INTRODUCTION

Thematic Focus: Education, Health, Nutrition, Raight to live Protection, Development and Participation.

Background

Margararshi began 14th April 2002 its work with street children on railway platforms of Gulbarga (now renamed Kalaburagi). It has been involved in many projects (in collaboration with the state government, independently as well as with other networks) addressing the issues of street children and child labour. It has also been part of various studies involving this crucial issue. Mr. Anand Raj, the Project Leader, has been active in many networks and forums engaging with the state for the protection of the rights of children. He has also contributed significantly towards improving the quality of management of many state-run children's homes in the district in the capacity of Chairperson/Member of the District Child Welfare Committee of Gulbarga. In the CRY operational area, and CHILDLINE project Margararshi has brought significant improvement by ensuring access to sponsorship programs under ICPS (Integrated Child Protection Scheme) to children of single parents/orphan; re-enrollment of dropouts and child labourers in schools and hostels; approve of a high school after three years of advocacy; improvement of infrastructure/ facilities in Anganwadi centres providing pre-school education and supplementary nutritional under ICDS (Integrated Child Development Scheme) and schools; formed School Development and Management Committees (SDMCs) in schools.

Problem Statement:

Margararshi is working in Chittapur, Sedam, Chincholli, Aland and Gulbarga taluka of the Gulbarga (Kalaburagi) district. Kalaburagi is considered as one of the most backward districts in the state of Karnataka. About 28% of the population in the district belongs to the socio-economically marginalized dalit community. The child rights situation is also poor in all the seven Talukas. The state is closing down schools in the district for the rationalization of resources and utilization. Karnataka has the second highest child labourers in 10-14 year old age-group in India as per 2011 census. Children are compelled to work as bonded labourers in landlord's agricultural firms/ houses or looking after cattle when their parents are not able to repay the amount of loans taken from the landlord. Elder children have to support their family in this time of crisis situation. Children aged 12 to 18 years old are involved in domestic work, quarry, cotton picking, cattle grazing, and agriculture and facing different risks like accidents while carrying loads in quarry work; get affected with Asthma in cotton picking work etc. Besides, children are also working as a part of a gang to dig and load sand; in hotels / bars in different capacities; driving tractors for owners or for rent; begging; rag picking and other seasonal agricultural work. Girls are perceived better at seed crossing, pollination, cotton picking, and chile picking since a lot of them are short in height and do the work more effectively. There is an access gap of 47% in primary schools by standards set by the RCFCE Act (Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009). And, there are only 4 government high schools for Grades 9 and 10 in the project area. The infrastructure situation is poor in these schools. While 16 schools do not have toilets, some schools do not even have drinking water. Major reasons for drop out in the area are poverty, search for survival needs, lack of access to school, safety and security concerns of adolescent girls, migration of parents, low educational attainment of parents, single parents or orphans with no care takers, health crisis in families and other problems in the family. Thus, dropout is influenced by a complex maze of factors from school environment to socio-economic and socio-psychological factors.

Whether we accept it or not "Street children, Unaccompanied Children, Malnourished Children, Missing Children, and Working Children or Child labourers, Child marriage" are a reality and are happening only among weaker sections of our society since they are more vulnerable and easily prone to exploitation, harassment, abuse and diseases. They are seen as untouchables by the public, deprived of love, affection, care and are forced to live in unhygienic living conditions. In addition, majority of these young children are at risk of addictions due to unavoidable and realistic reasons which they have undergone in their life such as broken families, ill-treatment by parents or family members, company of bad peers, influence of elder or senior street children, to pass time, to forget the past or sad part of their life and to live in a dream world than the existing world.. Margararshi Society®, a non-profit organization is

working for these marginalized and neglected children and registered under The Societies Act, came into existence in the year 2002. The society works for the children without any discrimination of caste, creed or color and brings them to the mainstream of the society by providing them with education, and necessary support. The society has been working for the past 16 years in the district of Kalaburagi.

Vision

“Margadarshi” envisages a child-friendly and sustained society, “where children are free from all forms of abuse, exploitation, malnutrition, enjoying childhood and their rights, live with respect and dignity and social justice without any discrimination”.

Mission

To make Kalaburagi as a model district ensuring child right for children in difficult condition by sensitizing and empowering children, youth, parents, caring community groups and making the civil society, government and allied systems and corporate accountable towards the development of children through promoting alternate care, networking, advocacy and lobbying and right based approach.

Objectives:

- To rescue and resettlement of children on the Kalaburagi Railway Platform who are separated from the families.
- To enhance the quality of lives of the children seen on railway platforms, (out of homes) through non-formal education, psychological support, and nurture.
- Research to understand the complex issues connected with rehabilitation.
- Reinforce self-identity, confidence in their abilities, and affection with family to overcome isolation from family, through orientation camps.
- Create awareness among the children, public, authorities and other organizations regarding the dangers of trafficking, physical and sexual abuse child marriage and ways of combating and preventing of the same.
- Lobby with Govt. Child Welfare Dept., Education Dept, Police Dept., Railway Authorities and Organization working with the children to protect the child rights and child issues through forming local committees.

