At a Glance Summary



Prabha Bharti made remarkable progress in 2024–25, reaffirming its long-standing commitment to empowering marginalized communities—particularly women, children, and the elderly. Through an integrated approach encompassing healthcare, social welfare, and community development, the organization has continued to uplift vulnerable groups and create pathways toward dignity and self-reliance.

Over the past two decades, Prabha Bharti has been a consistent advocate of sustainable agriculture and livelihood promotion, reaching more than 50 women farmers who are now enhancing their household income and economic resilience through eco-friendly and sustainable farming practices.

In the area of healthcare, Prabha Bharti achieved significant milestones, especially through its continued partnership with the Jharkhand State AIDS Control Society (JSACS). During the year, the organization reached over 1,300 Female Sex Workers (FSWs) across Koderma and Dumka districts, providing essential health services such as ICTC testing, STI treatment, HIV/AIDS prevention, and awareness outreach. Complementing these efforts, community health camps were organized, and nutritional supplements were distributed to children in rural areas in collaboration with Vitamin Angels.

Empowering women remained at the heart of Prabha Bharti's mission. In July 2024, the organization organized a two-day capacity-building workshop for 50 women, focusing on leadership development, decision-making, and financial inclusion. This initiative fostered the emergence of local women leaders, equipping them to take active roles in promoting economic independence and community-led development.

Overall, the year 2024–25 marked a period of growth, empowerment, and positive transformation for Prabha Bharti. Through its sustained interventions in health, livelihoods, and women's empowerment, the organization continues to bring meaningful change to thousands of lives across Jharkhand—building a foundation for a more equitable and inclusive future.





About Prabha Bharti

Prabha Bharti is a nonprofit organization dedicated to serve the unserved communities within Jharkhand. The name “**Prabha Bharti**” is derived from Sanskrit, where **Prabha** signifies “*the brightness of light,*” and **Bharti** refers to “*Goddess Saraswati*”, symbolizing “*knowledge and learning*”. Together, these words represent the organization’s commitment to continuous learning and the sharing of experiences, illuminating the path to holistic progress for rural communities—especially for women, children, and marginalized groups.

Prabha Bharti was formally registered on *June 13, 2001*, under the Societies Registration Act. 1860 and holds the *Registration Number 127/2001*.

As a women-centered voluntary organization, Prabha Bharti has been active in promoting the well-being of women and children, women’s empowerment, health, and sustainable management of natural resources since its inception.

Through a rights-based approach, the organization addresses various forms of discrimination and prejudice faced by women, particularly in rural areas. Recognizing the challenges and hardships faced by mothers and girls, Prabha Bharti is committed to organizing women’s movements and fostering solidarity through women’s networks.

Highlights



Childhood and Adolescent Development

- **Awareness on Mental Health**

Prabha Bharti undertook a vital initiative in Budhai village, Deoghar district, focusing on promoting mental well-being among children and youth. Recognizing that early emotional support is key to building resilience and confidence, the organization conducted door-to-door counselling sessions with 50 children below 15 years of age. The initiative aimed to understand their emotions, assess physical health, and provide continuous psychological support. Through regular counselling, children became more active, aware, and emotionally balanced. The sessions fostered self-expression and helped them develop healthy coping mechanisms. Remarkably, 30 children showed significant improvement in overcoming stress, anxiety, financial insecurity, and health-related issues, while 20 others experienced enhanced emotional stability and strengthened family relationships. This intervention not only improved individual mental health but also contributed to creating a nurturing and supportive environment within families—reflecting Prabha Bharti's commitment to nurturing a healthier, happier, and emotionally resilient generation.

Adolescent Capacity Development Program

Prabha Bharti, a women-led organization, has been actively working for the welfare and development of girls and adolescents since its inception. In collaboration with the District Legal Services Authority (DLSA) and Quest Alliance, the organization implemented an Adolescent Capacity Development Program from August 2024 to April 2025 across eight grassroots-level villages in Sarwa block, Deoghar district. The program began with 600 adolescents (both boys and girls) and successfully expanded its reach to over 20 schools, engaging a total of 900 students.

