1. Women Empowerment Programme::

Our organization has provided loan facility through Jai-Kisana Finance for the year 2023-24 of Self Help Society Women, through this loan, the women of the association are engaged in various economic activities and are working well, and after getting the loan from the said financial institution, fully repay the loan and close the financial transaction of our organization with Jai-Kisana Finance. was made And some self-help societies are given loan facilities through banks for their activities and some self-help society women are paid a fixed price of some household items by Suryamukhi Company. This program is done with the company with the purpose of economic development by selling the items without any advance capital. It is very convenient. And the women of the association have participated so enthusiastically that only practically 100 women are involved in the project.

2. About Vatsalya Sarcha Child Care Centres

Sarcha Institute for the year 2023-24 through the Department of Women and Child Development, Vatsalya Child Care Center will be established in the District Administration Building and another Taluk Child Care Center will be established in Rabakavi Navahatti Taluk. The purpose of this program is to help the anxious parents to take care of their 0 to 6 year old children at home, as the parents bring the children to work, it is difficult for the parents to engage the child with work and they become vulnerable to mental stress. It is convenient to bring the children while coming and after the work is done. And a target of 25 children has been set in each child care center and these children are given daily item-wise daily food such as breakfast, milk, eggs, fruit, vegetables, pulses, as per the schedule (food chart) from 9 am to 6 pm.

Also, since there are small children, they have a system of upbringing and education along with play lessons, which is very helpful for the physical and mental health of children. And the parents are very interested in this program and send their children and it is very good. It is very convenient for our children and there has been a lot of change in our children because of coming here. The parents have expressed their appreciation that they will also give fee to the child care center to develop in more ways. The program is very good and successful.





Following are the highlights of the monthly progress review meetings conducted by the search organization for the staff of childcare centers.

1. Discuss about the time keeping of the staff and all the staff have been informed about this matter that it is mandatory to conduct from 9 am to 6 pm in the center.
2. Discuss about the registration of children. According to the direction of the department, there should be a record of 25 children in each child care center. If there are less children in the place where you are working, you should go to another place and distribute the pamphlet. It is appropriate for the staff to inform the parents to bring the children face-to-face in banks, taluk offices, hospitals. Instruction was given.
3. Discuss the distribution of children's food system according to the menu chart given by the department. Women and Child Development Department has conducted a training for 10 days on this subject. Working as per every information and guidance and mainly how should be the system of child care centers should be. Every month, weight and height growth as well as physical and intellectual health were discussed and information was given in detail to the children so that children with good environment and good upbringing should be prioritized.

4. Discuss the matter related to the leave of the staff. The staff working in child care centers are informed that if they take leave for personal reasons other than government holidays, their honorarium will be deducted.
 5. Discuss the maintenance of the movement book of the staff. If there is a situation where the staff of the child care center go out for any reason, it is mandatory to inform the head of the organization and also write down the reason and time in the movement book.

5. Discuss the maintenance of some documents related to the child care center. The staff will be informed about the necessary records to be maintained as per the training to submit a report to the department every month.

About Bio Gas Scheme:

In Bagalkote district, CSR company Economic Direct in collaboration with System Bio Company and Sarcha Institute has started implementing biogas project free of charge for small farmers for the year 2023-24 in Mudhola Jamkhandi and Bilagi talukas.



Accordingly, 5500 gas kits have been installed in these taluks, and in the past 2 years, a total of 4500 biogas kits have been installed in Badami

Hunugunda Bagalkote taluks, and in our Bagalkote district, a total of 10,000 biogas kits have been provided to small farmers in a period of 3 years.