Long-term Objectives of Margadarshi Society

The overarching objective of the society is to reunite the children living on the rail platforms with their parents and families with an emphasis on preventing the children, giving no formal training to most vulnerable children once they are resettled, to revert to their homes. Emphasis is also given to preventing of trafficking among children living on their own on the streets.

Background information on Margadarshi Society

MARGADARSHI is a registered society, working for the most vulnerable children in the society, exclusively working for street children and child labours. The genesis of the organization stems from its vision of helping and enabling those children who are rendered homeless and who live in the most difficult circumstances in their struggle for survival, by factors which are most often, out of their control. The experience of Margadarshi shows that even when the children leave their homes, it is a complex set of underlying factors which are instrumental in their decision to abandon their homes to survive on their own. Though only a few children are orphans neglected rag pickers and vulnerable, in the true sense of the word, all of them ultimately end up living the lives of orphans. Margadarshi started initially covering Kalaburagi and Wadi (Karnataka). The need assessment started with informal visits to the railway platform, bus stand and market contacting the children. Slowly a rapport with the children was established. The children were provided with shelter and food and gradually recreational visits outside the railway platforms such as picnics to nearby places were organized and were introduced to non-formal education. These initial attempts helped the organization to create a climate necessary for the children to open up and divulge the details of their history in terms of where they were from and their reasons for leaving home.

In our Operational area we have **23** Anganawadi Centre's every month we are visiting our households interacting with the Parents and identifying the 3 Year above children who are not going to pre-school and not admitted in the Anganawadi Center We have Visited door to door taken information of the child discussed with the mother and father motivated to the parents and reenrolled back in the anganawadi center.

Conducted BVSS meeting in the operational Area **Motivated BVSS** Members for enrolling children back to pre School who are in age of 3 Year and not going to the ECE. We have involved our community key persons like gram panchayath members, ASHA, AWW and Mothers collective members to motivate the children to enroll in AWC and attend regular ECE Activities Chilipili syllabus.

We have taken the list from the AWW and visited individual homes where children are not coming to the AWC where children were roaming in the village with elder sister and brother.

Some children are going to primary schools with elder sister brother's. primary school teachers informed to our team members and we enrolled them back to the Anganawadi Centre's.

We have visited dalit families and discussed with the Parents and informed them about AWC facilities for children. We have focused to the Migration families and children to enroll them in AWC giving basic facilities and support for the nutrition food and foundational education

In this 10 months 15 Days AWC has summer holidays we have enrolled 65 children to the AWC Home Visit, AWC Visit, Parents motivation ,Identifying the children who are 3 Years and eligible for the ECCE taken help from gram Panchayath members SDMC members AWW, ASHA and community key Persons and also the adolescent leaders.

First, we have visited to Anganawadi Centers and taken the list of the children who are above 5.5 years then we have motivated the parents for the 1st standard admission in government school. Also counseled parents and for educational background in the family.

We have contacted the gram panchayath members and SDMC member's ad school teachers for organizing school opening day and enrolment campaign this is yearly process in villages now community knows about school opening day and enrolment jathas now they are supporting for school programs and they are actively involving in the campaigns.

This year we are requested the community for welcome children with giving flowers decorating schools with balloons and

Community key persons are helping children for books and pencils teachers and our team is planned to grand welcome to children for the school we are planned different types of welcome and school opening programs in the 22 Villages.

In all the villages we have organized rally campaigns for enrolment with Slogans and charts also enrolled 1st standard to 5.5-year children in the time of Rally campaign.

In this process we have involved the community, Parents, Teachers, SDMC, gram Panchayat members, our CRC/ADC Collective Members to ensure 100% enrolment in the government school.

CASE STORY – 01

Providing Basic facilities



In the village of **Sogura K** , In order to provide Basic facilities to the people of village , Discussed in a huge crowd and **village panchayat office** and met with **gootur panchayt** . Request made to tell about the problems of the village with development officers and problem of village told to president and members and were informed about **child labor** practice and facilities. Then told about to do work related to the protection of Chincholi Constituency. Example: - **Child marriage Awareness programme.**



Dr. Avinash Jadhav, the MLA, came to this village to discuss the problems of the village and program was held on the activities of the foundation ceremony. In regard to request was made for us to participate in providing basic facilities of the village and to protect the girls. The MLA accepted the request and said that he will implement it as soon as possible. After 2 month the work has started.

Estimated cost of road construction, 10 lakhs.
School compound estimated cost, 25 lakhs.
School repair, 5 lakhs.
Estimated cost of construction of new building, 5 lakhs.

It has been requested that the basic infrastructure of the village is going on and more work projects should come.

