SUMMARY

During the reporting year 2024–2025, INP+ achieved substantial progress under the VOICE Programme, including a Self-Assessment Tool (SAT) score of 130 out of 158 parameters and the successful upload of supporting documents. The organization enhanced its capacity with a professional secretariat in Chennai and ensured visibility through regularly updated social media handles and a website.

Interactive workshops focused on roles, compliance, governance, and strategic planning were complemented by exposure visits to APD and FEVARD-K, while strategic planning efforts continued into 2025, finalizing a three-year plan. The Niranthara Lite Program provided four months of structured training to member organizations, emphasizing compliance, governance, HR management, and digital visibility.

Needs assessments revealed critical areas such as leadership training, skill-building, and fundraising, which were addressed through workshops benefiting organizations in Karnataka and Kerala. These accomplishments reflect INP+'s commitment to empowering its member organizations and ensuring long-term impact and sustainability.

INTRODUCTION

The Indian Network for People Living with HIV / AIDS (INP+) started in 1997, is a national network for, by and of the people living with HIV/AIDS in India. Since its inception, INP+ has aimed to improve the quality of life of people living with HIV/AIDS and give them a sense of belonging, political empowerment and strength of spirit. After a short period of hibernation, INP+ is back in action as a federation of organizations working for people living with HIV in South India, to regain its momentum to provide a sense of belonging and togetherness to people living with HIV.

Vision:

An Inclusive Society for People Living with HIV

Mission:

1. Ensuring the effective implementation of The HIV and AIDS (Prevention and Control) Act of 2017.
2. To ensure greater economic opportunities for people living with HIV (To reach out to 10,000 eligible people by 2028)
3. To advocate for improved access to health care services for People living with HIV by merging HIV and National Health Mission [NHM] policies

4. To enhance the capacity of 300 leaders from member organisations to accomplish these missions.

THROUGH OUR ACTIVITIES

VOICE PROGRAMME:

The VOICE – Federation Enablement Programme, in partnership with the Dhvani Foundation, aimed to empower NGO federations by enabling them to play a significant role in policy-making and implementation. This initiative focuses on enhancing the capabilities of federations by strengthening governance frameworks and providing tools for effective organizational development. The ultimate goal is to improve member services, promote sustainability, and create lasting impact.

As part of the program, INP+ has taken a major step forward by setting up a newly reconstructed secretariat in Chennai, supported by a team of committed professionals. Furthermore, the organization has successfully implemented 130 standard parameters, which are vital for establishing and maintaining a robust and effective federation.

Self-Assessment Tool and Parameter Implementation

As part of the VOICE program, a comprehensive list of 158 parameters, essential for fostering an effective federation, was developed along with a Self-Assessment Tool (SAT) to evaluate the implementation of these parameters. The Secretariat team worked thoroughly on the SAT and reported a score of 122 as of March 31, 2025. Physical evidence confirming the implementation of these parameters has been documented, and the process of uploading supporting documents and sharing links has been completed.

Website and social media

With the support of 1NGO, the website and social media platforms—Facebook, LinkedIn, and Instagram—were successfully established for INP+, and regular updates are currently ongoing. Additionally, requisitions for website pages and social media handles for member organizations were submitted to 1NGO, resulting in the creation of 54 Facebook pages. These pages are now prepared for transfer, and the handover process is scheduled to take place in the coming months.

CAPACITY BUILDING TRAINING FOR FEDERATION:

During the reporting year, INP+ board members and secretariat staff participated in extensive training sessions aimed at transforming the organization's structure, systems, and procedures. These initiatives were designed to strengthen their capacity to effectively fulfill the federation's mission.

- One key event was the first interactive workshop held in Bangalore on April 22-24, 2024, facilitated by the Dhvani Foundation. This workshop focused on several critical aspects, including understanding the goals and purpose of the federation, clarifying the roles of the secretariat, exploring modules and parameters, group presentations on parameters and SAT scores, and the preparation of a status report. Additionally, the team had an exposure visit to the Association for Physically Disabled (APD), providing valuable insights and learning opportunities.