The primary objective of this initiative was to enhance adolescents' overall capacity, promote awareness to move beyond traditional social structures, reduce gender inequality, improve literacy rates, encourage healthy lifestyles, and bring positive behavioral change. The program aimed to empower adolescents to become active, self-reliant citizens leading dignified lives and pursuing higher education. As a result, through regular sessions and various engaging activities, significant positive changes were observed among 350 youth, marking a meaningful step toward their holistic growth and empowerment.



Highlights



• **Vitamin Angels (Child Health and Nutrition Program)**

Prabha Bharti, in collaboration with Vitamin Angels, implemented a Child Health and Nutrition Program across five villages under Kushmaha Panchayat, Sarwa Block, Deoghar District. The initiative reached 125 households, engaging parents through a comprehensive survey that included reviewing MCP cards and assessing children's nutritional status and access to essential health services. The primary objective was to understand the nutritional and health conditions of malnourished children and ensure the regular supply of vital vitamins and nutrients.

Under the leadership of Secretary Pranu Singh, the program focused on supporting malnourished and underprivileged pregnant women and children, aiming to eliminate Vitamin A deficiency and enhance overall rural health. Free Vitamin A supplements and other essential nutrients were distributed to promote child well-being. Educational pamphlets on the “Tiranga Diet”—symbolizing saffron, white, and green foods—were also distributed, encouraging families to include diverse, locally available, and nutritious foods in daily meals.

During the campaign, Vitamin A doses were administered to 60 children (aged 9 months–5 years), while Albendazole tablets were provided to 40 children (aged 1–5 years) for deworming. Parents were also educated on the seven key steps for Vitamin A and Albendazole administration, along with hygiene and sanitation awareness.

Additionally, a training session was conducted at the Prabha Bharti office in Deoghar, led by Gaurav Chauhan from Vitamin Angels, to build the capacity of field workers. The session covered correct administration of Vitamin A, deworming, iron supplementation, nutrition, and effective program implementation strategies, strengthening the organization's efforts toward ensuring healthier childhoods in rural communities.



Highlights



- **Baal Mela**

With the objective of recognizing youth and their talents, Prabha Bharti organizes a Baal Mela every year. For the FY 2024-25, it was held at the Narangi Panchayat Bhawan in Sarwa Block, Deoghar District, bringing together 500 adolescents along with various stakeholders. During the event, participants were informed about the purpose of the program, which was primarily to unite children from rural areas, showcase their creativity and talents, and promote their social and emotional development. The initiative aimed to provide children with opportunities for mental and physical enjoyment, learning, and personal growth, while also fostering self-confidence, teamwork, and social skills. The Baal Mela served as a platform to encourage rural children to actively participate and enhance their talents.

To stimulate enthusiasm and engagement, the following activities were organized:

Musical Chair

Archery

Street Play (Nukkad Natak)

Singing Competition

Running Race

General Knowledge Competition

All participants were awarded participation certificates across these competitions, bringing great joy to the adolescents. The program concluded with a vote of thanks, celebrating the successful achievement of the program's objectives and the active participation of all children.



Highlights



• **Annual Sports Event**

Our belief is that if we truly want to bring change at the grassroots level, we must focus on the younger generation rather than solely on the older one. Guided by this vision, Prabha Bharti organizes an annual Sports Competition in its operational areas. For FY 2024–25, the event was held in Baijnathpur village, Sarwa Block, Deoghar District, as a one-day program. The main objectives of the event were to encourage children to stay physically and mentally active, promote teamwork, enhance their skills and abilities, build self-confidence and discipline, and develop a lasting interest in sports. A total of 150 children participated enthusiastically in the competition.

During the event, participants were sensitized about the importance of sports, highlighting that in today's rural context, many children are becoming increasingly disconnected from physical activities due to excessive use of digital devices. This disconnection has led to various health and emotional challenges, such as physical inactivity, poor eyesight, malnutrition, and stress. Considering these issues, the competition aimed to remind children that sports are an integral part of life, essential for maintaining physical fitness, managing weight, reducing stress, improving mental focus, developing leadership skills, setting goals, and fostering community participation and holistic growth.