CASE STORY – 02

Child's Full Name : Shivamma
Father Name : Mallikarjuna Age : 9
Name of the School : S.H primary School Chincholi H
Reason for dropping out : Deficiency in his practice and desire not to go to school.
Joined class of School : 3rd standard, Village : Chincholi H

Child's family Background: - In a child's home, a family includes a mother, father, Total 4 children's and 3 brothers and 1 Sister. Having a sheep and leaving a sick sheep to his son. The father migrated and worked as a construction worker. Earning an annual income of 40 thousand rupees.

The child is studying in government model senior primary school, in the middle of going to school every day the child lost her health. So child mother told her to take rest and took her to the hospital for treatment. After getting well, he r mother told her to go school, at that time child is also agreed. And mother went to work as a labor work, but the she was remain at home, and desire not to go to school.



The mother was angry with her daughter, after that she went to school for a week, but again and again she did same thing, what she did in earlier.

On every week I used to go for village of **Chincholi H** to visit Children's home, who has not attending school, during that time, a child was sitting on the ledge of her

home, When I enquired her why you are not attending school? She said that, she was suffering with fever, cold so unable go and attend school.

On next when I visited to their village, her parents were sitting in front their house. When i asked to her mother about child, she said that, she is not feeling well, same thing at last time what they said to us. And she said that, she hospitalized to her daughter. When she gets well, I will send her to school.

Why am I doing all of this, I asked? bringing children who had stopped attending school and emphasizing the value of education, Not taking education and by doing labor work sending children's to school But Main thing is, In a school Children's must attend school and reading is very important to them. Children's drop out of school because fear of teachers, like that I gave an examples to them.



I said to child that, if you go to school you will get many facilities but you should take advantage of it. Free cloths, books, milk, cycle, all those things for get to read and play. When you sit at home, you will forget reading and writing tomorrow. As you can see, your father is going to move to a different village to work, and the same will happen to you. You should practice initially if you want to become well-known in your community and become a huge person. Finally, she stated that she would start going school.

Present circumstances:-

This child informed me that she would attend school in order to establish her own life and gain recognition from her community. And then I walked back to the hamlet, where this girl was enrolled in school. After that, I ran into her at a school. **She informed me she was going to school every day** while she was eating.

CASE STORY – 03

Parents who take their children away from school to survive (migrant work)

Name: Prakruti

Name of the Father: Nagesh

Class: 1st

Name of the school: Government high school Chincholi H

Reason for dropping out: due to Financial situation at home.

School leaving date: 3 months

Background of the kid's family: the father, mother, and three children make up the family in the child's house; the first child is enrolled in the eighth grade. The third child was three years old, and the second child is a first-grader. And grandmother is also there at their home. Uncle and grandmother used to travel and work

Family issue:

Due to financial situation at their home and used to take care of the child they used to take the children with them.



Intervention of hand staff: I used to visit homes every day at that time, and in this particular home, the child's parents had abruptly left for work related to migration from the previous year. The other two children in this village were attending school and living with their grandmother when the children's grandmother unexpectedly passed away. They suffered as a result of this once more, and now their children are without a caregiver. Thus, in order to care for the kids, they used to bring the kids along. As a result, children's education is compromised. When I first met the

parents of the kids, I told them to bring back to school because their education was being ruined. Their father stated that in the following month, they **would be visiting and enrolling the kids in school.**

CASE STORY - 04

The full name of Child : Pavan Age : 13

Class : 7th class

Name of the school : Govt. High School kalgurti

Reason for dropping out : because the child is falling behind in their studies, is afraid to read, and prefers to sit at home.

School leaving days : 2 weeks Joined class of school : 7th standard Village: kalagurti



Background of Child family: - In a family includes Mother, father, three children, and grandmother . due to financial difficulties, so father used to work at others farm house and Mother working at others home in this way, they lived their lives without owning a piece of property .

Child issue:

When the child was younger, their father and grandmother were the primary causes of their school dropout. They instructed her to take a one-day break from school, but the child took two or three days off. Her mother, father, and grandparents then told her to return, and he obeyed. However, the child repeated the same behavior, skipping school because they were afraid of falling behind in their studies and choosing to stay at home instead

If I have a cycle, the only time I go to school. His parents brought a new cycle for him and prepare him for school. After the child attends school for two months, he used to skip school in the middle of the days and skip classes. His parents and grandparents tried to send him to school, but he refused to go.



Intervention by hand staff: this child rides a cycle every day and rounds the village. I visit this location once a week. When I saw this guy wandering around on his cycle, I asked him about school, and he said that he wasn't feeling well, so he wasn't going to school. I told him to go to school after he felt better.

After one week coming to village, this child roaming outside with his cycle, Did you not went to school? I asked about his school. He said didn't went. When I asked about child issue in their family and said them to

tried send him for a school because in the village it's hard to get ready for going school. And look at your elder sister; she is studying in 12th standard you should learn from her by seeing her. How she had a goal like that you should have and come forward .after all these he agreed to go school.

