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At a Glance Summary



Prabha Bharti, has made significant strides in 2023-24, continuing its commitment to empowering marginalized communities, with a focus on women, children, and the elderly. The organization's comprehensive approach to healthcare, social welfare, and community development has positively impacted the lives of vulnerable individuals.

Over the past two decades, Prabha Bharti has championed sustainable agriculture and livelihood initiatives, reaching over 500 women farmers who are improving their household and economic stability through sustainable farming practices. The organization has also provided extensive care to 20 elderly individuals, offering housing, medical support, nutritious food, and emotional well-being programs like yoga and social activities to improve their quality of life.

The notable progress in its health interventions could be seen, especially through its collaboration with the Jharkhand AIDS Control Organization (JSACS). The organization served over 850 Female Sex Workers (FSWs) in Koderma and Dumka, providing crucial health services, including ICTC testing, STI treatments, and HIV/AIDS prevention outreach.

The organization also conducted community health camps and distributed nutritional supplements to children in rural areas in partnership with Vitamin Angels.

The empowerment of women has remained a priority, with Prabha Bharti hosting a two-day capacity-building training for 40 women in December 2023, focusing on decision-making, leadership, and financial inclusion. These efforts have supported the creation of local leadership structures, enabling women to take charge of their financial independence and community development.

At Swadhar Greh, a shelter for vulnerable women, 89 beneficiaries were enrolled during 2022-2023, with 73 women successfully reintegrated into society through counseling or self-employment initiatives. The shelter offers training in beauty skills, sewing, and other practical skills, as well as organizing community-building activities such as tree plantations and Women's Day celebrations.

Overall, Prabha Bharti's work in 2023-24 has fostered health, empowerment, and social change, impacting thousands of lives in Jharkhand and continuing to make a lasting difference in the lives of the marginalized.



About Prabha Bharti

Prabha Bharti is a nonprofit organization dedicated to serve the unserved communities within Jharkhand. The name “**Prabha Bharti**” is derived from Sanskrit, where **Prabha** signifies “*the brightness of light,*” and **Bharti** refers to “*Goddess Saraswati*”, symbolizing “*knowledge and learning*”. Together, these words represent the organization’s commitment to continuous learning and the sharing of experiences, illuminating the path to holistic progress for rural communities—especially for women, children, and marginalized groups.

Prabha Bharti was formally registered on *June 13, 2001*, under the Societies Registration Act. 1860 and holds the *Registration Number 127/2001*.

As a women-centered voluntary organization, Prabha Bharti has been active in promoting the well-being of women and children, women’s empowerment, health, and sustainable management of natural resources since its inception.

Through a rights-based approach, the organization addresses various forms of discrimination and prejudice faced by women, particularly in rural areas. Recognizing the challenges and hardships faced by mothers and girls, Prabha Bharti is committed to organizing women’s movements and fostering solidarity through women’s networks.

Highlights



Transformation through Sustainable Livelihood Support

For over two decades, we have empowered diverse communities in their journey toward inclusion, achieving meaningful impacts across Health, Education, Agriculture, and Livelihoods. Since 2007, we have championed sustainable agriculture and livelihood initiatives, working closely with a robust network of farmers—primarily women—who cultivate crops to support both their households and economic stability. Today, our network encompasses 500 families and 500 women farmers dedicated to sustainable agricultural practices.

Our approach centers on organic farming, supported by community-led Seed Banking, which preserves seeds for long-term use, and Grain Banking, which relies on traditional methods to securely store grains. Integrated farming practices, such as goat and cattle rearing, contribute to soil fertility, utilizing goat manure, cow dung, and vermicompost to naturally enrich the soil and boost crop yields. Additionally, we have established wells within farming communities, improving irrigation access and replenishing groundwater during the rainy season.

These sustainable methods foster nutritious food production while advancing long-term health and environmental resilience, ensuring a thriving ecosystem for generations to come.





Mission "Samarthya" an initiative towards making women Empowered



Under the umbrella of Mission Shakti, an initiative by the central government to empower women, **Swadhar Greh** serves as a vital shelter home for many women in society who lack a safe place to call home and struggle to secure two meals a day. This initiative aims to provide refuge for vulnerable women while promoting self-reliance and empowerment.