The event featured a range of activities, including:

- 100-meter race
- Long jump
- High jump
- Kabaddi
- Football
- Cricket
- Badminton
- Kho-Kho
- Musical Chair
- General Knowledge Quiz
- Tug of War



Children who excelled in these activities were awarded prizes and certificates. The event concluded with a motivational message encouraging children to minimize their dependence on digital devices and to actively engage in sports and physical activities for their overall development and well-being.

Highlights



- **Parents and Teachers Meeting**



At Prabha Bharti, we strongly believe that parents play an equally important role in a child's overall development. Emphasizing this collaboration, Parents and Teachers Meetings (PTMs) were organized in 10 schools under Sarwa Block, with the participation of 200 parents and 50 teachers. The primary objective of these meetings was to create a platform for meaningful dialogue between parents and teachers to ensure a better future for students.

During the meetings, both parents and teachers were briefed on their vital roles in the holistic development and education of children. Discussions centered around key topics such as academic progress, parental feedback, addressing students' personal and educational challenges, improving academic performance, and fostering positive teacher-student relationships.

Parents were encouraged to stay informed about the school's initiatives and to actively support their children's learning at home, helping to improve both their performance and attitude toward education. Teachers were advised to conduct regular PTMs every month on a fixed date and time, allowing parents to remain updated on their child's progress. The teachers agreed to this suggestion and assured that monthly PTMs would be organized consistently moving forward.



Highlights

- **Promoting Health and Hygiene**



On October 15, 2024, Prabha Bharti organized a Handwashing Day event across five schools in Deoghar and Jasidih regions, with the participation of 500 students and teachers.

The primary objective of this initiative was to encourage adolescents to take active steps toward maintaining cleanliness and hygiene. The event centered around the 2024 global theme on the importance of hand hygiene, emphasizing that regular handwashing is one of the most effective ways to prevent the spread of infections. Participants were educated about the nine key steps of proper handwashing, such as washing hands regularly with soap and clean water for at least 20 seconds, cleaning between the fingers and under the nails to remove dirt and germs completely.

The session also highlighted the growing importance of personal hygiene, especially in the post-COVID-19 era, when hand hygiene has gained global recognition as a crucial health practice. Through engaging activities, all 500 students actively participated and practiced proper handwashing using soap and sanitizer provided during the event.

Participants were further motivated to adopt hand hygiene as a part of their daily routine, prevent the spread of germs, and protect their health. The program concluded with a hand hygiene pledge, where students committed to maintaining cleanliness and living a healthy, happy, and hygienic life.



Highlights



Agriculture and Women Empowerment

- **Celebration of International Women's Day 2025**

Under the banner of Prabha Bharti, the International Women's Day 2025 celebrations were successfully organized across three districts of Jharkhand — Deoghar, Dumka, and Koderma. A total of around 800 women, healthcare workers, and members from various departments enthusiastically participated in these events.

The program began with warm greetings extended to all women on the occasion of International Women's Day. The significance and purpose of this day were discussed in detail, emphasizing that March 8 is a day to honor women's achievements beyond national, ethnic, linguistic, cultural, economic, and political divisions.



On this occasion, several active and self-reliant women were invited to the stage and felicitated, inspiring others through their journeys of empowerment.

This year's theme, "Accelerate Action," signifies the urgent need to take faster and stronger steps toward ensuring women's rights and empowerment.

Throughout the program, various creative and interactive activities were conducted among the women participants. In addition, information was shared about the Targeted Intervention Program currently running in Dumka and Koderma districts with the support of the Jharkhand State AIDS Control Society (JSACS) for the past ten years. This initiative focuses on promoting women's health and awareness on key social and health issues.

During the concluding session, participants were reminded that in today's era, women must progress in every field through education, self-reliance, and awareness. They must break traditional stereotypes and become economically, physically, and mentally empowered, enabling them to live dignified and independent lives with confidence and security.