After one week I came back to village this child was riding his bicycle around the village. Had you not gone to school? I enquired about his educational institution. He said he didn't gone. I inquired about the child issue in their family and advised them to try sending him to school because it's difficult to prepare for school in the village. And have a look at your older sister; she is a 12th grade student, and you should observe her to gain knowledge. How she came forward with a goal similar to your own, and after all of this, he consented to go to school.

Present circumstances:

When I returned to the village a week later, I noticed a child was attending school.

When I inquired about him with his parents, they replied that **he had started attending school every day** since we first met.

CASE STORY – 05

Full name of the child: Anveer

Father : Subhash

Class: 7th class

Name of the school: Government model primary school Chincholi H

Reason for dropping out: because of the father's passing and fear of teachers.

School leaving days: 3 months

Joined class of school: 7th class

Village: Chincholi H



Background of Child family: In a family includes mother and two children's. And dad passed away. Remaining in her mother's hometown and subsisting on wage labor, while her brother is employed in a different district. The father of a child, died of health issues brought on by alcohol consumption when he was alive. Mother and child were living their lives in the village by working. Additionally lack property.

Child issue: father and mother are part of the family. The child attends school daily and studies in the **seventh standard**, but he leaves school in middle of days of week. After attending once a week, he would typically go to school two or three times the following week.

He fell behind in his studies since he regularly skipped school, disregarded his parents' advice, and was terrified of the teachers and his homework. Two weeks later, the child dropped out of school because his father passed away due to health problems brought on by alcohol consumption.

His friends would take him on bike rides, for walks outside, and to watch TV in other people's houses. Because of these activities, he avoided going to school because he believed that many teachers would chastise and beat him if he went.



more. When I met his mother, they informed me that he had not attended school since his father's death. After four months, he also stoppe **Intervention by hand staff:** *A child approached us when I was in the anganwadi center during my visit to Chincholi H village. When I asked him about his absence from school, he replied that he would start going to class tomorrow. When I used to go to the village twice a week, I noticed a child standing nearby the Ambedakar*

statue once d going to school. He used to hang out with his friends and go for bike rides outside as a result. Even though he was a school teacher, his mother still insisted that he attend, but he hasn't shown any interest in doing so.

I visited his home five times in three weeks, and each time he assured me that he would take me to school and let the teachers know so I could attend. Then he didn't go either. When I met his family, I told them that his brother wasn't living with them and was working in a different district, so it was just his mother and him. You could have taken care of your mother if you had attended



school. You could take care of your mother by staying with her and getting a small job through education. And after saying all of these, the other four people will begin to talk about how amazing you are.

Present circumstances:

Even though I said, "I too take with you," this child insisted that he would go to school tomorrow. I brought him to school and spoke with the teachers. I informed them since the child is afraid of you; they said that they won't do anything to him.

This child informed that he will go to school every day but didn't went to school, and Came to know that he was at home only.

CASE STORY - 06

Full name of child: Devaraj

Father: Mallappa

Class: 10th standard

Name of the School: Govt. High School. REVAGGI

Reason for dropping out: to simply drop out of school and tend to his sister and brother.

School leaving days: 1 week

Joined class of School : 10th standard

Village: Arankal

Background of the child's family: The mother and her three children are the only family members in their home; the father has passed away. The mother works as a laborer from home, while the children attend school and one child attends an anganwadi. As a result of her financial circumstances, the mother works as a laborer and is property-less.



Child's problem: The schooling of Father Mallappa's child. and attending school every day to complete his 10th grade education. After one to two weeks, he left school to stay at home and look after his younger brother. When his mother had work to do, his brother would simply leave school and wander the neighborhood.

Intervention by hand staff: During my weekly visits to the village of Arankal, I noticed a child standing close to the Ambedkar statue. I asked

him about school, and he replied that he didn't go because of a health issue. I told him to leave once you're better.

Once more, a week later, I went to the child's home to deliver a workbook for the tenth grade. When I asked about his school, he replied that his younger brother was alone at home, so I dropped out. When I spoke with his friend, he told me that he was just quitting school. Because you only had a mother, the reason I'm telling you all of this is to let you know how your family situation is thought of. As you get older, you'll become more intelligent and experience less hardship in life. Given all of this, he decided to go to school with the primary objective of studying rather than doing nothing.

Present circumstances:

After stating that he was prepared to go to school, he asked if you could kindly give a **workbook**. After proving workbook and all, and **expressed that i am very happy with that. And he said that he will never drop out of school.**

CASE STORY – 07

Full name of the child: Sindhu

Father: Basavaraj

Class: 7th standard

Name of the school: Govt. High School, Chincholi H

Reason for dropping out: The father used to take her and sent to work by dropping her from school.



Background of a child:

The family consisted of his mother, father, three children, grandmother, and uncle who used to reside at their house. Working on his own farm while also accompanying others to other farms by bringing his daughter. Farming and going about their lives on their own land.