Objectives of Swadhar Greh:

- To offer shelter, food, clothing, and medical assistance to destitute women.
- To foster emotional intelligence and resilience.
- To equip women with skills necessary for leading dignified lives.
- To inspire and empower women to live with self-respect and determination.

From 2020 to March 2024, over 250 women fighting for survival have found solace and support at Swadhar Greh. It is not merely a shelter; it has evolved into a vibrant community where women, adolescent girls, and young women coexist in a spirit of prosperity and unity.

To cultivate their skills, we provide training in areas such as beauty therapy, sewing, painting, and decoration. Additionally, we organize community activities like tree planting, Women's Day celebrations, and kitchen gardening, fostering connections among residents and their broader community. Significant occasions such as International Women's Day, Republic Day, Dussehra, Diwali, Chhath Puja, and New Year are celebrated together, promoting a sense of belonging and solidarity.

By addressing the daily needs of the women residing in Swadhar Greh, we empower them to become emotionally resilient and economically independent, allowing them to reclaim their dignity and earn respect in society. Through Mission "Samarthya," we are dedicated to creating a supportive environment where women can thrive and achieve their fullest potential.



Empowering Adolescents

In collaboration with DALSA, Prabha Bharti initiated a campaign from March 2023 to November 2023 aimed at empowering adolescents by fostering awareness of societal values and encouraging active citizenship. Recognizing the critical need for societal awareness among youth, we believe that education is key to eradicating harmful practices that affect adolescents.



The objectives of the campaign include:

- Reducing and bridging the educational gap among adolescents.
- Addressing the negative consequences of disconnection from education.
- Motivating and inspiring youth towards a dignified and responsible life.

This initiative was implemented at the school level, focusing on students preparing to pursue higher education after completing their schooling. The awareness program reached over 15 schools in the Deoghar district, with support from school administrations, school management committees, and the DALSA Secretary (Deoghar).

With the goal of equipping the next generation with knowledge about societal practices, rights, and responsibilities, we aspire to cultivate value-driven citizens. We hope that such initiatives will continue to inspire students to lead prosperous lives filled with dignity.



Support for the Elderly



In the year 2023-24, Prabha Bharti provided dedicated care and support to 20 elderly individuals, including those who were destitute, orphaned, or abandoned by their families. This initiative was aimed at creating a safe, nurturing environment for both men and women in need.

Each elder received comprehensive home care, including safe housing and essential resources like clothing and nutritious meals.

Health and well-being were prioritized through regular check-ups, high-quality medical support, and nutritious food tailored to meet their needs. To promote a healthy lifestyle, daily exercise and yoga sessions were organized, encouraging physical activity and mental relaxation. Furthermore, outings to pilgrimage sites were arranged, allowing them to connect with their spiritual beliefs and find solace.

Addressing the emotional well-being of the elderly was a key focus. Volunteers and caregivers spent time with them daily, engaging in meaningful conversations to understand their feelings and combat loneliness. Entertainment, such as TV and music sessions with worship and bhajans, were also provided to lift their spirits. Social interaction was encouraged through the introduction to new people, fostering a supportive community environment.

Prabha Bharti also assisted the elders in accessing government pensions and other support schemes, ensuring their financial needs were met. This holistic approach combined physical, emotional, and social support, offering the elderly a dignified, comfortable, and compassionate living environment. The organization's commitment to the elderly's well-being embodies its mission to serve marginalized communities with respect and care.



Stepping into Equity: Empowering Women

"Equity and Empowerment", a total of 40 women participated, motivated by the opportunity to enhance their skills, strengthen their financial independence, and foster a sense of leadership within the group.

Prabha Bharti organized a two-day capacity-building session in December on 16-17, 2023, at Ranidih Panchayat Bhawan, Karon Block.

This program aimed to equip women with-

- Skills through targeted training,
- Enabling them to become financially resilient and
- Actively included in community development.



Key objectives included

- Inspiring women to take on decision-making roles,
- Encouraging participation in leadership, and
- Supporting them in setting up sustainable, income-generating activities.

Throughout the session, they formed a cohesive group and set guidelines to foster unity and mutual growth. Demonstrating leadership and commitment, they elected a group leader who will guide their efforts in pursuing the goals established during the session. Together, they outlined concrete actions, such as opening a group bank account to manage collective funds, promoting agricultural activities to boost local food security, and exploring crafting and other skills to create additional income streams. These steps represent their resolve to achieve financial independence and play an active role in their communities.