- The second interactive workshop, conducted on May 23 and 24, 2024, in Bangalore, focused on several pivotal topics, including the development of the secretariat profile, insights into member organizations, implementation of parameters, refinement of vision and mission statements, and research methodology for the status report. Additionally, discussions encompassed board and sub-committee meetings to ensure strategic alignment.

As part of the workshop, participants visited the FEVARD-K office, where they had the opportunity to learn from its extensive experience and practices as a federation representing 800 voluntary organizations in Karnataka. This visit provided valuable lessons and inspiration for strengthening their own federation's impact and operations.





- The third interactive workshop, conducted on August 20 and 21, 2024, at the Don Bosco Provincial Training Center in Bangalore, concentrated on a range of crucial topics. These included discussions on the federation's short-term and long-term perspectives, the development of a comprehensive handbook on parameters and compliances, the seven goals and objectives of the Common Minimum Program, as well as key governance principles, compliance requirements, and labor laws. This workshop played a vital role in equipping the federation with the knowledge and tools necessary for effective and sustainable operations.



- On November 25, 2024, the fourth interactive workshop took place at Paalana Bhavana, Bangalore, involving the secretariat team and board members. The main focus of the workshop was on Management Information Systems (MIS). Team members Goojan, Vinaya, and Monica led an engaging hands-on session, guiding participants through the process of data entry using the Goojan MIS software. This practical session contributed to enhancing the team's proficiency in utilizing the MIS system effectively.



- From January 3 to 5, 2025, a Strategic Planning workshop took place at the Don Bosco Provincial Training Center in Bangalore, involving board members and the secretariat team. Facilitated by experts from the Dhvani Foundation, the workshop provided an in-depth overview of the 12-step strategic planning procedure. The sessions were enriched by eight presentations, each based on pre-workshop assignments. Following the workshop, all federations were instructed to initiate their strategic planning processes and submit draft plans by the end of March 2025, ensuring alignment and progress toward collective goals.



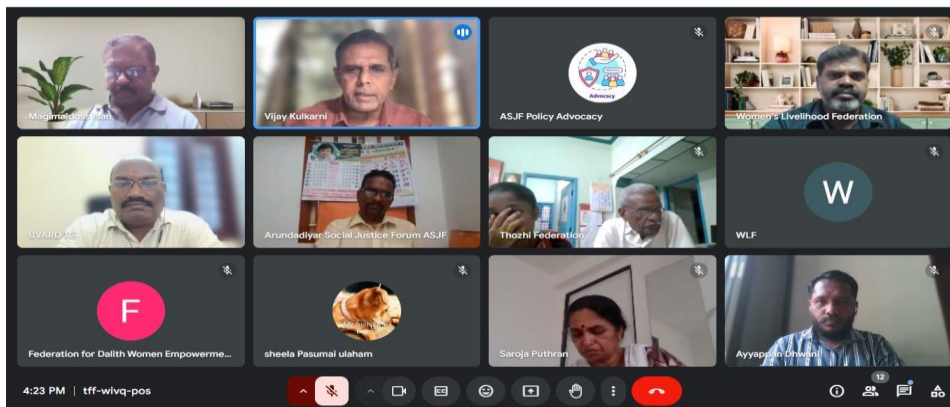
- On March 4 and 5, 2025, an exposure visit to the Thozhi Federation, accompanied by an in-house training session, took place at the Pastoral Centre in Dharmapuri. This visit provided federation members with valuable insights into Thozhi's expertise, operational practices, and methodologies for implementing the Niranthara Lite program for their member organizations.

Additionally, an interactive session was held during which federations shared their reflections and learnings from the past year's collaborative initiatives with the Dhvani Foundation. This engaging discussion also served as a platform to strategize and outline plans for the year ahead, fostering mutual support and growth among participants.



- On March 12, 2025, the strategic planning workshop continued in an online format. Facilitated by Mr. Isan and Mr. Vijay Kulkarni from the Dhvani

Foundation, the session provided valuable guidance to federation participants on crafting their strategic plans and clearly defining their goal statements. This virtual workshop reinforced the foundations for effective planning and goal-setting across federations.