The child's problem: is that their father only leaves school to send them to work, even though the child attends school every day. Thus, even her mother was forced to drop out of school by listening to his husband's remarks. The reason for this is that when the child was in school, he used to take her everywhere he went and take her to work in farming instead of just keeping her at home because he was afraid that someone would mistreat her.

Intervention by hand staff:

This child was still living at home when I went to **Sogur** Village to gather data while visiting. I met this girl's family several times when I visited her and asked questions about her. They claimed that she had a medical condition. I discovered that they are lying after hearing what they had to say.

After that, I used to visit the school once a week. The teachers' staff was keeping track of the students who had dropped out. They provided a list of students by stating that some of them would be working as migrants and others would be working. Using this list, I visited the child's home and spoke with her, motivating her that if you don't pursue education, you will live a difficult life at this age, when you have the chance to learn. Subsequently, her mother consented to enroll her in school. And I told the teachers at the school about it. After that, I came to know that she had not gone back to migration work.

Teachers went straight to the child's home after a week-long break because the child hadn't attended school. They inquired about the child's problems and informed them that it was their duty to ensure your daughter was taken care of without any issues.

Present Circumstances:



This child will not go to school until their parents give their permission. **After working together with school teachers and community organizers from the Margadarshi Society**, the child's parents decided to send her to school every day.

Intruduction

Homeless persons queue up at the back door of the shelter home from 4:00 PM for a carefully formatted intake and registration process. They must show a state-issued identification card, and those do not have identity card are also provided shelter after some questioning after ascertaining their authenticity. Each person's data is entered into our database to help us determine who is using the program and how often.

Writes one grateful neighbour: *"For moments each night, if I am fortunate, I sleep not as homeless in the street, but with warmth and friendship, Margadarshi. Somewhere during the evenings of friendly faces, showers, videos and jokes, laughs and I was transformed from homeless to someone with a misfortune. I no longer view the world from ground level, where each may look down on me. I view the world from ground zero, where each may view my launch. "I thank you, all who volunteer for this program. You have given me fortitude, I am sure that I am not alone in this."*

1. Rapid Survey: Details of Rapid Survey:

Margaradarshi Society conducts Rapid Survey 2 times in a month in the 7 places mentioned below. The objective is to find the homeless citizens and get them to the night shelter by auto. We collect information about these persons and counsel them and find out the reasons for them being away from home. We provide Society Identity Card to these homeless citizens.

During this year we have conducted 24 rapid surveys and we found 206 urban homeless citizens. 59 persons are getting services of the Margadarshi Society Night Shelter. Overall, 340 old urban homeless citizens are also taking the benefits of the night shelter facility.

Introduction

Due to the increase in population in India, today many people are destitute, homeless, homeless, without work, without food for two meals a day, we see in India since forever, in today's era, due to alcohol drinking, husband and wife quarrel, unemployment problem, property dispute and economy, people are struggling with the price of food grains, so the price of food grains has skyrocketed.

Therefore, without food, they become orphans and become destitute families have arrived. And for various reasons they come to town in front of shops, bus stands, roadsides, temples. They have taken shelter. The Supreme Court has ordered some shelter for such people. Accordingly, in the state of Karnataka, the municipal corporations have floated hostels, as a result of the government's schemes; schemes have been built for self-service organizations to provide shelter to the citizens in such homeless hostels. It cannot be wrong to say that through such a project, there are shelters in our Kalaburagi district today and it has become a shelter for so many homeless citizens.

1. Rapid Survey, April 2023 to March 2024

We conduct a rapid survey twice every month and we bring the people found in the rapid survey to the margadarshi night shelter gunj here. We record the complete details of the Shelter staff and their photograph in the shelter registration book and attach a shelter identity card to each one and submit their complete information to the City Corporation once a month.

Health check up camp

A free health camp is organized at the center every month, Dr. Mallerava Malle will come and does a proper health checkup for the refugees give them free medicine and give them good health tips. Then we prepare a list of all the refugees involved in this camp and compulsorily submit a report once a month to the City Corporation along with a biographical picture.

Understanding Awareness Meeting

An awareness camp will be conducted once a month for all the refugees coming to the shelter and all the refugees will be involved in the camp. Topics discussed in this camp are as follows.

You should not come to the shelter after drinking alcohol, this shelter is not made for you to come and sleep after drinking Alcohol.

You have to get up early in the morning and wash yourself properly. Soap oil is given for you and you have to use it properly. If you don't maintain cleanliness, your health will deteriorate and the health of the people around you will also deteriorate.

You should go to work every day and collect the money earned from your work in the center and show your future in the future and give that money to your wife and children at home. Your health will deteriorate and you will become unfathomable in society.

If you want to change your mood, you can come and sleep in the center, not in front of the shops or in the huts, but after your work you should come and sleep in the rest shelter.

