and residence. The Act mandates children/relatives to financially support elderly family members and empowers states to establish old age homes and provide affordable healthcare. It allows senior citizens to reclaim transferred property if neglected and ensures protection through Maintenance Tribunals. Legal representation is not mandatory, and abandonment of elders is punishable. Despite strong provisions, lack of public awareness and inadequate maintenance amounts remain key challenges

7. Awareness on Drug de Addiction:

Gramin Samaj Kalyan Vikas Manch actively conducts awareness programs on drug de-addiction, counselling, and mental health in rural and urban areas. We organize workshops, street plays, and community meetings to sensitize youth and families about substance abuse. Our trained volunteers offer primary counselling and referrals for rehabilitation. We



collaborate with health officials and social workers for effective outreach. The Manch is also an active member of the District Level Drug De-Addiction Committee constituted by the Deputy Commissioner.

8. **TB-Free India Campaign :**

The TB-Free India Campaign aims to eliminate tuberculosis through awareness, early detection, and timely treatment. It promotes active case finding, contact tracing, and community engagement, especially in rural and vulnerable populations.

GSKVM organizes TB awareness drives, health camps, and supports patients with counselling and nutritional aid. The campaign encourages public participation, stigma reduction, and collaboration with government health services. It aligns with the national goal of making India TB-free by 2025 through a multisectoral approach.

Success Story – Fighting the Stigma, Winning the Battle: Rekha’s Journey in the TB-Free India Campaign

In the remote village of **Manatu, Palamu (Jharkhand)**, 38-year-old **Rekha Devi** (name changed), a mother of three, suffered silently from persistent cough, weight loss, and fatigue. As a daily wage laborer, she couldn’t afford to seek treatment. Out of fear of stigma, she hid her condition. Her family and neighbors avoided her, her children stopped attending school, and Rekha became isolated—not just by illness, but by fear and misinformation.

Everything changed when **Gramin Samaj Kalyan Vikas Manch (GSKVM)**, under the **TB-Free India Campaign**, identified her case during a door-to-door screening drive. With support from an ASHA worker and a GSKVM volunteer, Rekha was referred for testing and diagnosed with **pulmonary TB**.

She was counseled, educated, and enrolled under the **National TB Elimination Programme (NTEP)** for free treatment via **DOTS (Directly Observed Treatment, Short-course)**. GSKVM also provided **nutritional kits**, regular **home visits**, and linked her to the **Nikshay Poshan Yojana** for financial assistance.

Despite initial resistance from her community, ongoing **awareness sessions** and **IEC campaigns** helped change perceptions. Slowly, neighbors began visiting, her children returned to school, and Rekha completed her treatment successfully.

After **six months**, Rekha was declared **TB-free**.

Now a **TB Champion**, she shares her story at community events, urging others—especially women—not to hide symptoms but to seek timely help and fight the stigma.

Rekha’s journey reflects the transformative power of GSKVM’s TB-Free India Campaign, which continues to drive change through early detection, community engagement, treatment adherence, and stigma reduction—one village, one life at a time.

9. **Activities Conducted under Shakti Sadan / Ujjawala Scheme**

Location: *Ujjawala Home, Birsa Nagar, Shahpur, Palamu*

Gramin Samaj Kalyan Vikas Manch has undertaken several key initiatives for the welfare of children and vulnerable communities during the period 2020 to 2024 under the Shakti Sadan / Ujjawala Scheme. The major activities include:

- Prevention of child marriage



- Prevention of human trafficking
- Prevention of sexual exploitation
- Awareness and coordination related to the POCSO Act and Juvenile Justice (JJ) Act
- Active collaboration with Childline services
- Capacity building and training of police personnel

In addition, the organization has implemented nutrition and education programmes for SC/ST/PTG communities.

Under the Ujjawala Home (Shakti Sadan) scheme, the organization successfully operated:

- Ujjawala Home (2020–2024)
- Girls' Home with *Fit Facility* within the Ujjawala Home



Success Story: Rescuing and Rebuilding Lives through Ujjawala Home

A Journey from Exploitation to Empowerment

In the heart of Palamu, where dreams are often overshadowed by poverty and trafficking, GSKVM's **Ujjawala Home** stands as a sanctuary of hope for girls rescued from exploitation.

Pinki Kumari (name changed), a 16-year-old from a tribal village in Latehar, was lured to Delhi under the false promise of a job. What followed was months of forced labor and emotional abuse in a private home. A joint rescue operation by Delhi Police and anti-trafficking units brought her to safety, but with no documents or family contact, Pinki needed more than rescue — she needed healing.

At **Ujjawala Home (Shakti Sadan)**, she received immediate medical care, trauma counseling, and was surrounded by empathetic caregivers. Slowly, Pinki began to rebuild her sense of self through therapy, vocational training in tailoring and computers, and life skills sessions.

GSKVM also facilitated **safe family reintegration**, training her parents on trafficking prevention and psychosocial support. Today, Pinki is back home, running her own tailoring unit and **volunteering to spread awareness** about trafficking among rural girls.

Her story is a powerful reminder that **with protection and opportunity, survivors can lead with strength, not stigma**. Ujjawala Home continues to transform such lives — one rescued girl at a time.