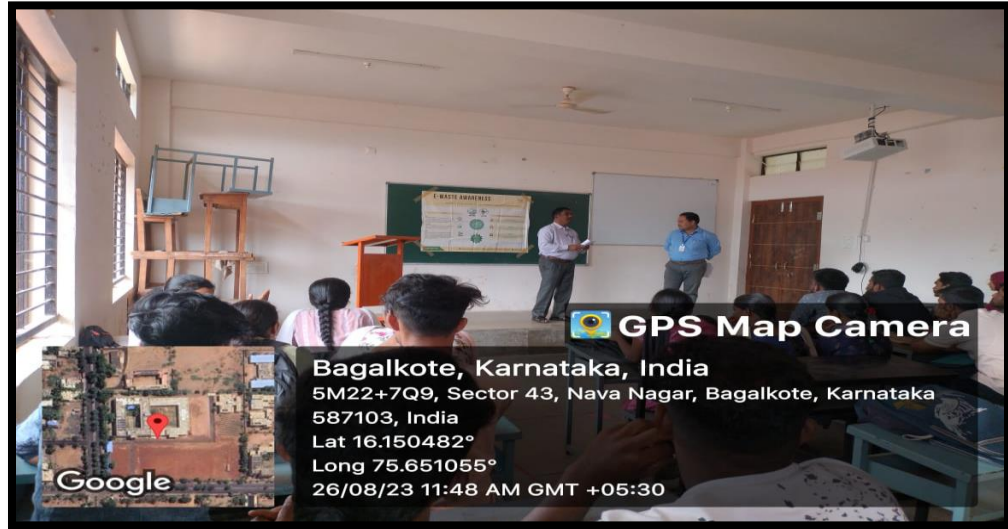
About the evaluation of the use of bio plan for farmers.

On-going Bio Gas Project in collaboration with Sarcha Institute and Sisama Bio Company A meeting was convened for farmers on November 2023 to assess the gas project, the highlights of which are as follows.

1. How the scheme will benefit small farmers and how foolishly the scheme will reduce gas and economic savings from gas, fertile manure and thus increase in number of cattle and more emphasis on natural resources. Information will be obtained by discussing this matter with the farmers.



- **E-Waste Management**



Research Organization(s) and Bangalore E-Waste Management Company in collaboration with them will conduct awareness program on E-Waste Management for high school and college students in 14 districts by visiting high school and college. The main purpose of this is that in these days, the use of electronic items is inevitable and the most used in office, home and school colleges. Apart from China, our country India is not less. It is in the 3rd position. Any of these electronic items are usually mobile, T.V., fridge, computer, laptop, pads and use. If other items get damaged, it is very dangerous to throw them anywhere or to store them in a root for a long time. Because of the use of chemicals and carburators like sodium in those items, there may be a problem. Therefore, those items should be put in the bin as much as possible. Otherwise, information is given through discussion with the students and during the district wise program. The list is as follows.



Report on training of school teachers on eye examination of children at each taluk level of Gadag district

First of all, the training of school teachers of Gadag Taluk was organized. This training was decided to be conducted in conjunction with One Site Essilor Foundation Bangalore, Search Organization Bagalkote, District Health and Family Welfare Department and School Education Department Gadag on 26/12/2023.



The training was inaugurated by watering the saplings. Shri M.S.Avati, Principal of Dietin who inaugurated the program said that this training is very useful. The children who come to our government school are from poor families, they said that it would be good for the teachers to have information about the basic eye examination of the children as there is a possibility of a lot of impact on the children's eye sight due to the use of mobile phones these days. But the head of the district health department, Dr. Rajasekhara Basarigeeda came as the chief guest of the program and spoke about the various projects related to health in our department. What is mainly useful for children is Rashtriya Bal Vikasa () and our department has eye officers in every taluk, but they cannot visit every school and check all the children, so because this organization trains teachers, it is impossible for you to identify children with eye problems and give information to our department.



Accordingly, the manager of this program Mr. M. Venkatesh said in the opening speech that an ophthalmic officer from the health department came and inspected all the children in the taluk and gave a report, so we are training the science and physical teachers of each school to inspect the children from class 1 to class 10 and then giving them a kit of related materials. Get trained here and check the children with eye problems in your schools and if you give the list of those children to the eye officers of the health department, they will directly visit your school and check those children and the report will be sent to One Sights Essilor Luxottica Foundation Bangalore through the district health officers and from there they will provide free Spects to those children. He gave detailed information that it is being coded.