If there is any change in your health, you should immediately inform us and get free treatment. Such issues will be discussed in the meeting. This report will be submitted to the City Corporation every month.



Staff Meeting

Every month the staff meeting is conducted by the director of Sri Anandraj margadarshi night shelter. In this meeting... the entire shelter staff is present; the topics are discussed every month.

- Rapid survey should be done twice in a month without fail.
- All the refugees who have come to the center should be given proper accommodation and other basic facilities should be provided to them.
- All those who come to the center should have their photographs taken and their names should be recorded
- Everyone should have a full dinner.
- The office should be properly kept clean.
- The office should function 24 hours a day.
- All refugees who come to the center should be counseled and proper information about this should be submitted to the office.
- Care should be taken to ensure that there is no disturbance in the centre.
- Visit the home of the refugees and talk to the parents of the refugees and try to solve the problems

Responsibilities of Staff

1. Every refugee citizen who arrives at the shelter will be subjected to personal counseling.
2. Office Assistant. To ensure that all the arrangements in the center are in order and to provide proper facilities to the refugees who have arrived at the center and to submit proper information about this to the City Corporation office.
3. Care taker of 3 people. It is their duty and responsibility to keep an eye on the shelter and the refugees during their working hours and to ensure that there is no trouble in the shelter.
4. Conducting Rapid Survey every month.
5. Attend without fail when requested to participate in meetings on behalf of departments on any occasion.

Filter Water

Clean drinking water is as important to humans as clean air, so clean drinking water facilities are provided daily, and water is provided for everyone to bathe.



Everyone is provided with couch beds and blankets, a pillow to sleep on, and they are washed with clean water every month.



3. Individual locker arrangement

Lockers have been arranged for all the homeless citizens who come to the shelter to keep their belongings, because the homeless citizens who come to the shelter have left their homes from different towns, districts, states, because of problems in their homes, some of them are stealing other people's belongings, so that no one's belongings can be stolen. Each locker is arranged for each.

3.Toilet:

Toilets are arranged for all the homeless citizens who come to the hostel. No one should go outside for toilet and defecating is illegal according to law. Moreover, defecating causes many diseases. Therefore, toilets in the hostel should be properly used and kept clean.

4. Daily Newspaper :-

Daily newspaper will be brought to know the news of every day so that even the refugee citizens will be helped to read and know about the happenings in the country.



5. Identity card

Every refugee arriving at the shelter is given an identity card by the Guideline Night Homelessness Center, some refugee citizens arrive late at night after finishing work and then on the road.

On arrival, they will be harassed by the police department, so for their convenience, they will be given an identity card with the address of the hostel and will be informed that it should not be used for any other bad purpose.

2. Oil, Soap :-

Refugee citizens will be given free oil, bath soap and laundry soap every month

6. Groceries

Every month head oil, Coalgate powder, bath soap, cloth soap, mosquito repellent, pineoil harppic nirma powder, other basic items will be purchased.

7. First aid box :-

If the refugee citizens have any health problems or minor injuries on their bodies, they will be given first aid and medicines related to treatment will be purchased once a month.



8. TV entertainment

For the entertainment of the homeless citizens coming to the hostel, TV and D2Hare arranged with more facilities.





Meals


Refugees who come to the center during the day will be given a full free meal at night.



All the homeless citizens who come to the shelter will undergo intimate counseling, many people will leave their homes and sleep in front of shops in temples on the main streets of the city due to problems like alcoholism, mental illness, debtors, husband and wife quarrels. They fall prey to mental illness due to some problems. Sometimes, even with relatives, they roam around as refugees. It is known from this close consultation that most of them have left home due to the quarrel between their husbands and wives and have become victims of drunkenness.

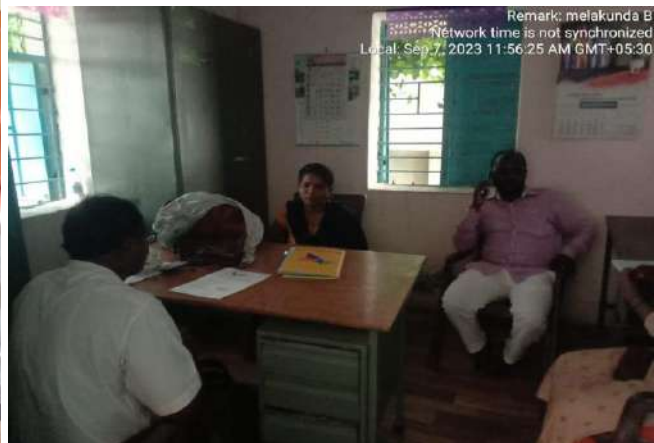

of child will run away, In adolescent meeting sir said that we should give them good and proper knowledge, so that they don't attracted towards love and Affection and get rid of negative thoughts about love and affection, there are some social worker like example mother Teresa is a good inspiration for adolescent children.