NIRANTHARA LITE -MASTER TRAINERS TRAINING

- A three-member team, comprising representatives from the secretariat staff and member organizations, participated in the 1st Master Trainers Training conducted by Dhvani Foundation on June 20-21, 2024, in Bangalore. The workshop emphasized key topics such as the significance of Organizational Development in NGOs, with a particular focus on maintaining proper documentation. It also provided an in-depth overview of the Niranthara Lite Member Services Program. Participants were tasked with creating a presentation about Niranthara Lite in their local language and submitting it to the Dhvani Foundation.



- The second Master Trainers Training occurred on November 6-7, 2024, at Paalana Bhavana, Bangalore. P.R. Taniska and Shaun Michael represented INP+ as Master Trainers and gained in-depth knowledge on governance, finance, and accounting specifically tailored for non-governmental organisations.



- The third Master Trainers Training was held on February 10-11, 2025, at the Attapady Adivasi Development Initiative (AADI) in Attappady, Kerala. Snehalatha and Shan Michael represented INP+ and gained expertise in Human Resource Management, Program Management, Marketing, and Donor Management. This session marked the conclusion of the Master Trainers training process. Dhvani Foundation instructed the trainers to continue conducting Niranthara Lite training sessions for member organisations and to complete them by March 15, 2025





SOUTH INDIA PARTNERS MEET

The Dhwani Foundation organized a South India Partners Meet on the 26th and 27th of November 2024 at Paalana Bhavana, Bangalore. The event focused on addressing the challenges encountered by partners during program implementation, exploring the opportunities that emerged, and discussing strategies for advancing in the coming years. Experts from various sectors also shared their insights to guide future directions.



SECOND NATIONAL CONCLAVE ON SOCIAL SECTOR FEDERATIONS

The second Conclave was held from the 3rd to the 5th of February 2025 at Paalana Bhavana, Bangalore. The event focused on evaluating the one-year partnership under the

VOICE programme and gathering expert insights to chart a way forward.



CAPACITY BUILDING FOR FEDERATION MEMBERS:

Karnataka:

On June 25, 2024, a one-day capacity-building workshop was conducted at ISHA, Bangalore, for member organizations across Karnataka. A total of 31 organizations actively participated in this training, which concentrated on the VOICE program, revisioning efforts, and conducting a comprehensive needs assessment.

The training needs assessment session resulted in the identification of an extensive list of requirements, which included:

- Organizational development training for all members.
- Administration management support.
- Training in CSR funding and fundraising strategies.
- Awareness sessions on the HIV Act.
- Communication skill training.

- Skill development and capacity building for women and youth.
- Computer training for children, youth, and women affected or infected.
- Income generation (IG) training and employment opportunities.
- Leadership training for second-line leaders.
- Capacity-building programs for community and committee members.
- Guidance on accessing government schemes.

These outlined needs underscored the diverse and critical areas requiring focused attention to empower member organizations and enhance their impact.



Tamil Nadu:

1. On June 25, 2024, a one-day capacity-building workshop was conducted at ICSA, Chennai, for member organizations in Tamil Nadu. A total of 15 organizations took part in the session, which covered topics such as the concept of Federations, the Dhvani Foundation, the VOICE program, revisioning, training needs assessment, and situation assessment. Participants also expressed a need for more in-depth training on Organizational Development and system strengthening.



2. A workshop on HIV/AIDS (P & C O Act 2017 and Common Minimum Program was conducted for Tamil Nadu members on 13th September 2024. Dr. K.

Shanmugavelayutham conducted the session using two different presentations. The first presentation covered the history of the HIV (P&C) Act, 2017, including key provisions of the Act, a rights-based approach, prohibitions against



discrimination (both towards HIV-positive individuals and their families), informed consent, and the disclosure of HIV status. He also discussed the appointment of an Ombudsman, the duties and responsibilities of complaints officers at the institutional level,

guardianship, court proceedings, penalties for violations of the Act, and the roles of central and state governments in providing relief to those affected. The second half of his session focused on the implementation structure of the HIV (P&C) Act, 2017, as well as the legal redress forums and the current status of its implementation.