This capacity-building program not only empowered the participants but also instilled a strong sense of unity and purpose, encouraging them to become decision-makers and role models within their community.



Health Camp & Check-ups



We envision a society free from disease, where health and wellness are accessible to all, particularly among disadvantaged groups in Jharkhand. As a leading health facilitator, we recognize the crucial role of health camps in promoting community well-being and ensuring safety for those in need.

Community health is a priority for us, and to fulfill this goal, we regularly conduct health check-up camps in the communities we serve.

Additionally, we hold an annual health camp to reach as many people as possible. In FY 2023-24, the annual health camp took place on December 29, 2023, in Fulwariya Village, Domchanch—a vulnerable area with high healthcare needs.

The camp offered screenings and check-ups for common illnesses and conditions, including cold, fever, typhoid, cholera, flu, malaria, HIV/AIDS, wounds, and other specific needs. A total of 90 individuals benefited from these services, receiving comprehensive health check-ups and necessary medications. The camp also provided medicines for cold, cough, fever, and sexually transmitted infections (STIs), along with condoms to help prevent the spread of HIV/AIDS.

A notable outcome of this camp was identifying three women with STIs that could potentially lead to HIV/AIDS. Our counselor provided guidance and encouraged them to seek further treatment at our Koderma office, also supplying them with an STI treatment kit.

Through these health camps, we aim to not only improve immediate health outcomes but also foster long-term wellness in the community by offering medical support, preventative measures, and essential healthcare resources.



Youth Festival 2023



The Youth Festival 2023, an initiative by the Jharkhand State AIDS Control Committee, aimed to raise HIV/AIDS awareness among youth. As part of this effort, a marathon race was organized under the supervision of Prabha Bharti (NGO) and the District Health Committee, Koderma. The race spanned approximately 5 km, starting at Maharana Pratap Chowk and concluding at JJ College Koderma, with 200 enthusiastic participants.

Key figures, including the Civil Surgeon of Sadar Hospital, Koderma, the District Tuberculosis Officer and District Nodal Officer of ICTC Koderma, the Deputy Superintendent, and the Nodal Officer ART from ICTC Sadar Hospital, Koderma, along with Prabha Bharti staff, attended to support and cheer on the participants.

The event provided an important platform for educating youth on HIV/AIDS causes, prevention methods, and debunking misconceptions. Participants learned that HIV is not only sexually transmitted but can also spread through infected syringes, transfusions of contaminated blood, shared razors at barbershops, and from mother to child during pregnancy. They were encouraged to understand these risks to help those affected by HIV and combat stigma.

At the end of the marathon, winners were awarded appreciation cheques, motivating them to continue contributing to community welfare. This festival emphasized not only physical activity but also community health education, fostering a spirit of responsibility among youth to become advocates for wellness and informed decision-making.





Celebration of Women's Day

International Women's Day holds great significance as a global celebration of women's achievements, resilience, and contributions across all sectors of society. It serves as a call to action for gender equality, urging communities to recognize and promote the role of women in shaping a fair and inclusive world.

In honor of this day, Prabha Bharti organized a meaningful event at its Swadhar Greh, bringing together women, men, and community leaders to inspire collective action for women's welfare and advancement.



The celebration focused on encouraging both women and men to stand together, advocate for women's rights, and foster an environment where women are active in decision-making, stand against social injustices, and challenge harmful practices.

Led by the Deoghar Women Police In-Charge, this event featured guest speakers from various influential backgrounds, including representatives from Chetna Vikas (an NGO in Deoghar), a lawyer from the Deoghar Civil Court, and other community advocates.

They addressed the audience on critical topics such as fundamental rights, social values, and humanitarian responsibilities that contribute to building a safe, inclusive society for all. The speakers emphasized the importance of legal awareness, community support, and shared responsibility in creating a society where women can thrive free from oppression.

Through this gathering, Prabha Bharti reaffirmed its commitment to empowering women and inspiring the community to collaborate towards a future where gender equality and safety are paramount. This International Women's Day celebration served as both a reflection on progress and a call to action, strengthening the collective resolve to build a society where women are valued, respected, and empowered.



