Annual Progress Report 2021-22

Search Voluntary Development Organization (RE) Bagalkote is very happy to have successfully implemented the organization's programs with the help of donor organizations from government departments and the support of CSR companies and people according to the organization's target objectives and annual action plan for the year 2021-22.

1) Women Empowerment Program :-

With the aim of encouraging the members of our organization self-help society to engage in community-based activities and identify the basic problems of their respective villages and work together with the entire villagers, Kalasa, Teggi, Lingapura, Guledagudda railway station of Badami taluk are the important villages in these villages in order to improve village cleanliness and water level. Pounding and plowing were done by women and men, one from each family. Gunja Institute New Delhi will give ration kits of at least 1000 to 1500 rupees to everyone who came to work.

1) On Self Help Society economic development activities.

In order to participate in income generating activities for the women of the said self-help association, Jai Kisan and Avanti Finance Association, each member has been given a loan facility of up to 1 lakh rupees.

2) Details of work activities carried out in case of covid-19.

Even in 2021, when the government imposed a lockdown due to the safety of people due to Covid-19, our organization distributed food kits for 1 month to 50 families of nomadic people in Kamtagi.



And free food kits were also distributed to 100 disabled families of Bagalkote taluk.

5) Karnataka State Child Rights Protection Commission Bangalore

Women and Child Development Department District Child Protection Unit, Sarcha Swayam Seva Sansthan in conjunction with them on 11/04/2022 at Bagalkote district level to discuss the impact of Covid-19 on the minds of children and the violation of children's rights. Preparations were made for the Belgaum divisional level Awala program to be held on 13/11/2021, focusing on the opinions of the children who came in it.



6) Karnataka State Child Rights Protection Commission Bangalore in conjunction with Belgaum Divisional Level Children's Aavala Program Through Karnataka State Child Rights Protection Commission Bangalore, Belgaum Divisional Level Aavala Program was held in the new hall of the District Administration Building. In this program, the commission president, members and district level officials, heads of voluntary organizations and officials and children from 6 districts participated and discussed the issues related to the violation of children's rights due to covid-19 and flood situation.

7) Regarding participation in Child Labor Survey Programme:-

There is a need for information about child labor in Bagalkote district because there is no accurate information about child labor. Therefore, according to the instructions given to the labor department in the district collector's quarterly meeting that the survey should be conducted, the labor department had identified Jaibharatmata Self Service Organization and given the responsibility to conduct the survey of these children. But they said that it will be difficult for our organization to work in all the taluks, 05 taluks Bagalkote, Badami, Guledagudda Ilakal and Hunagunda taluk have been surveyed and given information. In this, 6 to 14 years old children and 14 to 16 years old children are identified and a total of 210 children are identified.

8) Karnataka State Commission for Protection of Child Rights Bangalore in conjunction with Department of Women and Child Development and Search Organization (R) Bagalkot regarding the district level awareness raising program for girl child empowerment.

Addressing the program held on 27/03/2022 Bagalkote district level on empowerment of girl child, Mrs. Bharti Bankara, Deputy Director, Women and Child Development Department, Bagalkote said that there are many opportunities for girl children these days. There will be change in society. And in order to develop in a greater way, the family will get a lot of encouragement and support in the society, so girls should not be allowed to hesitate for any reason, it is possible to bring about change in the society only by taking initiative and calling for empowerment by using such opportunities and giving an introductory speech in the program. Since then, we have continuously been conducting many programs emphasizing on the empowerment of women and girls and in the current situation, there are opportunities for girls. Now women are at the forefront in all fields. He said that girls are at the forefront of every business, employment, economic and social arena today, from home family management. And Mrs. Aruna Raghuvveera, a lawyer who came as a lecturer of the program, spoke about the background of girls in the world. Because the strength of girls is very big and why is it known by looking at the exam results. Girls are participating in various activities in schools and colleges. There are so many girls who are successful in front of us, in

the present computer age, girls should participate in more ways and bravely, you have nothing less. There will be changes in the laws today. Today's county laws favor girls. But he said that it is very important for any girl child to have self-esteem in our country's culture, family society, and all girls should be empowered. In these programs, a total of 60 girls from Patri Taluks, CDPOs, Anganwadi supervisors and a total of 120 people participated in the program and this program was successfully conducted.

Karnataka State Commission for Protection of Child Rights Bangalore and Department of Women and Child Development Search Organization(s), Bagalkote in collaboration with district level to create awareness about prevention of child marriage and to create awareness about sexual abuse of minor girls, female genital mutilation and puberty. A training program was conducted on the importance of food and the legal opportunities available from various departments, governments, and the main objective of this program is to provide resource persons, experts, lawyers, senior officials with expertise on these issues, especially for girls, as there are many cases of rape and child marriage against girls these days. 150 girls from 6 talukas of the district participated and shared information in this program. The program was held on 23/3/2022.