Kerala:

A capacity-building workshop for member organizations in Kerala was held on August 28, 2024, at the Renewal Centre, Ernakulam. Thirteen member organizations participated in the session, which focused on the HIV/AIDS (Prevention and Control) Act, 2017. Advocate Sandhya Raju from the Kerala High Court facilitated the workshop, covering key aspects such as:

- Prohibition of discrimination
- Prohibition of certain acts, including the expression, publication, or propagation of hate against protected persons
 - Informed consent and exceptions to informed consent
- Disclosure of HIV status, including to partners
- Protection of property rights for children
- Responsibilities of establishments
- Grievance redressal mechanisms, including the role and duties of the state Ombudsman and the procedure for appointing an Ombudsman
- Rights of individuals in the care and custody of the state

- Guardianship by older siblings
- Applicable penalties and legal sections

The workshop provided valuable insights into these critical areas, equipping participants with a deeper understanding of the Act and its implementation. The workshop also highlighted the necessity and significance of the Common Minimum Program (CMP) for federations, emphasizing its role in creating a unified framework to guide their efforts. INP+ presented its proposed seven goals and purposes during the session, which included:

- Advocacy and Policy Influence
- Capacity Building
- Resource Mobilization
- Networking and Collaboration
- Communication and Awareness Building
- Standards and Accountability
- Sustainability and Impact

NIRANTHARA LITE~ORGANISATIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

In August 2024, under the guidance of the Dhwani Foundation, documents were collected for the N. Lite registration process. Out of 14 NGOs, a total of 12 submitted their basic documents for review as part of the enrolment procedure. After receiving the documents, Snehalatha A, Policy Advocacy Manager of INP+, and Mr. Shaun Micheal, Master Trainer, organized panel interviews for Kerala member NGOs. These interviews were conducted with Mr. Sankar and Ms. Sharmila, external panellists recommended by the Dhwani Foundation. Following the panel interviews, 14 member organizations were successfully selected for the Niranthara Lite Batch 1 in Kerala

Niranthara Lite is a dynamic organizational development program tailored to offer practical, hands-on assistance to small and emerging organizations. Its core mission is to establish and strengthen fundamental standards in compliance, governance, finance, and accounting systems, alongside building essential knowledge in human resource management. By focusing on these areas, the initiative aims to help organizations enhance their credibility and vitality, empowering them to make significant strides toward growth.

The program spans a focused four-month journey, guiding participants through the achievement of 75 foundational parameters across seven key modules: Compliance, Governance, Finance and Accounts, Human Resources, Leadership Strategy, Marketing, Fundraising and Donor Management, and Program Management. Through this structured approach, Niranthara Lite equips organizations with the tools they need to create a lasting and meaningful impact in their respective domains.



- The Niranthara Lite Member Services Program – Batch 1 took place on November 3 and 4, 2024, at the Cardinal Parecattil Memorial Renewal Center in Kaloor, Ernakulam, Kerala. This training program was designed to strengthen the capabilities of INP+ member organizations by delivering targeted sessions on organizational development, with a particular emphasis on compliance standards. The program provided valuable insights and practical guidance to empower member organizations in their growth journey.



- INP+ conducted the second training session of the Niranthara Lite Member Services program for Batch 1 in Kerala on February 20 and 21, 2025. This session placed a strong emphasis on the governance of the Federation, addressing crucial topics such as the roles and responsibilities of the governing board, the selection process for board members, and their induction procedures. The second focus area was finance and accounts, offering participants valuable insights into key policies, including

financial, procurement, and conflict of interest policies. This training aimed to equip participants with the knowledge and tools to maintain transparency and effective governance within their organizations.



- The third and final training session of the Niranthara Lite Member Services program for Batch 1 was conducted on March 10 and 11, 2025, at the Renewal Center in Ernakulam. This concluding session concentrated on critical topics such as human resource management, HR policy formulation, and leadership strategies. Additionally, the training emphasized enhancing the federation's visibility through the effective use of websites and digital media platforms for marketing and donor management. This session marked an essential milestone in equipping members with the tools needed for sustainable organizational growth and outreach.
- **Implementation of parameters by the Trainee organisations:** The implementation of parameters by the trainee organizations involved conducting a baseline study of the organization at the beginning of the training process, alongside the preparation of SAT score documents. The INP+ team has been actively supporting and guiding each organization to ensure the effective implementation of these parameters.