Safeguarding Child Health and Nutrition



On January 27, 2024, Prabha Bharti organized a Vitamin Angels jointly initiated Vitamin Angels program across Budhai, Pandeydih, and Belkukarha villages in Devipur Block, conducting an extensive door-to-door survey of 600 households. This outreach engaged over 400 parents, educating them on the critical importance of child health and nutrition.

Program Director Pranu Singh emphasized the need for a balanced, nutritious diet for children. Singh highlighted that in rural areas, children often consume a repetitive diet, like Maad-Bhat, multiple times daily, which can lead to inadequate nutrition and health issues, including gut blockage, physical and mental weaknesses, and anemia. Parents were advised on the importance of feeding children three balanced meals a day, including foods like rice, lentils, green vegetables, eggs, chapatti, fruits, and other nutrient-rich items to support overall growth and development.

The program also educated parents on the benefits of Vitamin Angels' supplements. Parents learned that vitamin A supplements can reduce mortality rates by 24% among children under five. Children aged 6 to 11 months were given blue supplements, while those aged 1 to 5 years received red supplements. Additionally, Albendazole doses of 200 mg for ages 1-2 years and 400 mg for ages 2-5 years were recommended to support intestinal health.

After the training, a survey assessed the children's daily diets, and fresh fruits were distributed to reinforce healthy eating habits. Before concluding, parents were encouraged to regularly obtain vitamin A supplements and Albendazole from their nearest health centers. The session ended with a note of gratitude to all participating parents, urging them to remain vigilant about their children's nutritional needs.



Targeted Intervention



The Targeted Intervention Project, funded and supported by the Jharkhand State AIDS Control Society (JSACS), Ranchi, addresses the needs of vulnerable groups at high risk for HIV/AIDS transmission, including transgender individuals, injecting drug users (IDUs), truck drivers, female sex workers (FSWs) and migrants.

Due to frequent contact and increased exposure, these groups face elevated risks of contracting and spreading HIV/AIDS, hence they are termed High-Risk Groups (HRG).

Through this initiative, JSACS, in collaboration with the National AIDS Control Organization (NACO), partners with NGOs to monitor, counsel, and provide essential precautionary resources for HRGs, encouraging safe practices for personal and societal well-being. The program includes a range of supportive health activities aimed at protecting and improving the lives of individuals within these vulnerable populations. Key interventions include:

- Regular Medical Check-ups (RMC)
- Counseling to identify challenges and provide preventive support
- ICTC Testing for early detection and intervention
- Community-Based Screening (CBS)
- Recreational Activities to promote well-being and community support

Prabha Bharti is actively engaged in supporting the FSW and Migrant groups and is currently providing services to 855 HRGs and 10000 Migrants in the district of Koderma, Jharkhand. This project ensures that HRGs receive critical health care, education, and resources needed to foster a healthier, safer community, ultimately aiming to reduce HIV/AIDS transmission rates and promote a life of dignity and security for these at-risk populations.



Monitoring and Evaluations

Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) is a crucial component of any program or project, enabling organizations to achieve the maximum expected results. We at [Organization Name] are committed to this principle, and our dedicated M&E team consistently stays informed about the various projects and programs we implement.

Our strategies for monitoring programs and projects include:

- Conducting regular **field observation visits** as outlined in project guidelines.
- Holding **weekly and monthly progress review meetings** to assess ongoing activities.
- Providing **counseling support** to beneficiaries to address their needs.
- Engaging in **counseling sessions with team members** to enhance effectiveness.
- Organizing **community mobilization** at the field level to foster team spirit and community involvement.
- Facilitating **hot-spot meetings** to address specific community concerns.
- **Advocating** for issues relevant to our target populations.
- Connecting beneficiaries to relevant **government schemes and services**.
- **Liaisoning with government institutions** to ensure alignment and support.
- Building strong **community relationships** to enhance program impact.
- Responding effectively to **crises** as they arise.
- Conducting **stakeholder meetings** to gather input and ensure collective engagement.

Through these strategies, we aim to continuously improve our programs and ensure they meet the needs of the communities we serve.



