The organization is registered under SOCIETY REGISTRATION ACT 1860 as a non-profit non-political organization working at the grassroots in Uttar Pradesh with a view of facilitating the under privileged section of the society to plan, implement, monitor and evaluate programme designed by their own growth and development. It has been providing support to the disadvantaged sections of the community by encouraging their active participation in all level so as to develop a self reliant society with a focus on socio-economic empowerment of the community especially women as decision makers in the development process.

Jan Kalyan Shikshan Prasar Samiti (JKSPS) started to work with mandated of participative development and creation of employment through farming and non-farming activities for sustainable livelihood options support and assistance towards land reclamation enabled the people to earn supplementary income for their livelihood. Simultaneously capacity building of local people in diversified activities helped them to find out additional means of livelihood options. In addition, integrated development strategy has been adopted for sustainable farming and creation of infrastructure. With this strategy considerable progress has been made in achieving self-reliance, which reflected in reduction of migration of people..

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Domestic Viloence

Domestic violence in India includes any form of violence suffered by a person from a biological relative, but typically is the violence suffered by a woman by male members of her family or relatives. According to a National Family and Health Survey in 2005, total lifetime prevalence of domestic violence was 33.5% and 8.5% for sexual violence among women aged 15–49. A 2014 study in [The Lancet](#) reports that the reported sexual violence rate in India is among the lowest

in the world, the large population of India means that the violence affects 27.5 million women over their lifetimes. There are several domestic violence laws in India. The earliest law was the Dowry Prohibition Act 1961 which made the act of giving and receiving dowry a crime. In an effort to bolster the 1961 law, two new sections, Section 498A and Section 304B were introduced into the Indian Penal Code in 1983 and 1986. The most recent legislation is the Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act (PWDVA) 2005. The PWDVA, a civil law, includes physical, emotional, sexual, verbal, and economic abuse as domestic violence.

SAVE DRINKING WATER AWARENESS PROGRAMME:

There is an urgent need to take action to prevent misuse of water. Recently the droughts in various Indian states have compelled us to think about the ways and means of the water conservation and land management. A camp to this effect was organized by the society at Pahadi Block of district Chitrakoot. The participants were informed about the various techniques that can be adopted to conserve the water. Apart from this the participants were informed about the need for use of only clean water as the drinking water.

But, as because the vaccines are very costly and awareness about HB very low common man fails to get vaccinated. Now a day's mass vaccination is being done by many companies at very discounted prices. The foundation encouraged people to take full benefit of this kind of opportunity and get vaccinated of HB. The programming was successful run in village Bnadi, Sidhpur and Gadheeva Block Karwi of Chitrakoot district.

WOMEN & CHILD WELFARE PROGRAMME:

An awareness generation programme aimed at making women & children aware about their fundamental rights was organized by the society at Pahadi Block of Chitrakoot. The programme was attended by people from all walks of the life and it was felt by the attendant that these kinds of programmes are very useful in the society like ours where women awareness about their fundamental rights is very low. Further, they were informed about various kinds of schemes formed and executed by different Govt. Departments for welfare of the women either, it is in education, employment or technical guidance etc.

Not only were these the children provided immunization as precaution against various diseases. Apart from this the society organized vaccination programmes for the poor children and also has been providing necessary books and educational facilities to the children of the deprived sections.

Pre School Nutrituion and Education Program

As a direct response to the problem of Malnourishment highlighted in the published Lancet study highlighting the disparities between states, Jiv Daya Foundation has put together a framework for action in Village based intervention and programs. The framework focuses on the most effective option of preventing and corrective malnourishment in children by provision of Milk. JDF aims to support villages not only to ensure that children received adequate daily nourishment through milk, but also to engage in the learning activities to impact their overall health and wellbeing.



Solution

I. Through our extensive research and trials, JDF has come to conclusion that 150 ml of Milk prepared by Amul Spray powder (Amul) is highly effective in meeting Daily Recommended Dietary Allowance (RDA) for the children under age of 5 years.

2. Amul Spray Powder formula not only addresses daily requirements for Protein, Carbohydrate and fat but also has added Micronutrients which are required to encourage steady growth in children.

