Established in 2012, the Foundation has positively impacted over 10,000 individuals through focused initiatives in skill development, livelihood promotion, and digital literacy, bridging the gap between talent and opportunity.

Our work addresses key challenges such as unemployment, women’s economic dependence, and limited access to digital knowledge. Through vocational training, communication and entrepreneurship workshops, and community welfare programs, we equip individuals with practical skills that enhance employability, confidence, and self-reliance.

At Samarth Foundation, we believe true empowerment comes from enabling individuals to take charge of their own futures. Our inclusive and community-based approach ensures equal access to learning and growth opportunities for all.

With a strong grassroots presence and a commitment to sustainable development, we continue to strive towards building an equitable society where everyone has the opportunity to grow, succeed, and lead a dignified life.

Vision

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To empower unemployed and underprivileged youth across India by providing inclusive, industry-relevant skill training, bridging the gap between education, employment, and sustainable livelihoods.

Mission

Our mission is to provide accessible, high-quality, industry-aligned training that equips youth with practical skills for employment and sustainable livelihoods, while fostering confidence, entrepreneurship, and self-employment opportunities, enabling them to contribute effectively to economic growth and community development.

Presence

Samarth Foundation actively works across Tumkur district, covering 10 taluks. We support women aged 18–45, youth, rural and urban areas Youths skill development, education, and empowerment initiatives that promote inclusive growth and community development.

Annual Program Highlights

Program – 1 SMO Training (KSTIDC)

Under the Skill Development Program supported by the Ministry of Textiles – Scheme for Capacity Building in the Textile Sector, and in association with KSTIDC, Samarth Foundation trained 130 women aged 18–45 through six batches. The program focused on Sewing Machine Operator training, conducted daily from 10:00 AM to 4:30 PM. Most participants belonged to rural and backward communities across four taluks. In addition to tailoring skills, the program included Personality Development sessions and Entrepreneurship Development Program (EDP) training, enabling women to build confidence, enhance employability, and explore self-employment opportunities in the textile sector.

Program - 2 EDP program

Samarth Foundation organized an Entrepreneurship Development Program on 28-11-2025 at its office in Tumkur, in collaboration with Navya Disha. Around 70 aspiring entrepreneurs participated in the program. The initiative aimed to foster entrepreneurial mindset among youth and encourage them to start their own businesses. Participants received practical guidance on business planning, financial management, and market analysis. Navya Disha announced continued mentorship support for three years. The program also highlighted the Foundation's skill development efforts in promoting self-employment. The event concluded successfully with certificate distribution to all participants.

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Program – 3 4 days work shop

Samarth Foundation conducted the Infosys Springboard Livelihood Program, supported by Infosys and managed by Samhita, through a 4-day workshop focused on empowering careers with placement-linked skilling and retention. A total of 180 women participated in this initiative. The program included soft skills training, personality development, and job-readiness preparation to enhance employability. Participants were trained in various practical skills such as mehendi design, call handling basics, woolen work in different styles, and saree draping. The workshop combined both theoretical knowledge and hands-on practical sessions, ensuring comprehensive learning. This initiative helped women build confidence, improve skills, and explore livelihood and employment opportunities.

Program - 4 “□□□□□□ □□□ / Arivina Payana” Awareness Program

Samarth Foundation organized the “□□□□□□ □□□ (Arivina Payana)” awareness program at the Gram Panchayat level in Tumkur district on November 25. The program was conducted in Sirivara Gram Panchayat High School and College, as well as in Areyuru Panchayat and Siddaganga High School, with around 200 children participating.

The initiative focused on gender sensitivity (□□□□ □□□□□□□□), gender equality (□□□□ □□□□□□), importance of education (□□□□□□□ □□□□□), and personal hygiene and health (□□□□□□□ □□□□□ □□□□□□). Through interactive activities such as role plays, songs, and group discussions, students gained better awareness and understanding.

In this process, Bala Vikasa Samithi members, SDMC committee members, and the Gram Panchayat President actively participated and supported the program, strengthening community involvement. The program was successfully conducted, creating a meaningful impact on children’s awareness and overall development.

Other Activities in 2025- 2026

1. New Year & Sankranti Celebration

Samarth Foundation celebrated New Year and Sankranti Sambrama with enthusiastic participation from SMO (Sewing Machine Operator) students. The event aimed to promote cultural values and strengthen community bonding. Students actively organized and performed various cultural programs, showcasing their talents and creativity. All women participants took part with great interest and enthusiasm, making the celebration vibrant and memorable. The program created a joyful environment and encouraged teamwork and confidence among participants. At the end of the event, certificates were distributed to recognize their participation and efforts, making the celebration meaningful and encouraging for all.

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2. Netaji subhas Chandra Bose birth day celebration

Samarth Foundation, in collaboration with AIMSS, celebrated Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose Jayanti on 23/01/2026 at its office in Tumkur. The program began with floral tribute to Netaji, creating a patriotic atmosphere. Around 100 participants attended the event. The session highlighted Netaji's immense contribution to India's freedom struggle and his progressive vision for women's empowerment. Speakers emphasized his leadership in forming the Azad Hind Fauj and the historic Jhansi Rani Lakshmibai Women's Regiment under Captain Lakshmi Sehgal. The program inspired participants with values of courage, equality, and dedication, concluding successfully with active participation.

3. MSW Student Orientation Program

Samarth Foundation organized an Orientation Program for MSW (Master of Social Work) students on 06/10/2025 at its office in Tumkur. A total of 80 students from Government Tumkur University, accompanied by their lecturer Ms. Anusha, visited the organization as part of their academic exposure.

The objective of the program was to provide students with practical insights into the functioning of a Non-Governmental Organization (NGO). During the session, detailed discussions were held on the formation of NGOs, their roles and responsibilities, and the key functions they perform in addressing social issues. The program also highlighted the various challenges faced by NGOs, including funding constraints, community engagement, sustainability, and implementation of development programs.

The interactive session encouraged students to actively participate, ask questions, and share their perspectives. It helped bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and field-level understanding. Overall, the program was informative and engaging, offering valuable learning experience to the students and inspiring them towards social work and community development initiatives.

4. International Women's Day Celebration

On the occasion of International Women's Day, Samarth Foundation organized a meaningful celebration at Kannada Bhavana. A drama titled "*Bhava Byragi Akkamahadevi*" was performed, conveying a strong message on women's empowerment and social awareness. Around 350 people gathered to witness the event.

The program was inaugurated by the honorable Noor Unnisa Madam, Member Secretary, District Legal Services Authority, Tumkur. She also addressed the gathering and conducted an interactive session discussing women's issues and challenges.

The event saw active participation from organizations such as Munnade, Kannada Sahitya Parishat, and Lekhakiyara Sangha, along with their office bearers. The program also featured songs focused on women's sensitivity and awareness, creating an inspiring atmosphere. The celebration successfully promoted awareness, empowerment, and community engagement.

Annual Impact Highlights

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During the year, Samarth Foundation made significant impact across Tumkur district by reaching over 600 beneficiaries through various programs. Around 130 women were trained in tailoring under textile skill development initiatives, while 180 women benefited from livelihood and soft skills training. Nearly 200 school children were engaged through awareness programs on education, health, and gender equality. Additionally, 70 aspiring entrepreneurs received entrepreneurship guidance, and 80 MSW students gained practical exposure through orientation programs. These initiatives collectively enhanced skills, awareness, confidence, and livelihood opportunities, contributing to sustainable community development and empowerment.