Activities under Monitoring and Evaluations

Field visits and observation



Field visits and observation are vital components of our project's monitoring and evaluation process. By visiting communities and observing firsthand, our team gains a deeper understanding of the challenges and needs of high-risk groups (HRGs) and community members. These visits allow us to assess the effectiveness of project activities, identify gaps, and tailor our interventions accordingly. Observations made during these visits provide insights into the day-to-day realities of our target groups, enhancing our ability to provide relevant support. This direct engagement fosters stronger relationships, builds trust within the community, and ensures our programs are impactful and responsive to actual needs.



Weekly and Monthly Review



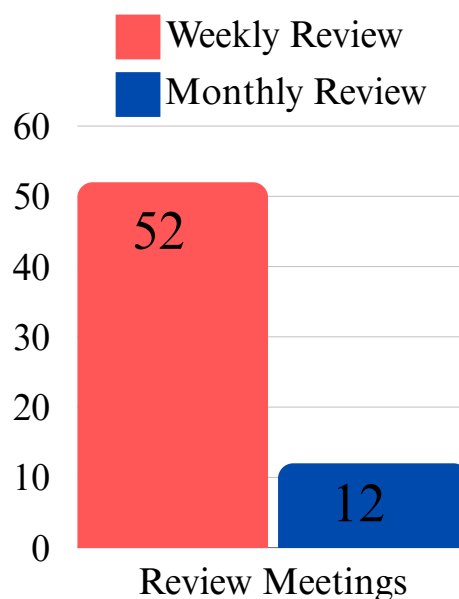
We conduct weekly and monthly review meetings to track project progress at the grassroots level. The purpose of these meetings is to monitor targets, achievements, and gaps in project activities and ensure that team members receive necessary support to meet project goals.

Key services under our targeted intervention (TI) projects include-

- ICTC testing.
- Syphilis screening.
- Condom distribution for high-risk groups (HRGs) and the broader community.
- TB, STI, and RMC testing etc.

The review meetings are essential for assessing TI components and revamping strategies as needed. They help in documenting activities, planning next steps, and identifying effective practices for improving service delivery. These meetings also support timely and accurate reporting for SOCH MIS at the central level, ensuring that progress and updates are recorded comprehensively.

Additionally, we discuss strategies to establish creative and self-sustaining HRGs groups within local hotspot areas, which fosters a supportive community environment. Overall, these meetings provide a structured platform for planning, collaboration, and documentation, helping us maintain clear focus and drive on achieving TI project outcomes.

Counselling of the Beneficiaries



Counseling for HRGs and community members is a key component of our monitoring process, offering valuable insights to steer the project effectively. Through counseling sessions with HRGs, we gather information on their daily activities and identify challenges they may be facing. Community-level counseling also allows us to understand the broader issues affecting the community.

This process is essential in building trust and fostering a supportive relationship between the counselor and the individual, enabling us to provide targeted support and solutions where needed.

