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ABOUT ME

VIDIYAL SOCIETY SATHYAMANGALAM is a registered non-profit organization under Tamilnadu Societies Act-1975, Reg: No: 31/2014 at Sathyamangalam, Erode District, Tamilnadu. Dedicated members, women leaders of the dalit Arunthathiyar and Tribal communities started the organization in 2014. The society registered and recognized under section 12AA and 80G of the Income Tax Act 1961. The organization functions with two-thirds of women as general body members comprising the majority of the general body members. The organization is run by Mrs. Maheswari, a Arunthathiyar woman leadership who has fully dedicated herself to the welfare of grassroots community and working women of Arunthathiyars and Tribal communities for over 25 five years in the development field. Due to her family situation at a young age she joined in a mill where she experienced various forms of violence and caste discrimination and left the job and joined in a voluntary organization and later expelled by the NGO. In this situation, she focused a strong vision "POWER TO POWERLESS" and started an organization (VIDIYAL) for women's empowerment, focusing on the objectives of stopping the sexual torture experienced by her fellow women who worked with her at a Mill, getting justice for the victims and providing Safety to the working women in working atmosphere. The organization is working for social, educational, economic development and leadership for dalit and Tribal women, widows, single women, deserted women, aged persons, disables, youth and children of the most marginalized in the rural and urban communities in ERODE District, Tamilnadu.

Vision

“An equally noble goal is to empower the Dalit and tribal community for their social upliftment and uplift them economically and educationally

Mission

Reduce school dropout among SC/ST children and facilitate access to higher education and develop sustainable skill education for women and transform them into sustainable entrepreneurs.

Children's Knowledge Resource Center is being run in 40 centers by Vidyal Society.

There are more than 150 families in Maranoor area. Women were trained to become entrepreneurs. Coach Kavita participated and encouraged the people through games and competitions. Field coordinator Pashupati introduced the vidiyal society to the people and gave awareness to entrepreneurs.

VOCATIONAL TRAINING FOR ADOLESCENT GIRLS AND BOYS

On January 25th, a special vocational training camp for adolescent women and men was conducted at Bhavanisagar Dam on behalf of Vidiyal Society under the leadership of Madam M.Maheswari. More than 60 young women and men participated and benefited. Mr. Palaniswami attended and gave special training.



APPLICATION FOR BUS FACILITY FOR PEOPLE

There is a situation where the people of Maranur have to walk 3 KM to go to work or school, so a petition was given to the panchayat head at Uthandiur panchayat office along with the people of Maranur on behalf of Vidiyal Society Social Services for bus facility for the people of that place.

ENSURING SOCIAL PROTECTION

Discussed with CCFF members in Kongarpalayam area of Gobi Taluk about assistance to women and government schemes. Aseervaatham Amma gave a welcome address and awareness was given about Mohan welfare schemes

In Rajiv Nagar, a woman named Lingeshwari used to work as a laborer. They applied to the government office on behalf of Vidiyal Society and bought a trolley.

RELIEF ASSISTANCE TO THE PEOPLE OF THOOTHUKUDI ON BEHALF OF VIDYIAL SOCIETY

100 SC families were affected by the hill floods in Tuticorin district Alwar Thirunagar Pakhudai last month. They were suffering without food and basic amenities. 5 houses were swept away by the flood and they are suffering without a home even to stay. And with the help of Nilam NGO Comrade Sakhaiyan, Vidiyal Society founder Maheswari provided relief items to the people living there on 30-01-2024. Rice, pulses, wool, sugar, wheat flour, napkins were all provided.



SCHOLARSHIP FOR PURSUING HIGHER STUDIES

Lavanya, a student living in Kongarpalayam Panchayat in Gopi Taluk, was unable to continue her studies due to family circumstances. The girl was given a scholarship by Vidiyal Society to pursue her higher studies.



CHILDREN'S CELEBRATION TO REDUCE SCHOOL DROPOUT

Sathyamangalam, Nov.25: An awareness rally and program was held in Sathyamangalam on the need to create school dropout free villages on behalf of Vidiyal Society Social Services.

Vidiyal Society Social Service Institute aims to create drop-out villages for social, educational and economic advancement of marginalized people.

1,750 children from Sathyamangalam, Gobi, TN Palayam, Kadampur in the last 4 years alone.

Helped children continue their education.

In this case, an awareness rally and program was held at Sathyamangalam on Saturday by Vidiyal Society Social Service Organization to prevent school dropouts. Vidiyal Society Social Service Institute Director Maheshwari presided.