Later Dr. Ntel and Kishore of James Institute who came as the resource persons of this training started the topic that eye is the most important organ in human body. Therefore, he gave detailed information about the need to take care of the eyes in detail. In this, some people fall prey to superstitions and lose their eyes. If there is a problem with the eyes and vision without doing it, they should go to Asathra. In this, children do not take care of their eyes very much, so it will be a problem for the children in the future. He said it would be a problem. Then the teacher took the whips in the gave detailed information on how to check the school children. And telling the child to close one eye and read with one eye while huddled at a distance of 6 meters. In the same way, how many lines the child reads will have a point, it should be written in the information chart. After making everyone aware of the number of each chart, the teacher will gather and demo it, give detailed information about it, discuss the questions, discuss the doubts, convince them, and then tell everyone their thoughts and opinions about this training. The training was concluded here with felicitations and accordingly the trainings were successfully conducted from 26/12/2023 to 30/12/2023 in Mundaragi, Ron, Naragund and Shirahatti taluks.

REPORT ON THE TRAINING OF SCHOOL TEACHERS ON EYE SCREENING OF CHILDREN AT EACH TALUK LEVEL OF BELGAUM DISTRICT

- **16/01/2024 to 02/02/2024 :**

Details of the training conducted in the affiliated school of Belagavi Health and Family Welfare Department and District Blindness Prevention Department Belgaum School Education Department Belgaum, SEARCH Organization Bagalkota and Netrajyoti Charitable Trust Udupi.





Firstly the training of school teachers in Belgaum Taluk The training was inaugurated by watering saplings. District Health and Family Welfare Department officials Dr. Mahesh Koni addressed the training and said that this training is very useful Our govt school children are from poor family in which nowadays mobile laptop tv online gadgets are on the eyes of children due to excessive use As a precautionary measure, this may lead to an aesthetic situation. Identify the problem as soon as possible and give speakers to the children with eye sight problems. He said that we should all work together so that school children do not face this problem in our entire Belgaum district.



Then Dr. Geetha DLO Belgaum spoke and said that we are already doing eye checkup of school children under the RBVS scheme through our health department but due to the lack of staff in our department, if every school in every village takes the entire taluk, there will be millions of children so that our children will be visited by the health department staff in all the schools and check up. It is difficult to do so as we are school physical teachers and science teachers identify children with eye problems Accordingly, Mr. M. Venkatesh, Program Coordinator, Search Organization, Bagalkote, speaking at the end, eye officers from the health department came and inspected all the children of the taluk. Speaking introductory way, eye

officers from the health department come and check all the children of the taluk and it is very late to report.



By training the school teachers to take action, the teachers identify the children and inform the health department, the selected ophthalmologists come and screen them, and the Foundation Bangalore informs all these children. Other resource persons like Doctor Starting with Salim Kitturi's topic, mainly children have problems related to distance vision, children need to take some guidelines in eye protection, mainly participate in play lessons, use eye rinses when they are not clean, do not wash eyes with water that is friendly to chemicals, if it contains lime. The eyeball gets damaged, if it gets damaged, it will cause the beauty of the children and the children's food items such as fruit, milk, curd, vegetables, tubers, potatoes will not cause vision problems. In this topic, how can school teachers identify children with eye problems? In this topic, use charts that contain English letters and numbers and read how long the children read. As there are numbers for that line, it should be listed as children so it is normal It should be 6 by 9 to get normal, if it is less then lower point should be mentioned and kits will be given to all teachers to check children. There is a tape measure in the window and the child should be kept six meters away from it and read the chants.



In this way check the children and inform our health department. In the kits, there is a tape measure, from which the child should be placed at a meter distance and the charts should be read. In this way, if the children are checked and informed to our health department, the children should come to school and get screened. Then the school teachers were given practice through a demo followed by a talk by the training coordinator. He gave detailed information about the importance of the kits given to each teacher, how to identify and check the children during the specified period and how to submit the information.