The program concluded with an inspiring message:

"The respect for women is the true measure of a society's progress. Behind every successful woman lies her hard work, struggle, and confidence. An empowered woman builds an empowered society — women are no less than anyone; they have the power to create history through their own strength."



Highlights



• **Empowerment of Women and Self-Help Groups (SHGs)**

Under the banner of Prabha Bharti, a two-day training workshop was organized in July 2024 at the Kushmaha Panchayat Bhavan in Sarwa Block. The workshop witnessed the active participation of 50 women from five nearby rural areas, along with 10 stakeholders.

The training was facilitated by Ms. Pranu Singh, Secretary of Prabha Bharti, who elaborated on the concept and objectives of Women's Empowerment and Self-Help Groups (SHGs). She explained that both are deeply interconnected — the ultimate goal being to empower women socially, economically, politically, and legally so they can make their own life decisions and actively participate in society. The focus of these groups is to help women become independent and socially empowered.

Ms. Singh highlighted that the main objectives behind forming SHGs are to make women financially self-reliant, encourage the habit of saving, and provide small loans to help them sustain their livelihoods or start small businesses. This initiative enables women to become self-dependent rather than relying on others.

She also emphasized the benefits of SHGs, explaining that these groups not only empower women economically but also strengthen them socially. They encourage women to participate in decision-making processes, build self-confidence, and inspire them to raise their voices on social issues.

In the concluding session of the training, five SHG groups were successfully formed, marking a significant achievement of the workshop. The participants collectively deposited their savings and took a pledge to remain self-reliant instead of depending on others.

The program concluded with a vote of thanks extended to all participants for their enthusiastic involvement and commitment toward women's empowerment.



Highlights



• **Training of Women Farmers for Livelihood Development**

A one-day training program for Women Farmer was organized in 2024–25 at the Kushmaha Panchayat Bhavan under Sarwa Block of Deoghar District aiming to enhance the livelihood opportunities. A total of 50 women farmers from five nearby villages — Bichgarha, Kushmaha, Baijnathpur, Sinharaydih, and Koridih — actively participated in the program.

The training began with a welcome song performed by the participating women farmers, followed by an exchange of flowers as a gesture of goodwill and unity.

The session was facilitated by Mr. Jitendra, a Master Trainer trained at the Krishi Vigyan Kendra (Agriculture Science Centre). He discussed in detail the main objective of the training — to enhance women's participation in agriculture and develop their skills and capabilities. He emphasized that the contribution of women farmers is crucial, as the agricultural situation in rural areas has become a matter of concern. The main reason, he explained, is the decreasing interest of farmers in agriculture, which has led to increasing unemployment and migration. As a result, people are gradually distancing themselves from farming, leading to negative consequences such as environmental degradation, barren land, and rising inflation.

Mr. Jitendra pointed out that, in the present time, more women than men are taking an active role in agriculture. Keeping this in mind, capacity-building training was conducted to strengthen women's involvement in sustainable farming. The participants were given hands-on training on the method of preparing vermicompost fertilizer, and its practical demonstration was conducted. He explained that vermicompost is extremely beneficial for farming as it enriches the soil and promotes healthy plant growth.

Additionally, participants were introduced to the concept of kitchen gardening, which involves growing plants, vegetables, and fruits in small spaces around the house using minimal water. The benefits of kitchen gardening were also shared, such as:

- Producing fresh and nutritious vegetables.
- Saving money on household expenses.
- Promoting physical activity and fitness.
- Contributing to a clean environment.
- Supporting mental well-being.
- Creating social and educational awareness within the community.

Seeds were distributed among the women farmers to encourage them to start their own kitchen gardens. The trainer also shared knowledge about modern agricultural techniques, sustainable livelihood practices, and marketing opportunities. He explained that alongside farming, women can pursue various income-generating activities such as horticulture, floriculture, watermelon cultivation, mushroom farming, fish farming, beekeeping, nursery development, silkworm production, and vermicomposting. Activities like fish farming in household ponds and organic farming practices were particularly encouraged.