We went first village Kalnur and met Adolescent Girl: Shilpa she had health Problem regarding Monthly period not having so we have given the treatment our Community organizer Mallamma was handled at Kalagnoor on DATE: 28.08.2023

Our organizer visited to kalagnoor village with Margadarshi society and APF program manager Snju kulkarni and Mahadevappa Mulge the Dist in-charge and the Director of Margadarshi society Mr.AnandRaj Sir and the Co-coordinators. Welcomed by adolescent girl Shilpa and their family. Adolescent girl Shipa who was having monthly period problem and she was also short in height and our community organizer she make daily visit and make her to understand don't live your school because of your height and from one month she was not going to school so our community organizer suggest and try to make convinced to go to school.

Problems sharing

In the By monthly meeting our community organizer informed about the Health checkup camp so she attained the health check camp after that adolescent girl explained about her of Monthly period problem. This problem she was facing from many months she didn't informed or share her problem in her family members, so after attending health checkup camp she got solution to this problem from our health checkup camp and it useful to her, after that she share about her problems to her family members also about the health checkup then come to know her sister are also suffering from the same problems. Then adolescent inform to our organizer community about her sisters problems, after that they taken to health checkup camp they have given treatment she also got well to their problems.

Child marriage has been prevented in some villages by conducting child marriage awareness program in village there will be financially poor they will conduct the child marriage and children's they don't have interest in studies because they know they are financially poor so they agree to their parents to get married but there are some Children they like to go to school.

By doing child marriage there will be get health issue they get sick due to child marriage and child also born with discomfort and also both mother and child are also get sick and during children birth two are in a positions lose their lives and the situation arrives where one of the two remains and child marriage deprives children of education. At the young age they are burdened with the responsibility of housework. They don't have that age to work and take all the responsibilities. So we have to prevent child marriage by knowing and trying to prevent it from happening around us.

On 17.10.2023, a district level consultation program on children's rights was held at Shri Lakshmitaiduruga Memorial Hospital, Kalaburagi in association with UNICEF, Karnataka Children's Rights Monitoring and Guidance Organization, Kalaburagi. The program was started by lighting the lamp. Dr. Nilesar inaugurated the program and Dr. Channaveer took over as the president of the program. The chief guests were Suresha, Dr. Lakshmi, Mr. Ananda Rajasar, director of the guidance organization, children from about 6 villages in Kayakram were present and 48 children participated

Two children who participated in this discussion were selected to be sent to the Children's Rights Council in Bangalore.

CASE STUDY:

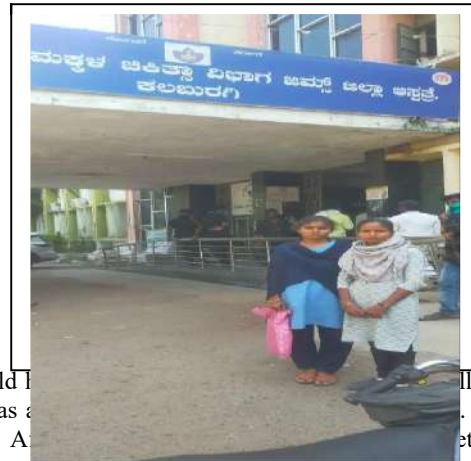
Done by Rathna : D/o mahadevappa r/o Nadenennara , (18 F) grama used to study in II PUC.

She could not go to school everyday. I used to visit their home everytime I visited the grama, however, nobody used to be home.

All of her family members used to be busy out with their work, because of which she could not go to school.

Her family was poor She could not go to school because she had to go to work along with her family members. She was not aware that the I PUC examinations were going on because of which she faced difficulties.

Being a wellwisher and a member of the community, I explained to her and told her directly. When enquired about the name of her college she told me that she was at Phartabad college and she visited the college on 30/10/2023 and brought the TC along with us. After that we got an admission at the Phartabad college. When called upon the principle they asked us to bring the girl to the college 31/10/2023. We took the girl to the college at Phartabad where she gave all the information to the principal. When the principal learned that she has been at home since an year, they asked us to enroll her in the college which was completed. The principal, the girl and her family thanked me and margadarshi organization for the help.

Margadarshi Society was set up to protect and promote children's rights in the Kalaburagi district of Karnataka, which is considered to be among the most backward regions in the state. 25% of the district's population belongs to Scheduled Castes. The organization works with runaway, Child Marriage, Childlabour, & abused Dalit children from the ages of 0-18 years via rescue and rehabilitation, and in the allied themes of education, malnutrition and disability.

Lived Experience and Inclusive Leadership

Margadarshi was founded and is run by Anandraj D Tavardar, a Dalit Christian who witnessed firsthand the discrimination that Dalit children face. The Board of the organization has ~30% women and ~30% Scheduled Caste members. The institutional leadership has 20% women, and 20% Scheduled Caste members.