3. Amul Spray Powder is local available, and taste is acceptable to all the children due to its sweetness.

We started milk project in backward village Bheda Kshetra and Rampuriya of Manikpur block in District Chitrakoot Uttar Pradesh . We gives 150 ml milk and 2 parley g biscuit every day . JKSPS distribute 1 set dress and shoes to 130 children with help of JDF





HEALTH & FAMILY PLANNING CAMP:

Considering very high level of reluctance on part of the villagers to adapt the family planning methods the population explosion has taken place causing deterioration in the available resources like Food, Education, Housing, employment opportunities etc. A camp was organized by the society at Chitrakoot to raise awareness about the bad effects of the disproportionate growth in the population. Help of audio visual techniques was taken to make the

presentation more effective. At the end of the camp condoms and contraceptive pills were distributed among the villagers.



The villagers were encouraged to adapt the notion of only one child per couple. Further it is observed that many couples in anticipation of one male child give birth to a number of girl children. The attempt was made to teach them the reality of the modern era that virtually there is no difference between the male and the female child. Both the boys and the girls are equal in the sense that the girls have the same opportunities as do have the boys. The participants highly appreciated this educational programme.

High death rate in the rural areas, of women, at the time of delivery is a matter of major concern for all of us. To teach the importance of delivery of baby through use of modern techniques was demonstrated during the camp organized by the society. Apart from this free check up was carried out of the women and children in the camp.

Use of Digital Resource for Health and Science Communication

The main objective of the project is to create awareness among the people. we understand about corona virus develop. how to deal with corona positive patient as well as corona warriors. How to behave our aim is to follow social distancing. to save health. Importance of digital resources in social distancing. digital medium is important in the battle of corona virus. Could be a weapon. To develop understanding for the health problems of the villagers in the village. Make them aware through posters and videos. Corona during we camp Follow the guidelines issued by the government for the virus. we remove the effect of corona virus. For connectivity to Facebook, Twitter and other social media apps will be used. Our work is going on gram panchyat Itaura, Kapna, Chandra Mara, Gonda of Chitrakoot district.

1. We organize 10 awareness camps in the village to teach them how to sanitize the house and make masks and sanitizers with the help of volunteers.
2. Locate the corona positive person and inform the local government.
3. Find and quarantine laborers and other workers coming from other states.
4. We make villagers aware through wall writing banners, posters, puppet shows.
5. We help people to know about government schemes so that they can benefit from government schemes.
6. Ensuring that people do not harm the corona patient.
7. We follow all the guidelines of the government while helping the people.

8. We involve local religious leaders of different communities among the conscious people and try to assess the sanitation facilities and practices of the people living in rural areas of Chitrakoot district of Uttar Pradesh by observing social distancing. Includes awareness of virus diseases. The observations made under the study highlighted the need to create awareness about the role of water and sanitation practices on health including knowledge about various government schemes to improve water.

Youth as health and science literate warriors will be able to do regular work to create awareness among the specific groups of their area and identify environmental hazards and use measures to protect the particular group.

माँ सरस्वती का पूजन कर जन कल्याण शिक्षण प्रसार समिति के सचिव शंकर दयाल ने प्रशिक्षण की पृष्ठभूमि रखते हुए कहा कि समाज के स्वास्थ्य को दुर्लक्षित रखते हुए कोरोना महामारी से बचने के लिए एकजुट होकर प्रयास करना होगा। इस महामारी से बचने के लिए जागरूकता ही सबसे बड़ा इंधियार है। जिससे बचाव के लिए निम्न तरीके मास्क एवं सेनेटाइजर का उचित उपयोग और सोशल डिस्टेंसिंग का पालन करके कोविड 19 को हराया जा सकता है। साथ ही उन्होंने बताया कि विज्ञान एवं प्रौद्योगिकी मंत्रालय भारत सरकार स्वयं सेवी संस्थाओं के माध्यम से ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों में विभिन्न जागरूकता कार्यक्रमों के द्वारा लोगों को जागरूक कर रही है।