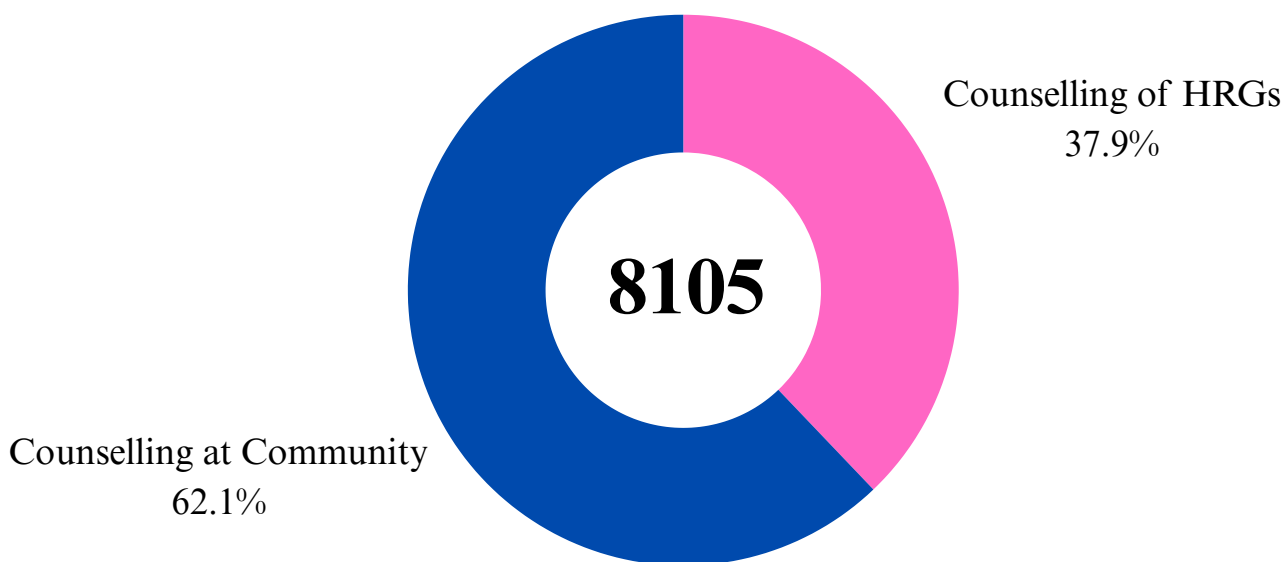


Chart of total No. of individual counselled



Community Mobilization



Our community mobilization and public awareness efforts are strategically tailored to suit our target groups. In 2023, we partnered with Lok Prabhatam from Nawada, Bihar—a youth group known for impactful street plays focused on social awareness—to conduct HIV/AIDS risk reduction campaigns among high-risk groups in Koderma District, particularly Female Sex Workers (FSWs).

The program aimed to increase understanding of HIV/AIDS by educating participants on causes, prevention strategies, and dispelling myths associated with the disease.

This initiative involved our project staff, local stakeholders, outreach centers, and peer educators, working collaboratively to provide crucial information on HIV/AIDS prevention. Peer educators, alongside the Nukkad Natak (street play) team, facilitated discussions, clarified doubts, and addressed common misconceptions regarding HIV/AIDS, STIs, and living with these conditions. This approach fostered active community participation, broke down stigmas, and created a more supportive, informed environment for all participants.

Beyond HIV/AIDS awareness, we also educate the public on their rights, access to social schemes, the importance of social equity, and the value of education. These awareness activities aim to empower community members with knowledge on a wide range of social issues, ensuring they are informed and able to advocate for their rights, ultimately fostering a stronger, more equitable society.

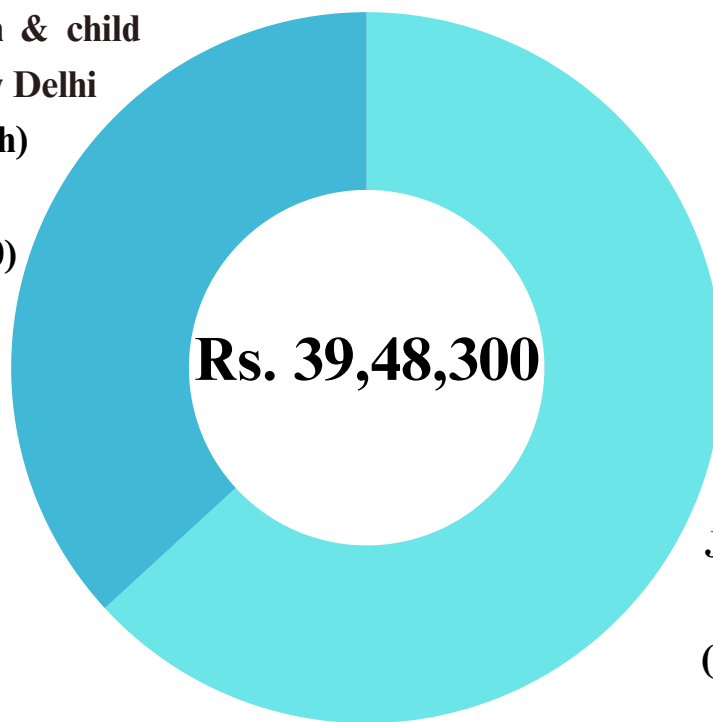




Currently, we are funded by the state government under the Targeted Intervention (TI) project for Female Sex Workers (FSWs) and Migrants, as well as for the Swadhar Greh initiative. The majority of our funding, 63.2%, comes from the JSACS-funded TI project, while the remaining 36.8% is contributed by the Swadhar Greh program.
