The registration as Trust was done at Udupi Registration Office and its registration number is (VIDE DOCUMENT NO.) UDP-IV-00072-2014-15. 

Activities

1. 'Suraksha': Reduction of Life Style Diseases through Improved Health Status and Enhanced Quality of Life Project:

This Project was sponsored by *CARITAS INDIA*. Through this Project community was sensitized on health and sanitation issues; community was made aware and taught about safe health practices. Because of it there was reduction in open defecation. Initiated to build a Voluntary Resource Team consist of Doctors, Nurses, teachers, health professionals, Asha workers, Anganwadi teachers, and it was formed during the period. There were improved infrastructure facilities in the community regarding sanitation. Community had tapped government schemes and were enjoying the benefits of it. The community was taught and had access to better health care facilities through ward sabha and grama sabha. Nearly 100 Eco stoves were distributed in the District through-out the district. Nearly 15 kilometre length roadside was cleaned through '*Swatch Bharath*' program. Awareness regarding 'Minimum use of water', 'Healthy drinking water' and 'Health problems related to summer' were given to SHG members.



2. Preservation of Earth.

SAMPADA UDUPI initiated two programs to protect Environment:

Rainwater Harvesting:

Rainwater harvesting, is a process that involves collecting rainwater and increasing its value by eliminating impurities or directing it to places where its use is highly required. Even though Udupi district has very high fall of rain, still during summer season there is scarcity of water. For this reason this program.

Forestation Program:

This is to increase the greenery in the district.it is a program to plant and protect the saplings.

3. Healthy food for healthy families:

From the inception SAMPADA wanted healthy families which eat healthy food, for which they grow their own possible food stock in a healthy way. So we introduced three family gardens that is Vegetable garden, Medicinal plants garden and Fruits garden. This became a useful tool to improve the food security of rural, urban and semi-urban families. In our District their number of families who had these garden increased year by year. This year we introduced the concept of 'Terrace Garden' to those who have no land to cultivate. 05 seminars were held regarding terrace garden.

We helped to conduct interview of selection of the deserving students at SAMPADA.

7. SAMPADA and Self Help Groups

Journey from Self Help Group to District Federation:

Self-help Groups (SHGs) are informal associations of people who come together to find ways to improve their living conditions. They help improve the lives of the poor and marginalised segments of society. They also foster financial inclusion.

We begin to establish Self-Help Groups in every ward. Later we formed the Local Grass root Level Federations which we called Mahasangha's in village level. Both SHGs and Federations had their office bearers and a bank account for financial administration. In the month of March 2018, we went for Taluka level federation by starting **Karkala Taluka Arpana Federation**. In October 2018, in rest of the 5 Talukas of the District we started four Taluka Federations: Inchara Taluka Federation in Kapu Taluka; Sharadhi Taluka Federation at Udupi Taluka; Ujwala Taluka Federation in Brahmavara Taluka and Bhaavana Taluka Federation in Kundapura – Byndoor Taluka; with its own office-bearers for administration; and a Bank Account for their financial Transaction. **On 10th March 2019 Sugamya Jilla Mahila Vokkuta, district level federation was started.**

According to church regulation, CODP doesn't have territorial right over Udupi District; but Udupi Diocese has. So they requested us to implement this project in Udupi District on their behalf. So we the implement NGO of their project on their behalf, as we are their sister organization, and Udupi Diocese is bifurcated form the Diocese of Mangalore. It was a three year duration project, started from 01st August 2018. We received Rs 7,61,680/= fund to implement the Project.