9) Bagalkota District Child Protection Unit and Women and Child Development Department will conduct trainings on new adoption guidelines 2017 in 6 taluks of the district as part of International Adoption Mass in the context of self-help organizations.

As part of international adoption campaign, from 12/12/2021 to 21/12/2021 in 6 taluks such as Bagalkoti Badami, Hunagunda, Bilagi, Mudhola, Jamkhandi in these taluks Taluk Level Officials Village Panchayat Development Officers Government School Head Teachers Labor Department Officers Police Staff Health Department Staff Anganwadi melacharakas, Asha workers will conduct a 1-day workshop and be informed about the new adoption guidelines 2017 for the entire day.





10) Regarding consultation of adoptive parents as part of Adoption Month through Search Organization Bagalkoti.

A consultation meeting for adopters was held on 29/11/2021 as part of International Adoption Month. Sri Venkatesh Mukhe Director started the meeting with the introduction of the President, guests and all possible adoptive parents to the adoptive parents who arrived in the meeting. The director informed Mr. Venkatesh about the new adoption guidelines. Mrs. Shilpa Hiremath, District Child Protection Unit, Bagalkote, who arrived as the chief guest, said that they should protect children and legally adopt children. Then, when they or their neighbors find a child at any place, they should inform the authorities of the child welfare committee and the adoption center. Also, you should pay more attention to the child's health and start giving treatment. He made a speech in favor of the President.





11) Regarding the holding of Advisory Committee meetings of Search Special Adoption Institute.

The Special Adoption Agency has been continuously implementing the adoption program for the past 11 years, the Adoption Advisory Committee meets and takes decisions for any child to complete the entire adoption process as directed by the Central Adoption Resource Authority, New Delhi, Karnataka Resource Authority, Bangalore. Adoption State Adoptive parents and children who are matched by Cara will check the following information and documents and action will be taken for adoption.

- 1 Verification of parents' records as per new adoption guidelines
2. Issuance of home inspection report of parents
3. Providing monthly income and income records of parents
4. Issuance of letters of recommendation and guarantee
5. Providing property details document of adoptive parents
6. Issuance of health certificates of adoptive parents





12) Regarding the home investigation report of the adoptive parents

It is a rule that any parent of Search Special Adoption Agency can submit an online application for adoption of a child and contact the concerned adoption agency and submit the application for transfer of documents as per the new adoption guidelines. The purpose of the adoption process is to check the applications submitted by the adoptive parents and visit the house of the adoptive parents and report the home investigation. According to this, in our Bagalkote district, 4 adoptive families have applied for the planetary investigation of 4 families.





13) Search swayam seva Abhivrudhi samsthe and Systema Bio company Collabration and Conducting Famers Meeting.

In collaboration with our organization and System Bio Company, a total of 10,000 farmers in Bagalkote, Badami, and Hungund taluks of 3 taluks of Bagalkote district are covered under Manure Gas program. This program is mainly implemented for farmers and some of the criteria are as follows.

1. A farmer should have at least 3 cows in his household.
2. There should be 10x10 space in front or next to the house.
3. Farmers should remove 3 rows in 10x10 area.
4. 10 feet J pipe should be provided
5. Old lorry tires should be replaced.
6. 7. 4 kits of new type fertilizer worth at least Rs. 50,000 from our organization will be assembled and given to the farmers free of cost.
8. 5 farmers should apply 500 kg of dung for the first time and only once 1000 liters of water should be put.
9. 6 After gas, every day 40 to 50 kg of dung and 80 to 100 liters of water should be mixed in a glass and box.

Later uses

- 1 . Free cooking gas for 3-4 hours per day.
2. Now there is no need to buy LPG cylinder.
3. There is no need to use and store firewood for cooking,
4. There is a kitchen without smoke
5. Get 130 liters of bio-fertilizer free every day,

6. Minimize use of chemical fertilizers,
7. A healthy soil gives a healthy crop,
8. Grow green fodder from Bio sari,
9. Improves the health of people's families and cattle,

things about A meeting was held for the farmers in Momatgeri, Benakatti Bhagwati Kamtagi, Kamatagi and Mangalagudda villages and information was given on these issues.



Regarding participation in other meetings and trainings through our organization.

2 Similarly, in the meeting held every 3 months under the chairmanship of the District Child Protection Officer, Mr. M. Venkatesh, the director of the organization, participated and gave information regarding the children.