Through these diverse activities, women farmers were made more aware and motivated about agriculture. As a result, five groups of women farmers were organized and formed during the session to achieve specific livelihood goals. The women collectively took an oath to fulfill their responsibilities and duties toward agriculture, the environment, and society.

The training program concluded with a vote of thanks extended to all participants for their enthusiastic participation and commitment to improving agricultural livelihoods.



Highlights



Old Age Care and Support

• Support for Elderly Persons

Prabha Bharti has been implementing a dedicated initiative titled “Support for Elderly Persons” in Deoghar District for the past five years, under the able guidance of Secretary Ms. Pranu Singh. The initiative aims to provide holistic care, support, and empowerment to elderly individuals, especially those who are destitute, single women, orphans, or abandoned. During the year 2024–25, the program reached 30 elderly beneficiaries, offering them comprehensive care and assistance. The approach included regular door-to-door visits, allowing the team to engage personally with each individual. These visits were primarily aimed at providing mental and emotional counseling, helping elderly persons cope with the challenges of aging and encouraging them to live with dignity, confidence, and positivity.

The services provided under this initiative were multi-faceted and tailored to address the specific needs of elderly persons. The program included:

- Door-to-door visits, ensuring that elderly persons felt comfortable, valued, and supported in their own homes.
- Home-based care, including the provision of nutritious meals to maintain their health and well-being.
- Assistance with daily activities, enabling elderly persons to carry out their routines with ease and independence.
- Counseling sessions to promote mental and emotional well-being, addressing loneliness, anxiety, and other age-related challenges.
- Encouragement to participate in social and community activities, helping them remain active, engaged, and socially connected.
- Recreational facilities, promoting joy, relaxation, and meaningful interaction among the elderly.
- Yoga and wellness sessions, aimed at maintaining both physical fitness and mental health.
- Linkage with government welfare schemes, ensuring that elderly individuals accessed all available benefits and entitlements.
- Free, regular, and high-quality medical check-ups, along with the provision of necessary medicines to safeguard their health.

Through these continuous and dedicated efforts, Prabha Bharti has successfully created a compassionate and supportive environment for elderly individuals. The program not only addresses their immediate needs but also promotes dignity, care, and respect, ensuring that they can lead a fulfilling and meaningful life in their later years.



Highlights



Targeted Intervention and Its Impact

• Targeted Intervention HIV/AIDS Program

Under the joint aegis of Prabha Bharti and the Jharkhand State AIDS Control Society (JSACS), a Targeted Intervention (TI) HIV/AIDS program has been successfully implemented in Dumka and Koderma Districts, Jharkhand. The program is effectively managed by the dedicated team at Prabha Bharti.

The initiative primarily focuses on improving the personal and social well-being of women from high-risk groups and actively encourages migrant populations to adopt safe practices and behaviors.



For the year 2024–25, the program carried out several goal-oriented activities, including:

- Providing free and regular medical check-ups.
- Offering counseling services to address emotional and psychological needs.
- Identifying and resolving health-related problems and concerns.
- Ensuring the availability of necessary medicines.
- Facilitating access to government hospitals and healthcare facilities.
- Conducting HIV testing through Integrated Counseling and Testing Centers (ICTC).
- Linking beneficiaries with government welfare schemes and support services.

In addition, the program promotes the recreational and social well-being of women from high-risk groups. The Drop-in Centers (DICs) at Prabha Bharti operational offices provide a safe space for women to engage in social and leisure activities, fostering a sense of community and support.

Overall, this Targeted Intervention program plays a crucial role in improving health outcomes, promoting safe practices, and enhancing the overall quality of life for high-risk and vulnerable women in the region.



Highlights



• **Community Awareness and Mobilization**

Community-level awareness workshops were organized in our working areas to prevent and control HIV/AIDS. The program featured street plays (nukkad natak) and engaged approximately 1,500 participants, including women, men, and members of the local community.