SUBCOMMITTEE MEETINGS

Under the guidance of the Dhvani Foundation, three sub-committees were established to focus on the Common Minimum Program (CMP), Member Service (MS), and Resource Mobilization (RM). Each committee comprises seven members, led by a board member of INP+. The Board of the Federation approved these committees and developed a Scope of Work for their activities.

Snehalatha A, the Policy Advocacy Manager, drafted the Terms of Reference (ToR) for the Resource Mobilization sub-committee and shared it with the Dhvani Foundation. On July 23, 2024, the Resource Mobilization Sub-Committee conducted an orientation meeting to introduce members to the committee's objectives, goals, and the ToR.

RESEARCH STUDY

A pilot study conducted by INP+ in Namakkal, Tamil Nadu aimed to assess cancer-related knowledge among people living with HIV and identify barriers to access cancer screening, treatment, prevention, and care. The study found that over 50% of respondents were unaware of the risk of cancer among PLHIV, and 90% did not recognize key symptoms of common cancers. Awareness of self-testing for breast cancer was limited to 13.3% of respondents, and only 6.75% had performed the test.

Stigma and discrimination against PLHIV in the public healthcare system, along with biased attitudes towards key populations like sex workers, are the primary barriers to accessing screening and treatment services. Other barriers include the high cost of treatment, lack of awareness about cancer risks, and negative impacts of managing both HIV and cancer on mental, physical, and social well-being. Despite the Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme (CMCHIS) being partially available in government hospitals, its availability in private hospitals is inconsistent. Despite many having CMCHIS cards, 80% of respondents did not take advantage of the benefits offered by the scheme.



MONITORING AND EVALUATION

1. VOICE Programme Manager's Visit

On the 7th of August 2024, Mr. Ayyappan, the VOICE Programme Manager, conducted a monitoring visit to the INP+ Federation Office in Chennai. The primary objective of his visit was to assess the implementation of key parameters related to the Federation management and to ensure that these were being adhered to effectively. During the visit, Mr. Ayyappan reviewed various aspects of office management, including administrative processes, documentation standards, and resource allocation. He engaged with the staff to discuss operational challenges and provided constructive feedback on areas needing improvement. The visit served as an opportunity to strengthen the programme's execution and ensure that the federation office operates as a model of excellence. It also laid the groundwork for ongoing collaboration and capacity building to enhance the programme's impact.

2. Dhwani Foundation Senior Management Team visit

On September 25, 2024, Mr. Kishore Kumar, Mr. Vijayanidhi, Mr. Vijay Kulkarni, and Mr. Nikhil from the Dhwani Foundation visited the INP+ Federation Secretariat to assess the implementation of various parameters. The visit included three levels of discussions: one with the secretariat team, another with INP+ board members, and a third with INP+ member NGOs.



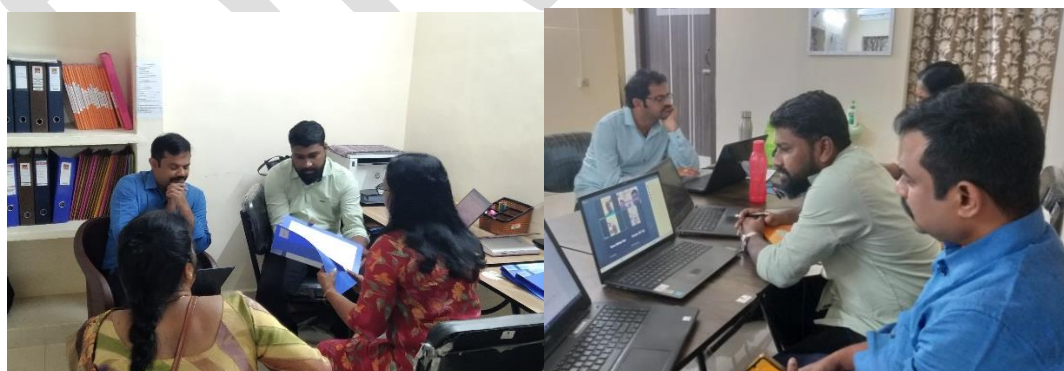
3. VOICE Programme consultant's visit

To verify the implementation of parameters in INP+, Mr. Jeypaul, the VOICE Programme Consultant, visited the office on 5th December 2024. During his visit, he reviewed all the implemented parameters and addressed doubts regarding certain aspects. Additionally, he recommended a few changes to the evidences and requested their completion by the end of March 2025.