Program Overview

Issues

Dalit children experiencing poor economic conditions, and neglect by parents due to migration, addiction and other causes often end up running away from home and becoming vulnerable to exploitation. Gender, caste based discrimination, lack of opportunity and public infrastructure all contribute to this.

Socio-economic: Seasonal agriculture and few livelihood options; poor school infrastructure and last mile delivery of health services; and high incidence of child marriage

Political and institutional: Low participation in local governance due to exclusion by upper castes; poor implementation of existing schemes

Geographical: High migration out of the district due to poor agriculture and low rainfall, leading to children feeling neglected

Agency and awareness: Minimal awareness of available schemes

Approach to work with communities

Margadarshi aims to create a child-friendly society where all children are free from abuse and exploitation. With staff primarily from the communities, they regularly run detailed surveys, and engage with diverse stakeholders at the district, Panchayat and community level to understand evolving needs of the children.

- 2 Identify and rescue missing children via the CHILDLINE helpline
- 3 Provide shelter, medical assistance, emotional counselling, and scholarships to rescued children
- 4 Minimize school dropouts by improving education quality and running bridge programs
- 5 Enable proper functioning of child protection committees
- 6 Enable community based rehabilitation of people with disability

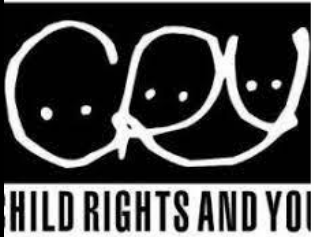

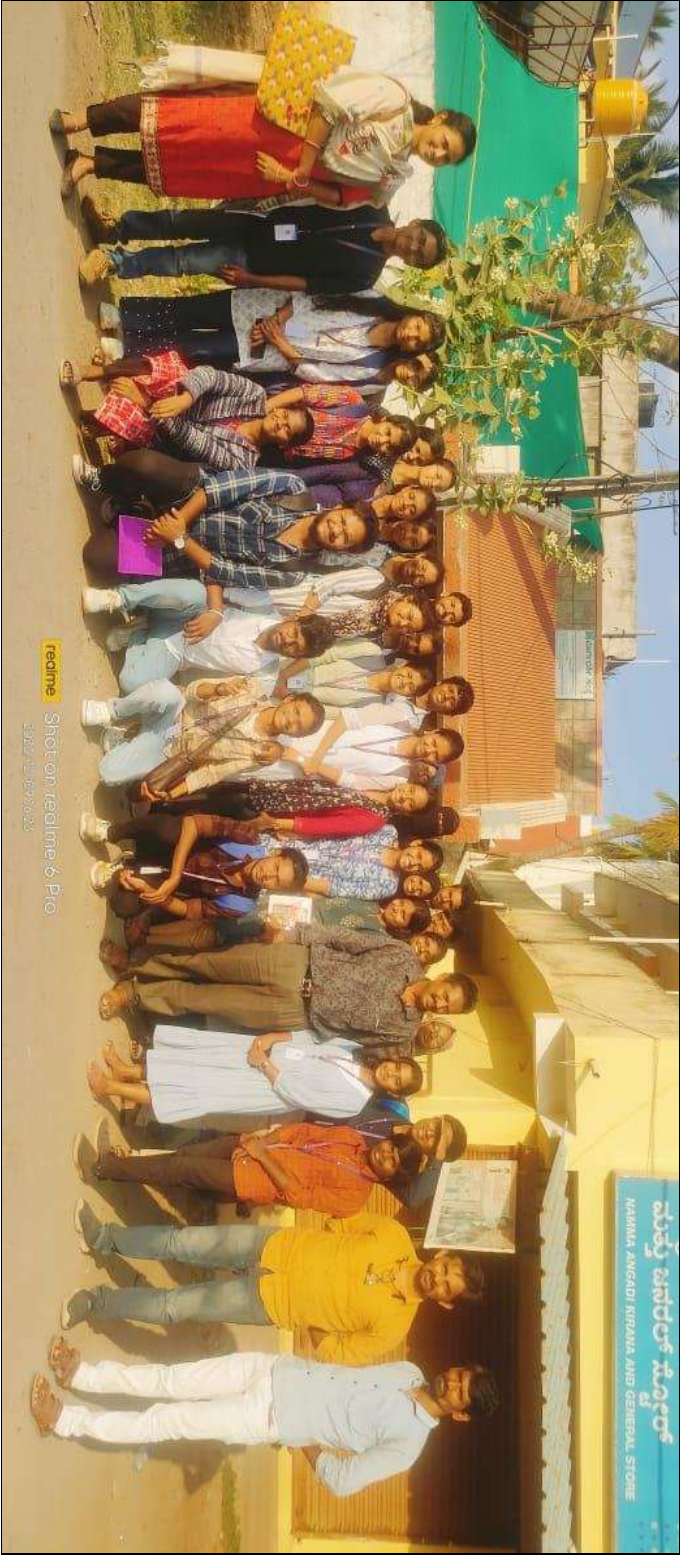