The key objectives of these workshops were to:

- Promote awareness about HIV/AIDS prevention.
- Dispel myths and misconceptions related to health.
- Enhance understanding of Targeted Intervention (TI) programs and provide accurate information about HIV/AIDS at the community level.

The workshops received active support from Project Directors, local stakeholders, outreach centers, co-teachers, and Health Department officials, who shared their knowledge and experiences. Their involvement helped raise awareness, challenge false beliefs, and foster positive changes in community attitudes toward HIV/AIDS.

Through the street play team, women from high-risk groups in Dumka and Koderma Districts were engaged and educated about:

- Their rights.
- The significance of social equality.
- Access to education and social welfare schemes.
- Overcoming stigma and low self-esteem.
- Addressing various social and behavioral issues.

Overall, the initiative successfully promoted community-level awareness, encouraged active participation, and contributed to positive shifts in social perspectives and attitudes toward HIV/AIDS

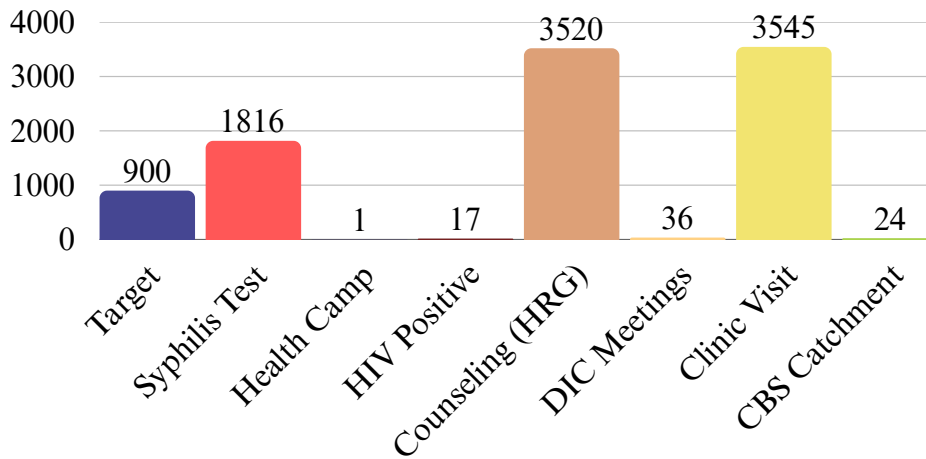

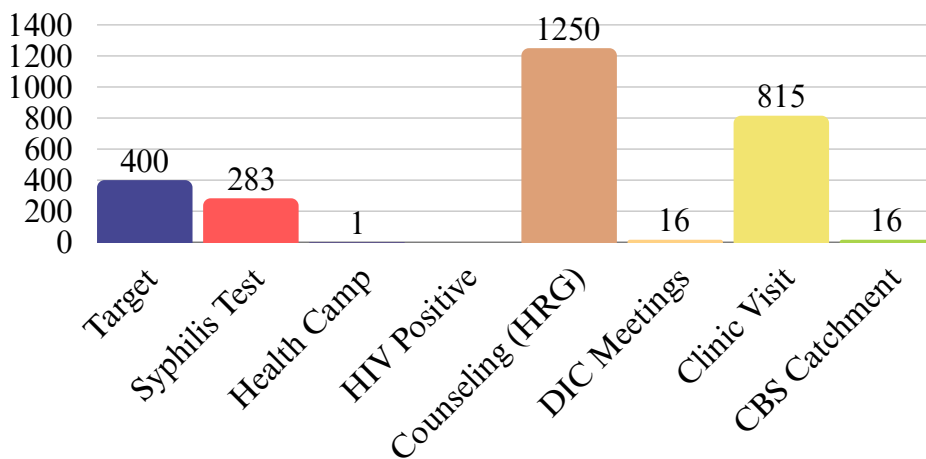

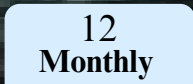
Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) is an essential element of every program and project, ensuring that organizations achieve optimal outcomes and maintain accountability. At Prabha Bharti, we uphold this principle through a committed M&E team that actively tracks and assesses the progress of all initiatives we implement.