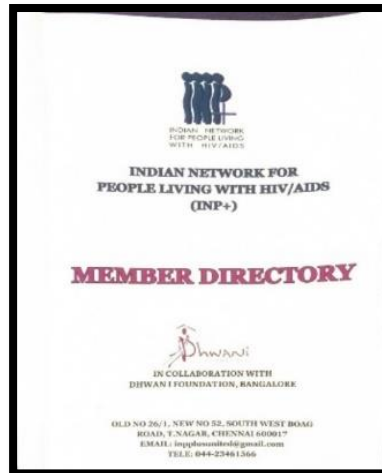
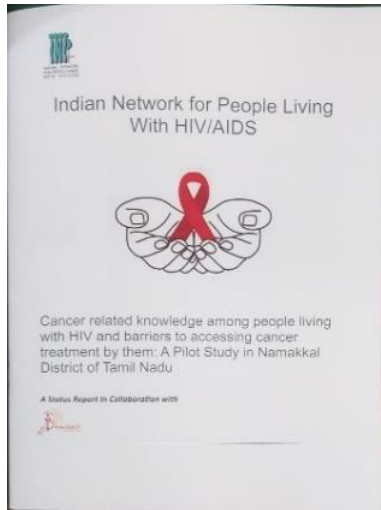
4. Mid-term Evaluation of the VOICE Programme:

The mid-term evaluation was conducted by Mr. Nikhil and Mr. Praveen from the Chennai office of the Dhvani Foundation. This evaluation served as a comprehensive review of various aspects of the organization's functioning and programme implementation. The evaluators began by thoroughly examining all the parameters, systems, and procedures adhered to within the secretariat. Their objective was to ensure that the established operational protocols were being followed effectively and were aligned with the goals of the programmes. They also assessed the implementation of various initiatives under the organisation's purview, highlighting areas of success and identifying potential areas for improvement.

Following this, Mr. Nikhil and Mr. Praveen engaged in an in-depth interaction with the INP+ board members. This session focused on governance aspects, including the decision-making process, leadership roles, and strategic direction of the organization. The evaluators provided insights and recommendations to strengthen governance practices and ensure the organization's long-term sustainability. Subsequently, the evaluators met with the Niranthara Lite trainees. This interaction centered around the Organization Development (OD) training sessions that the trainees had undergone. The discussion explored how the trainees were applying the principles and parameters taught during the training to improve organizational capacity and efficiency.

BOARD MEETINGS

During this reporting year, four board meetings were conducted on the following dates: 22nd June 2024, 20th December 2024, 9th February 2025, and 13th March 2025. These meetings were pivotal, as many significant decisions were made to enhance the organization's functioning. Policies such as the Finance Policy, HR Policy, Travel Policy, POSH, CPP, and Purchase Policy were approved. It was also resolved to form five sub-committees, schedule the AGM, develop a strategic plan, focus on member enrollment and membership fees, finalize the annual plan and budget, implement a Common Minimum Program, and appoint an auditor. While most meetings were conducted online, the final meeting was held in person in Vijayawada.

ANNUAL GENERAL BODY MEETING

The 28th annual general meeting was conducted on 12th September 2024 in Chennai. 23 participants from the five southern states participated in the meeting. The meeting mainly discussed member enrolment and affiliation of member organisations through MoU, bye-law amendment and expansion of the board. The annual report and audit reports were approved by the general body member and the departed members were remembered by lighting candles.

Consultation for Voluntary National Report (VNR) on Sustainable Development

The Government of India has decided to present the Third Voluntary National Report (VNR) during the High-Level Political Forum in 2025. UNAIDS and UNDP facilitated a National Consultation with the LGBTQIA+ and People

Living with HIV (PLHIV) community on January 3, 2025, at the UNAIDS Office in Delhi.