Then feedback was obtained with the school teachers on the content of today's training.

In today's training, mainly if the children in our school are found to have visual impairment, we will check them and inform the health department, it will benefit the children. And we have also learned a lot of information about Vedic matters, along with teachers we have also learned about health education. He said that this training would be very useful to give more guidance to children and parents about taking care of children's eyes even at school level. Finally, the training program will conclude with an offering and a lunch break.

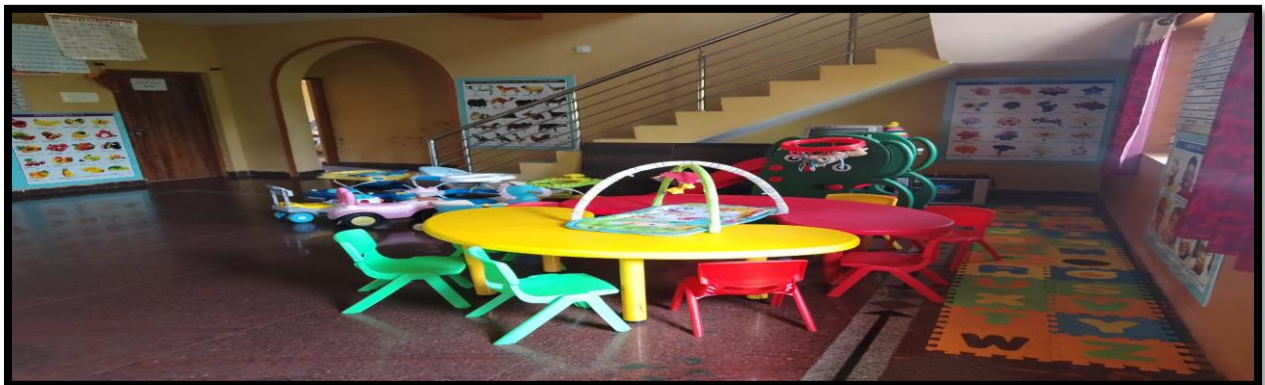

*** Amulya(P) Sarcha Special Adoption Center Annual Progress Report 2023-24**

Amulya (P) Special Adoption Center Navanagar Bagalkot, this program is conducted under Central Adoption Resource Authority Karnataka State Adoption Resource Authority Women and Child Development Department District Child Protection Unit.



For the year 2023-24, a total of 12 children have been enrolled in the adoption agency, out of which 08 are male and 04 are female. As per the Central Adoption

Resource Authority Guidelines New Amendment Act 2022 and according to the Mission Vatsalya Yojana, the adoption agency is systematically managing these children as per the order of the District Child Welfare Committee, the children who have come here with the care, nutrition and rehabilitation system for these children under the age of 0-6 years. These children are worked with according to the rules of diet and medical system and guidelines for these children.



In the year 2023-24, the adoption process of 9 children will be completed by our special adoption agency as per the adoption guidelines and matching system of Central Adoption Resource Authority. It contains 06 males and 03 females. Accordingly, for the year 2023-24, 8 parents have registered to adopt children through the legal system online. Call them to the office and inform such adoptive parents about their eligibility for legal adoption through the counseling process as per the new adoption guidelines related to the adoption process 2022 and give complete information about the existing legal adoption system as per the application and provide more documents related to the further adoption process. As the parents of 9 people have provided appropriate information and documents for adoption, a home investigation report will be conducted by visiting the home of each of the adoptive parents as per the adoption guidelines. In this the main factors are social background of the family, financial and educational and opinion of the family members and collecting photos of the house.