Our monitoring strategies include conducting regular field observation visits as per project guidelines and organizing weekly and monthly review meetings to evaluate progress and performance. We provide counseling support to beneficiaries to address their concerns and hold team counseling sessions to strengthen coordination and effectiveness.

We also emphasize community mobilization to foster collective participation, conduct hot-spot meetings to address specific local issues, and advocate for the rights and needs of our target populations. Additionally, we link beneficiaries with government schemes, coordinate with institutions for support, build strong community relations, respond swiftly to crises, and convene stakeholder meetings for inclusive decision-making.

Through these practices, Prabha Bharti ensures that every program remains responsive, efficient, and impactful in addressing community needs.

- **Field visits and observation**



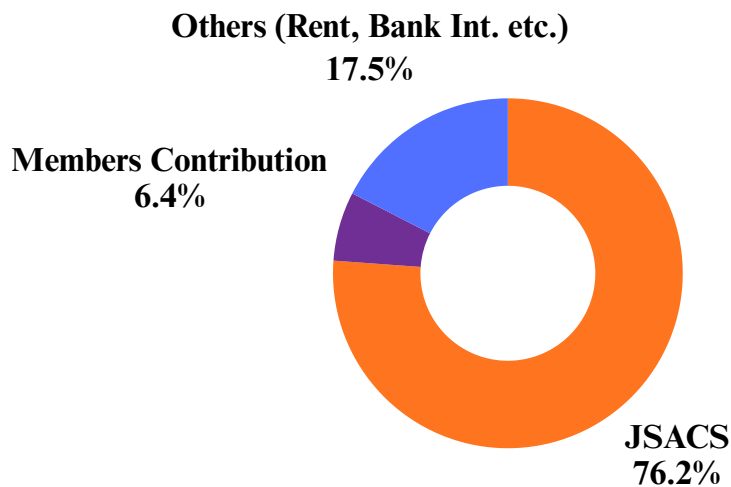
Field visits and observations form a crucial part of our project's monitoring and evaluation process. Through regular visits to the community, our team gains firsthand insights into the challenges, behaviors, and needs of high-risk groups (HRGs) and community members. These on-ground interactions help us evaluate the effectiveness of ongoing project activities, identify existing gaps, and design context-specific interventions that address real issues. Observing day-to-day situations enables us to understand the social and environmental factors influencing the community's wellbeing. Such direct engagement not only strengthens our understanding but also helps build mutual trust and accountability between the project team and the community. By maintaining close contact with beneficiaries, we ensure that our initiatives remain adaptive, inclusive, and responsive to actual needs, ultimately leading to greater program relevance, community ownership, and long-term impact.



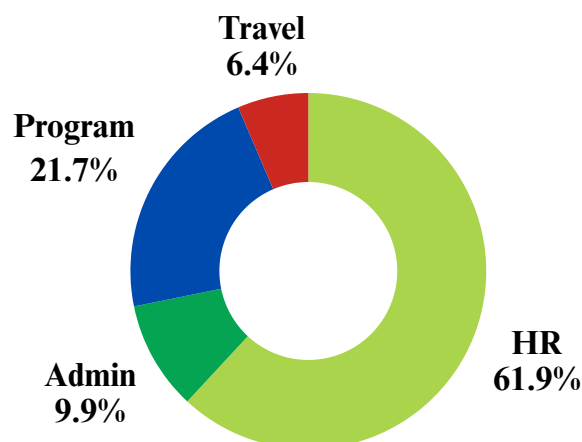
Annual Budget and Expenditure

We are funded by the State Government under the Targeted Intervention (TI) Project for Female Sex Workers (FSWs) and Migrants. A major portion of our funding — approximately (76.2 %) — comes from the JSACS-supported TI Project, while 6.4 % comes through members contribution and the remaining (17.5 %) is contributed through other programs implemented by our organization, bank interest and from member's contribution.