- **Regarding the meeting of the Adoption Advisory Committee in the year 2023-**

Amulya(P) Sarcha Special Adoption Center for the year 2023-24 held meetings to complete the adoption process of 12 children as per the matching system of Central Adoption Resource Authority and in this meeting the District Child Protection Officers, child specialist doctors and adoptive parents are to be checked information and documents. According to the adoption guidelines all the information and documents are correct and this year 12 children who are matched by Kara to the adoptive parents will be sent with the adoptive parents after completing the entire adoption process.



❖ Regarding follow-up visit report of adopted children

As 12 children have been adopted by our institution this year, we visit the home of the adoptive parents once in every 6 months to get a follow-up visit report for each adopted child with detailed information on the family environment, child development and health and family child rearing and nutrition issues along with photograph and medical certificate. and submitted to DCPO unit.

*** Regarding participation in trainings related to adoption process during the year 2023-24.**

The Karnataka State Directorate of Child Protection has conducted online training for the staff of special adoption institutions on child care, nutrition, safe and quality food preparation and giving to children. And regarding preparation of home investigation report for adoptive parents who are legally registered for adoption as per Adoption Agency Guidelines Amendment Act- 2022 and Protection of Rights of Child POCCO Act and its Juvenile Justice Act 2015 and all these matters related to the adoption process of children under the age of District Child Protection The trainings are organized by the unit and the trainings were attended by Director Shri M Venkatesh Social Worker Sunanda Dancer Coordinator Heenakausara Kandagalla.



*** Regarding the monthly meeting for the staff of the adoption agency**

Amulya (P) Sarcha Special Adoption Center has monthly meetings to discuss the following topics and provide appropriate information to the staff working at the Special Adoption Centre.

1. Timely and systematic provision of child care, nutrition and food.
- 2] All the staff working on the cleanliness of the adoption center are told to work seriously to keep the children's rooms, kitchen, toilet and bathroom and the environment around the building clean, which affects the health of the children.
3. As the staff working here are working day and night for the health of the children, making the child drink milk. It has been mentioned in the case of these children that it should be followed according to the rules prescribed by the doctor and if there is any health problem, it should be immediately brought to the attention of the head of the institution and to the attention of the doctor. Who should not act irresponsibly.
4. In the event that any officials and other dignitaries visit the institution, arrangements should be made in a systematic way to ensure that there is no disorder and to give correct information to the visitors.
5. The respective staff members working in the adoption agency are informed that their purpose is to nurture the children and to ensure that there is no discrimination and it is not reasonable to scold and beat the children.
6. The supervisory staff working in the adoption agency must follow the orders issued by the departments of the District Child Protection Unit, District Child Welfare Committee, Central Adoption Resource Authority, Karnataka State Directorate of Children as per the adoption guidelines of the government department. It is a duty to follow it.
7. 7. Accommodation and meals are provided free of cost to the respective staff working in the adoption agency depending on the number of people worked every month.
8. The ration system is done by the organization as per their requirement. However, it will be informed in detail in the meeting that it should be spent only as much as it can be spent without spoiling it more or spoiling it.

- **Regarding the orientation of the adoption program to the staff of various departments at the district level.**

On 27/02/2024, an orientation program was conducted for the staff of various departments of different districts in collaboration with District Child Protection Officers and Sarcha Special Adoption on the issue of new adoption guidelines in 2022. The main points discussed and given information in this program are as follows.



Brief information about Adoption Program.

1. Information about the arrangements and implementation of our country's adoption program.
2. Detailed information about 2022 Amendment Act New Adoption Guidelines.
3. Providing information about the important roles of District Child Protection Unit and District Child Welfare Committee, Women and Child Development

4. Department, Karnataka State Directorate of Children, Central Adoption Resource Authority in the implementation of adoption programme.
5. Who are the children coming to the adoption agency? Information related to the adoption process of these children.
6. To inform the adoptive parents about the steps to be followed in the matter of adoption and to provide information about the compliance report of the adopted parents and the children of the adoption agency.
7. To provide information about the domestic and foreign related process of adoption processes.
8. To provide information on the matter as scheduled by the Government for the adoption of the Adoption Programme.
